# World Council Meeting 23 & 24/09/2016 - AUSTRALIA

By the time you are reading this, 34 proposals for amendment to either the IFAA Constitution, IFAA By-Laws or IFAA Policies have been send to all Member Associations. Member Associations now have until the <u>20<sup>th</sup> of July</u> to discuss, ask questions, comment or propose amendments to the proposals. After 2 weeks of receipt, the final proposals (amended or not) will be returned to the Member Associations for consideration and vote, which can be cast by proxy or by the delegate attending the WCM in Australia.

The 2016 North American Field Archery Championships (**NAFAC**) will be hosted by Oranco Bowmen in the picturesque town of Chino, California. The tournament will start on Saturday, 18 June , with a 28 target Field round followed immediately (much to my surprise) by a 28 target Animal round. "A full day's work" for the archers! The tournament will conclude on Sunday, 19 June with a 28 target Hunter round. We wish the NFAA and the organisers a successful and safe tournament.



Only 3 weeks to go before the start of the most historical event in the history of the IFAA. Excitement is building up in Saalbach Hinterglemm with the arrival of the massive amount of 3D targets on 21 May.

The 1740+ participants will also be in good hands after the Range Captains and Marshalls attended a first aid refreshment course on the 14<sup>th</sup> of May. ## **IFAA WORLD RECORDS**

We regularly receive queries from individuals to find out if their scores qualify for World or Regional records. Although the IFAA By-Laws Article III section F mentions what records are recognized, it is often not clearly understood why some record scores are recognized while others are not. The principle behind recognizing a record is quite simple:

- The archer who shoots the record must be a member in good standing with the IFAA member association. "Guest" archers cannot shoot IFAA records.
- The tournament must be IFAA sanctioned. Qualifying for World records currently are:
  - The Field and Hunter Rounds of the World Field Archery Championships
  - The World Indoor Archery and Regional Indoor Championships
  - The Field Rounds and Hunter Rounds of the Regional Field Archery Championships i.e. NAFAC, ARFAC, EFAC, SAFAC, PRFAC <u>Read more...</u>
