# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This review provides a comprehensive evaluation of the Member National Associations (MNAs) based on the criteria outlined in the [World Taekwondo \(WT\) MNA Ranking Bylaws](#).

The MNA Ranking is a yearly assessment designed to objectively measure the performance of each MNA based on five key criteria: Governance, Participation, Performance, Events, and Sustainability. These criteria reflect the MNAs' organizational and competitive strength and adherence to WT's standards and values.

Each section of this report offers a detailed breakdown of how scores were calculated for each MNA, with a focus on the most critical component: Governance. The Governance score, derived from the biennial MNA Survey, provides insights into the internal operations of the MNAs, including transparency, integrity, democracy, and development efforts.

The following sections include:

- **MNA Ranking 2026:** overall results including **total score and rank number**.
- **MNA Ranking Comparison 2025–2026:** overview of changes in scores and rank compared to the results in 2025.
- **Governance:** In-depth analysis based on the MNA Survey 2026, including comparison to the 2024 results, self-assessments, moderated scores, and explanations for score moderations.
- **Participation:** Scores calculated from participation in WT-promoted events and attendance at Ordinary General Assemblies (OGAs).
- **Performance:** Evaluation based on competitive success in flagship WT events.
- **Events:** Scores derived from hosting of WT-promoted events.
- **Sustainability:** Results from the WT Sustainability Awards, recognizing contributions in sustainability.

A summary of overall rankings and the relevant points for each criterion is also provided. The report aims to support MNAs in understanding their strengths and areas for improvement, serving as a guide for strategic growth and alignment with WT goals.

## FINDINGS AND NEXT STEPS

The results presented in this report reflect the overall performance of each MNA across the five criteria of Governance, Participation, Performance, Events, and Sustainability. The points awarded to each MNA will remain valid for one year, defined as the period between two successive Ordinary General Assemblies (OGAs). The MNA Ranking will be updated annually in the month before the OGA, and the new ranking will be published during the OGA.

Looking ahead, the next MNA Ranking will incorporate the most recent data from events and assessments conducted prior to the OGA, as outlined in the MNA Ranking Bylaws. MNAs are encouraged to review their results, particularly in areas where improvements can be made, and use this ranking as a tool for development and growth within the global Taekwondo community.

This report, along with the data it provides, offers MNAs an opportunity to reflect on their progress and focus on areas of governance and performance that can be enhanced, contributing to a stronger and more resilient global Taekwondo network.

# MNA RANKING 2026 – FINLAND

## OVERVIEW – MNA RANKING

World Taekwondo has established a ranking system for MNAs based on predefined criteria outlined in the MNA Ranking Bylaws. The ranking is calculated on an annual basis and aims to provide a clear and objective evaluation of MNAs.

MNAs are **numerically ranked** based on their overall scores. In case of a tie, higher scores in Governance, Participation, Performance, Events, and Sustainability are considered, in that specific order, to break the tie. If the tie persists, the MNAs share the same rank.

The evaluation is based on five criteria, with a total of 100 points available as follows:

- **Governance:** 50 points
- **Participation:** 25 points
- **Performance:** 10 points
- **Events:** 10 points
- **Sustainability:** 5 points

MNAs may be eligible for benefits based on their overall ranking and performance in each assessed area. MNAs achieving the highest scores, both overall and in specific categories, may be recognized at the annual WT Gala Awards. MNAs with lower scores may face certain limitations or consequences as determined by WT.

The maximum possible score is 100. Based on the overall results of the 215 MNAs, a numerical ranking was assigned to each MNA.

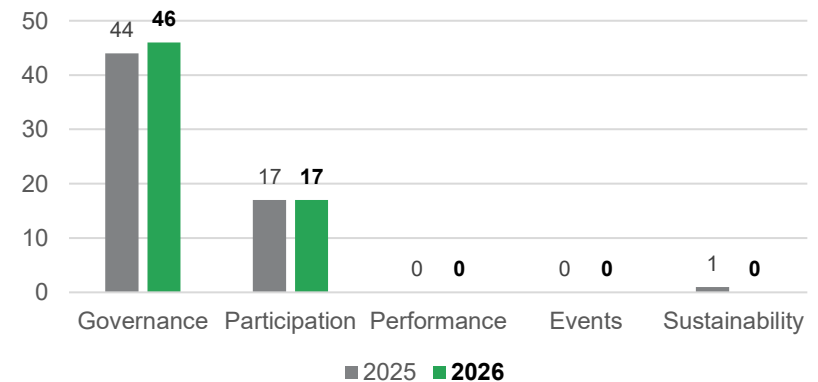

# GOVERNANCE – FINLAND

## OVERVIEW – GOVERNANCE

The **Governance** score, **with a maximum of 50 points**, is determined through the biennial MNA Survey. This survey is an evidence-based assessment that evaluates five key principles: Governance, Transparency, Integrity, Democracy, and Development. Each of the 25 measurable indicators in the survey is scored on a 0-2 scale, allowing for a maximum possible score of 50 points.

The survey results are independently moderated to ensure fairness and consistency across all assessments. Detailed information about the scoring system is available in the [Guidelines for MNA Survey](#). As the MNA Ranking is updated annually, the latest available survey results are used for point allocation in the governance category.

### World Taekwondo MNA Survey 2026

The MNA Survey 2026 is part of WT's broader efforts to enhance the administrative and governance capacities of each MNA.

- The survey consisted of 66 questions, including 41 questions about background information and 25 scored on a 0-2 scale across five principles: Governance, Transparency, Integrity, Democracy, and Development.
- The survey was conducted online from 9 December 2025 to 6 March 2026, and it was available in English, Arabic, French, and Spanish.
- Participation in the MNA Survey is mandated by Article 8.4 of the WT Statutes as a requirement for membership. For the 2026 survey, 185 out of 215 MNAs (86%) participated, same number as in the 2024 version of the survey, reflecting continued commitment to good governance practices.

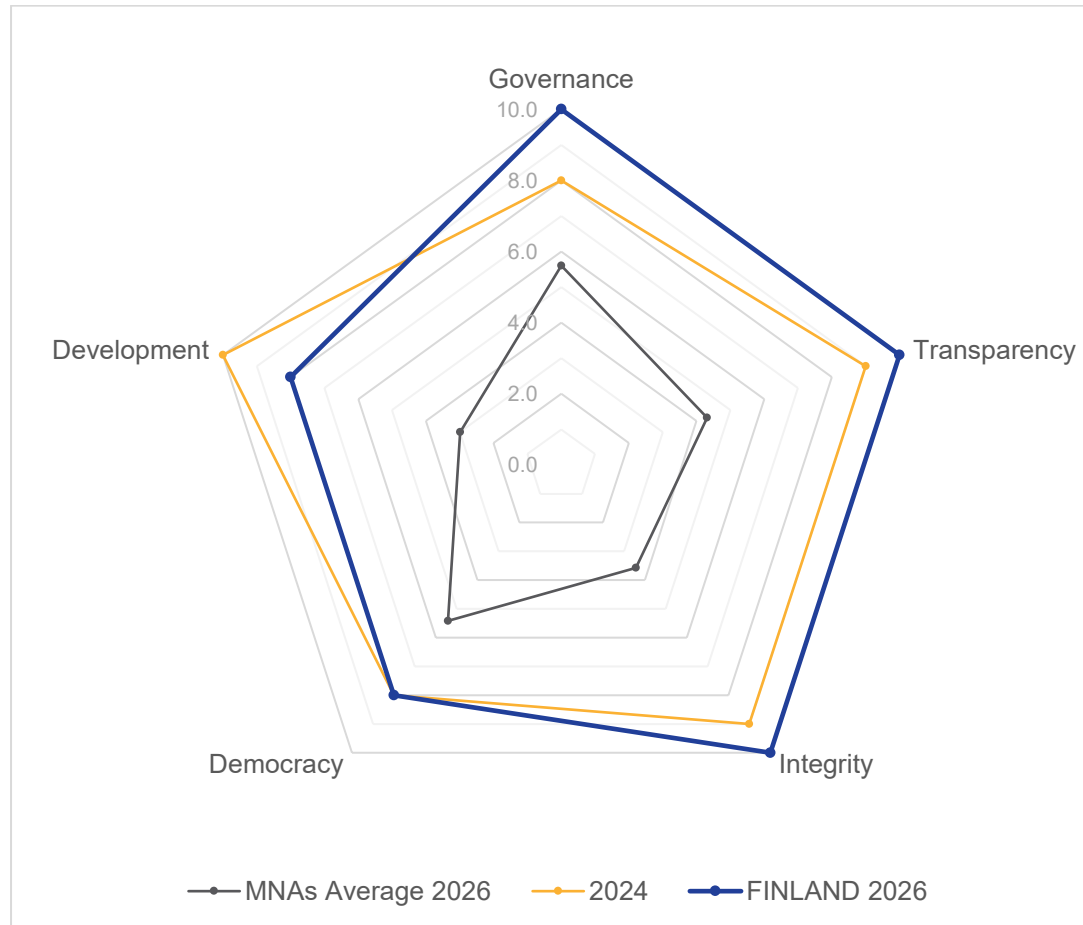

## BEST PRACTICES – GOVERNANCE

A compilation of good governance practices from WT MNAs that participated in the MNA Survey 2026 can be accessed through the QR code below. These practices were identified after the governance review conducted by WT.

All the examples available relate directly to the 25 questions in the MNA Survey 2026 and are numbered accordingly. To be included, the MNA usually demonstrated that it fully met the specific criteria. Despite the existence of examples of good governance practice in various languages, to ensure accessibility and comprehension for all members, the selected examples were limited to those available in English and accessible through the MNAs' website. Therefore, it should be noted that the examples provided are not necessarily the best in each category, and the exclusion of any specific MNA example should not be interpreted as any kind of criticism.

MNAs interested in learning from or emulating the provided examples should evaluate whether and to what extent they are relevant to their specific situation. It is acknowledged that replicating some of the structures and procedures listed may be impractical for certain MNAs due to resource constraints. Note that the examples presented for each indicator are not ranked in any particular order. Lastly, as governance practices evolve, the webpages and documents referenced in the list may be updated or replaced. This document should be periodically reviewed to ensure that the links remain available.



# PARTICIPATION – FINLAND

## OVERVIEW – PARTICIPATION

The **Participation** score, with a maximum of 25 points, comprises two main components:

- Participation in World Taekwondo-Promoted Events (maximum of 17 points)
- Attendance at Ordinary General Assemblies (OGAs) (maximum of 8 points)

### Participation in World Taekwondo-Promoted Events

MNAs can earn up to 17 points based on athletes' participation in the following events:

- World Taekwondo Championships: 3 points
- World Taekwondo Junior Championships: 3 points
- World Taekwondo Poomsae Championships: 3 points
- World Taekwondo Cadet Championships: 3 points
- World Para Taekwondo Championships: 3 points
- World Taekwondo World Cup Team Championships Final: 2 points

Points allocation for each event is determined as follows:

- Mixed gender participation: 100% of the maximum points for the event.
- Single gender participation: 50% of the maximum points for the event.
- No participation: 0 points.

Only the most recent editions of these events, held and concluded prior to the OGA during which the MNA Ranking is updated, are considered for earning points.

### Attendance at Ordinary General Assemblies (OGAs)

Up to 8 points can be earned based on MNA attendance at the two most recent OGAs preceding the MNA Ranking update:

- Attendance at OGA A (one year prior): 4 points
- Attendance at OGA B (two years prior): 4 points

## PERFORMANCE – FINLAND

### OVERVIEW – PERFORMANCE

The **Performance** score, with a maximum of 10 points, evaluates MNAs based on their ranking in the top 20 of the Men's or Women's Team Standings in six major World Taekwondo events. Points are allocated as follows:

- World Taekwondo Championships: 3 points maximum
- World Taekwondo Junior Championships: 2 points maximum
- World Taekwondo Poomsae Championships: 2 points maximum
- World Taekwondo Cadet Championships: 1 point maximum
- World Taekwondo Para Taekwondo Championships: 1 point maximum
- World Taekwondo World Cup Team Championships Final: 1 point maximum

Points are awarded based on the highest placement in either the men's or women's team standings for each event:

- Top 10 Ranking: 100% of the maximum points for that event
- 11th-20th Ranking: 50% of the maximum points for that event
- Not Ranked in Top 20: 0 points

Only the most recent edition of each event, held and concluded before the OGA where the MNA Ranking is updated, is considered for points allocation.
