## Price increase of oil and petrol

Two of the biggest economic problems that Italy had to face in last months have been inflation, which reached 9% at the end of 2022, and the energy crisis.

The war has forced Italy to change its energy supplies: compared to twelve months ago today Algeria is our main supplier, while Russia has quikly dropped from 2,023 million standards per cubic meter in March 2022 to just 478 in December.



### Price increase of oil and petrol

How does the price work? The price depends on supply/demand. Furthermore, speculation acts on the price of gas.

Are there expected to be lacks? The price increases, because the asset seems to become more precious. The main cause today is the war in Russia

In conclusion, the increase in bills is a problem for companies that have had more cost to pay, some had to close.



## Difficulty in finding raw materials

Italy imports almost all the gas it consumes. 95.6% of the gas we need comes from abroad.

Italy extracts 4.4% of the gas it consumes. We produce 3.34 billion cubic meters of natural gas, but we use 76.1 billion of it.

The law 133 of 2008 imposed the ban on gas extraction in the Adriatic sea, where there are the largest italian gas reserves. The reason is to avoid the risk of subsidence, the lowering of the ground level.



The list also includes the pandemic situation, which has imposed a long setback on the global economy and the conflict in Ukraine.

Many raw materials are missing and, when they are found, prices are so high. There are various causes: the increase in demand and the climate crisis which reduces the ability of ecosystems to offer resources.

### EU sanctions against Russia



The EU has imposed unprecedented sanctions against Russia in response to the **unprovoked and unjustified invasion of Ukraine on february 2022** 



Sanctions include targeted restrictive measures (individual sanctions), economic sanctions and visa measures. The aim of the economic sanctions is to impose severe consequences on Russia for its actions and to effectively thwart Russian abilities to continue the aggression.
