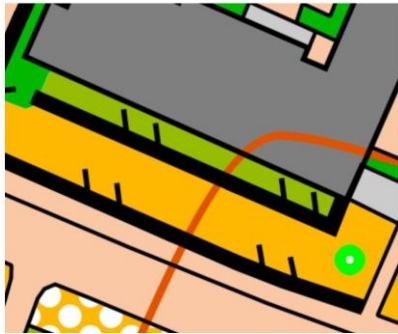

- In unclear places, forbidden areas have been taped off with red-and-white plastic tape. Below are a couple of examples.
- Unclear and low-trimmed shrubs have been reinforced with red-and-white tape.



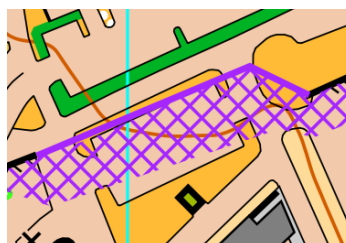
- There are fences of different heights in the terrain. Permitted fences are approx. 30 cm high wooden fences, or hanging chain fences (a single chain).
- All fences over 1 meter in height are forbidden. Unclear and low forbidden fences have been highlighted with red-and-white tape.



- Some lawns may be marked as forbidden at the request of housing companies. For clarity, these have been highlighted with red-and-white tape from the approach direction.



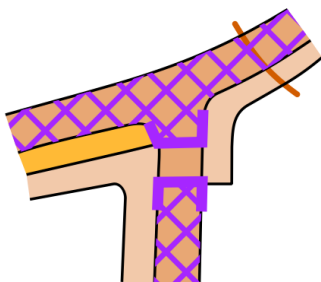
- If a forbidden area is drawn on the map and there is a solid purple line along its edge, that section is taped off in the terrain with continuous red-and-white tape. Note: in some places marked this way there may also be a temporary construction fence. Note: see also “Forbidden road ends”.



Road crossings

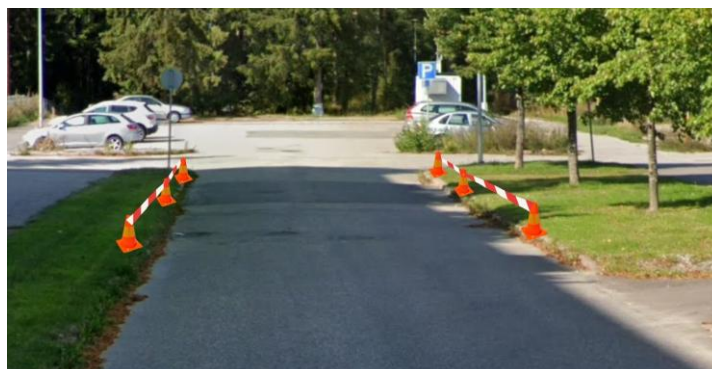
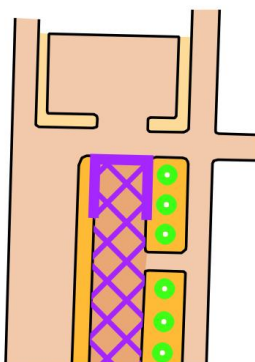
Crossing point

- The crossing point is marked on the map with the boundary line of the forbidden area to improve map readability. In the terrain, there are cones on both sides of the crossing point, and the forbidden-area tapes continue from each cone for about 3 meters toward the other cone. The crossing is made between these. See the picture.
- Crossing points are not located so close to each other that the crossing location would be unclear in the terrain.
- Note: A pedestrian crossing does not automatically mean an allowed crossing point, but a crossing point may be located on a pedestrian crossing or elsewhere at the location shown on the map.



Forbidden road ends

- At the ends of the prohibition there are cones and tape. This is similar to a crossing point, but only on one side.
- The tape may be extended further to the location indicated on the map; in that case it is marked using several cones as aids. See the picture.
- In addition, the tape may run across the road at the location marked on the map if the road is completely closed to traffic.

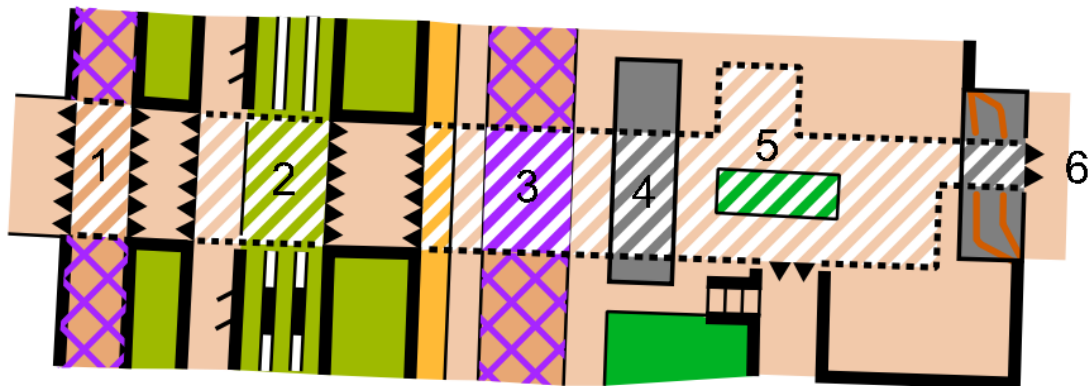

Multi-level areas

- The area contains several multi-level features, and all classes will encounter them. For clarity, controls have not been placed within multi-level areas. Please familiarize yourself with the mapping specifications so you know where you are allowed to run.
- Below are examples you may encounter in the terrain.








1. For clarity, the hatching of a forbidden multi-level area may have been omitted if crossing is not possible on the upper level.
2. For clarity, for example railways have been broken at the multi-level area. The same has been done for some fences if they do not affect route choices.
3. Passing under the road is allowed on the lower level, but not on the upper level.
4. A building on the upper level of a multi-level area. You may not pass through the building on the upper level. On the lower level it is allowed.
5. A shrub on the upper level that you may not run through. On the lower level you may run through.
6. A multi-level area may also start directly from the edge of a building.

Control descriptions

- For all classes, the control descriptions are printed on the map and are also available as separate slips at the start.
- For WRE, the maximum size of the control descriptions is 180 × 50 mm.

Map flip

- The classes M21E1, W21E1, H17, H17B, H18, H18B, H20, H20B use a map flip.
- In the control descriptions, the map flip is marked as shown below.
