

## Finnish Boxing Federation looks for a full-time professional coach

The Finnish Boxing Federation announces vacancy for the post of Olympic youth coach. The fixed-term employment relationship will start at the latest on 1 March 2019 or as agreed. The work will mainly take place in the Finnish Capital Region. The employment relationship will last until 31 December 2020.

The primary duties and responsibilities of the Olympic youth coach:

- Responsibility for the daily coaching of supported athletes in the Capital Region
- Coordination of the collaboration with Solvalla Sports Institute, Capital Region Sports Academy URHEA, Finnish Olympic Committee's High-Performance Unit and Finnish Defence Forces Sports School together with the head coach
- Acting as the coach of the assigned training squad in international events in Finland and abroad together with the head coach
- The organization and implementation of training events and camps falling within the Finnish Boxing Federation's responsibilities

- Proven experience of coaching, good interaction skills, systematicity, ability to develop athletes and boxing on the level of high-performance sports
- Professional coaching experience and preferably at least a 1-star coaching certification granted by the International Boxing Association AIBA

- Capability to handle international communications in fluent English
- Capability to collaborate with media and familiarity with the basics of communication
