World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules

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Preamble

Taekwondo Poomsae has been adapted for athletes with an impairment and is referred to as “Para Taekwondo Poomsae”.

The World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules, herein after referred to as “the Rules”, the male and female Gender used in relation to any physical person, unless there is a specific provision to the contrary, be understood.

Article 1:

Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules is to provide standardized rules for all levels of Championships and tournaments organized and/or promoted by the World Taekwondo (WT), WT Continental Unions (CUs), and/or WT Member National Associations (MNAs); the Rules are intended to ensure that all matters related to competitions are conducted in a fair, transparent and orderly manner.

(Interpretation #1.1)

The objective of article 1 is to ensure the standardization of all Para Taekwondo Poomsae competitions worldwide. Any competition not following the fundamental principles of these rules cannot be recognized as a Para Taekwondo Poomsae competition.

Article 2:

Application

- 2.1 The Rules shall apply to all the competitions to be promoted and/or organized by the WT, each Continental Union (CU) and Member National Association (MNA). Any Member National Association wishing to modify some or any part of the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules must first gain the prior approval of the WT. In the case that a Continental Union and/or a Member National Association violates the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules without prior approval of the WT, the WT may exercise its discretion to disapprove or revoke its approval of the concerned international tournament. In addition, the WTF may take further disciplinary actions to the pertinent Continental Union or Member National Association.
- 2.2 All Para Taekwondo Poomsae competitions promoted, organized, or sanctioned by the WT shall observe the WT Statutes, the Bylaws of Dispute Resolution and Disciplinary Action, and all other pertinent rules and regulations.
- 2.3 All Para Taekwondo Poomsae competitions promoted, organized, or sanctioned by the WT and/or each Continental Union and/or Member National Association shall abide by the WT Medical Code, the WT Anti-Doping Rules and the World Para Taekwondo Athlete Classification Rules.

(Interpretation #2.1)

First gain the approval: Any organization desiring to make a change in any portion of the existing rules must submit to the WT the contents of the desired amendment along with the reasons for the desired changes. Approval for any changes in these rules must be received from the WT at least one month prior to the scheduled competition. WT can apply Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition Rules with modifications in its promoted Championships with the decision of the Technical Delegate after approval of the WT President.

Article 3:

Competition area

3.1 The Competition Area is composed of a Contest Area. The Contest area shall have a flat surface without any obstructing projections and be covered with a WT recognized elastic and non-slippery mat. The Contest Area may also be installed on a platform 0.6-1 m high from the base, if necessary, with appropriate accessibility conditions for athletes and officials with a physical impairment. The outer part of the Boundary Line shall be inclined at a gradient of less than 30 degrees, for the safety of the contestants.

3.1.1 Depending on the impairment types present at the competition a ramp should be installed for access to the contest area.

3.1.2 Use of brighter colored markings for athletes with a visual impairment may be used.

3.1.3 Flickering lights around the competition area should be used for deaf contestants.

2.3 Athletes and their support staff shall be allowed to do a reconnaissance visit to the Field of Play and the Contest Area once the venue is set up for competition. Preferably one day prior competition.

3.3 The Competition Area is comprised of a Contest Area and a Safety Area. The square-shape Contest Area shall measure, at least 8m x 8m. Surrounding the Contest Area, approximately equidistant on all sides, shall be the Safety Area. The size of the Competition Area (which envelopes the Contest Area and Safety Area) shall be no smaller than 10m x 10m and no larger than 12m x 12m. If the Competition Area is on a platform, the Safety Area can be increased as needed to ensure the safety of the contestants. The Competition Area and the Safety Area shall be different colors, as specified in the relevant competition's Technical Manual.

3.4 Indication of positions

Position of the Judges: When using five (5) judges, each judge shall sit 1 m away from the Contest Area and 1 m in between each other, with three (3) judges facing the contestants and two (2) facing the back of the contestants.

When using three (3) judges, each judge shall sit 1 m away from the Contest Area and 1 m in between each other, with two (2) judges facing the contestants and one (1) facing the back of the contestants.

The boundary line adjacent to the three judges shall be deemed boundary line #1, followed by, clockwise, boundary lines #2, #3, and #4. Judges are positioned clockwise from the left of the boundary line #1. It is also possible in the same order system five (5) or three (3) judges shall be positioned facing the contestants (Optional).

Position of the Field Coordinator: On the Outer Line #2, one (1) meter away from the corner two (2) of the Outer Lines #1 and #2.

Position of Inspection desk: The position of the Inspection Desk shall be near the entrance of the

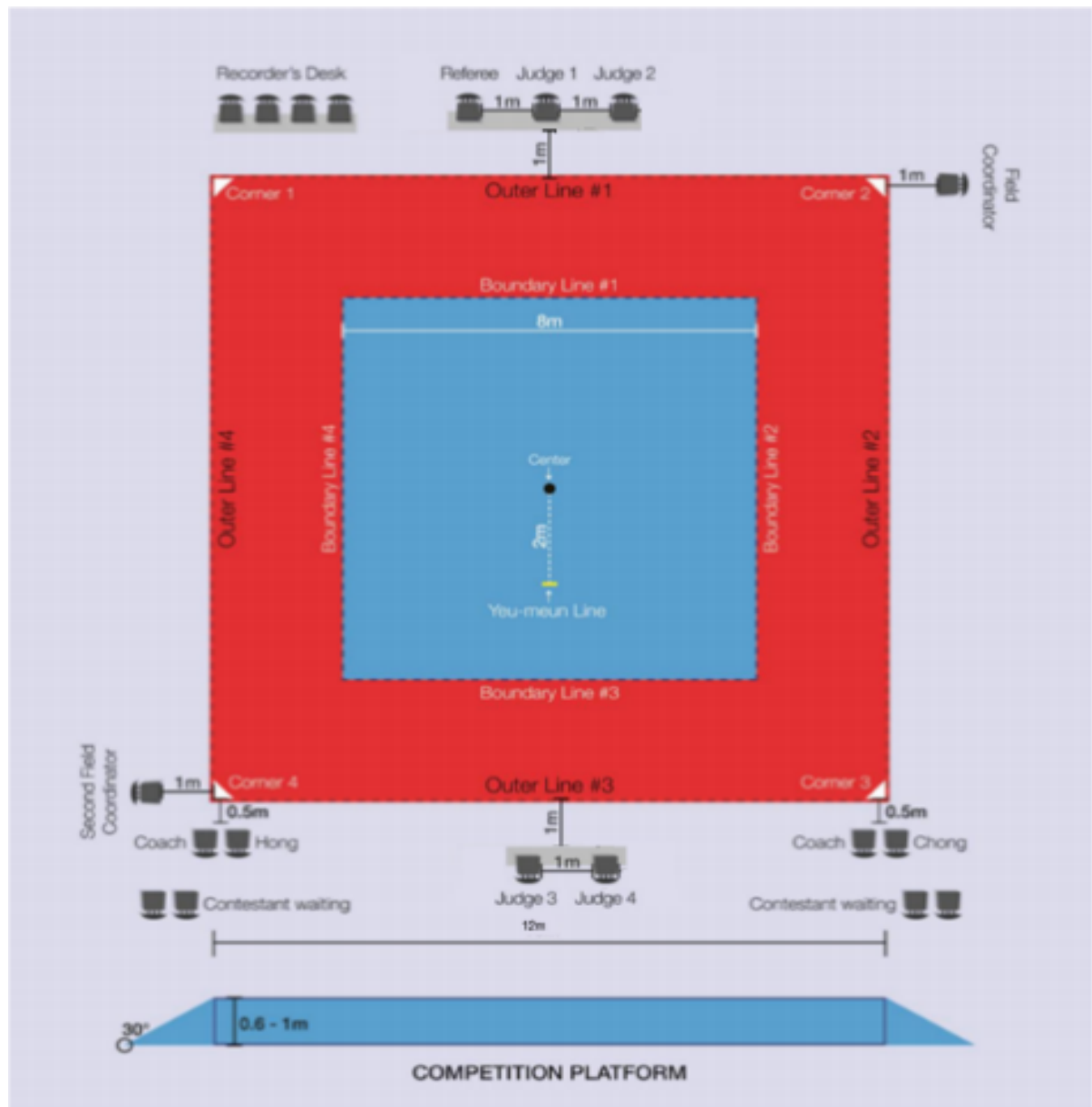
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Field of Play.

3.4.1 Technical delegate shall adjust position and number of judges depending on environment of competition area and condition of championships

Position of the Field Coordinator: On the Outer Line #2, one (1) meter away from the corner two (2) of the Outer Lines #1 and #2.

Position of Inspection desk: The position of the Inspection Desk shall be near the entrance of the Field of Play.



Article 4:

Contestant

4.1. Qualification of Contestant

4.1.1 Holder of the nationality of the participating team

- 4.1.1.1 Athletes with a refugee status issued either by governmental authorities in the country of residence or the UNHCR may be entered into tournaments and championships under WT flag based on prior approval from WT.

4.1.2 An athlete recommended by the WT Member National Association

4.1.3 Holder of a Para Taekwondo Dan certificate issued by the WT

4.1.4 Holder of a 8 Geup to 1 Geup certificate, issued by the WT

4.1.5 Holder of WT Global Athlete License (GAL) and Global Official Membership (GOM)

4.1.6 Qualification of Age Range

Cadet Division	12-14 years old in the year of the pertinent competition
Junior Division	14-17 years old in the year of the pertinent competition
Senior Division	16 years or older in the year of the pertinent competition

- 4.1.7 Athlete must go through International Classification in accordance with the WT Athlete Classification Rules and be assigned a Sport Class and Sport Class Status prior to the tournament. Athletes found Not Eligible (NE) or with a Classification Not Complete (CNC) will not be able to compete.

4.2 Contestants uniform

Contestants shall wear WT-approved Poomsae competition uniform or the standard white taekwondo uniform at WT-promoted Para Poomsae Championships. See a list of recognized products at: <http://www.worldtaekwondo.org/wtf-partners/recognized/>

- 4.2.1 Cadet Division (Ages 12-14): Only WT approved Poomsae competition uniform.
- 4.2.2 Junior Division (Ages 14-17): Only WT approved Poomsae competition uniform.
- 4.2.3 Senior Division (Ages 16 and up): Only WT approved Poomsae competition uniform.

Article 5:

Classifications of competition

5.1 Recognized World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Individual Competition

5.2 Recognized Poomsae Pair Competition in Para Taekwondo for each Sport Class.

Pairs competition: Pairs composed of one (1) female and one (1) male athlete.

5.2.1	Cadet & Junior (under 17 years old)
5.2.3	Senior (16 years old and over)

5.3 Recognized Poomsae Team Competition in Para Taekwondo for all Sport Classes.

Team competition: Teams composed of three (3) female or three (3) male athletes.

5.3.1	Male Cadet & Junior (12-17 years old)
5.3.2	Female Cadet & Junior (12-17 years old)
5.3.3	Male Senior (over 16 years old)
5.3.4	Female Senior (over 16 years old)

5.4 Men and Women divisions must be classified separately

Article 6:

Sport classes

The following Sport Class groups have been designated by WT for Athletes in Para Taekwondo Poomsae:

Article 7:

Methods of competition

- 7.1 All international level competitions recognized by the WT shall be formed with the participation of at least two (2) countries with no fewer than two (2) contestants or two (2) teams in each division.
- 7.2 The methods of competition are divided as follows.
Methods of competition shall be decided by Technical Delegate and shall be stated in the outline of the championships prior to the championships.
- 7.2.1 Single elimination tournament system (Altering athletes).
Chong first and then Hong (depending on number of participants tournament can start from R64, R32, R16, R8, R4 or R2)
- 7.2.2 Single elimination tournament (concurrent athletes)
Chong and Hong on the field (depending on number of participants tournament can start from R64, R32, R16, R8, R4 or R2)
- 7.2.3 Single elimination Best of three system
Athletes compete against each other in rounds. The first to win two rounds is the winner of the match. In the 3rd round athletes are free to choose and poomsae from group 1 and 2.
- 7.2.4 Cut off system
Preliminary round (20 or more): all athletes
Semi-finals round (19-9): top 50% of the preliminary round
Finals (-8): top 8 of the semi-final round
- 7.2.5 Combination system (Cut off + elimination tournament system)
- 7.2.6 For divisions who are on the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Ranking Single elimination must be used.

Article 8:

Duration of contest

- 8.1 Recognized Poomsae: Individual, Pair and Team competitions between 20 to 120 seconds for each Poomsae.
- 8.2 A competitor will be guaranteed at least a one (1) minute resting period between each Poomsae, in the case the opponent (in the alternating single elimination method) finishes their Poomsae early or chooses not to perform their Poomsae.

Article 9:

Compulsory Poomsae & thresholds

9.1 For all Sport Classes there is a free choice to athletes to choose one (1) Poomsae from Group 1 and one (1) Poomsae from Group 2 for each round for individual, pair and team divisions poomsae.

*Poomsae Keumgang (10) shall be excluded from P30 sport classes

Article 10:

Drawing of lots

- 10.1 The drawing of lots shall be conducted by random computerized drawing in general at the Head of Team meeting one (1) day or two (2) days prior to the first competition day in the presence of WT officials, including the WT Technical Delegate, and representatives of the participating teams.
- 10.2 Drawing of lots shall be made in accordance with the World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Ranking Bylaw. Unseeded athletes shall be randomly drawn.
- 10.3 In the case that computerized random draw is not available the WT Technical Delegate shall in consultation with the WT officials prepare for a manual drawing of lots.

Article 11:

Prohibited acts & penalties

11.1 Penalties for any prohibited act shall be declared by the Referee

11.2 Penalties are defined as "Kyeong-go" and disqualification

11.3 The prohibited acts are as follows:

- 11.3.1 Uttering undesirable remarks or any misconduct on the part of a contestant or a coach. According to judgment of the referee, a coach an amateur contestant or Para Taekwondo practitioners should have the manner and respect the code of conduct;
- 11.3.2 Athletes or coach should not interrupt or stand in the way of the competition coordinators in the midst of the coordination activity during the competitions;
- 11.3.3 Should a contestant be assessed two (2) Kyeong-go, the referee shall declare the contestant a loser by disqualification

Article 12:

Procedures of contest

- 12.1 Call for contestants: Thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled start of the contest, the names of the contestants shall be announced three times to the contestants' training/warm-up area. Any contestant who fails to appear in the competition area after the "Chool-jeon" command of the competition coordinator shall be regarded as having withdrawn from the match.
- 12.2 Physical inspection and uniform inspection: After being called, the contestants shall undergo a physical inspection and a uniform inspection at the specified inspection desk by an inspector designated by the WTF. The contestant shall not show any signs of aversion, and shall not bear any object which may cause harm to the contestant.
- 12.3 Staging Area: On competitions with both Para Taekwondo and Taekwondo athletes, a separate staging area must be set close to the contest area, with enough privacy for the Para Taekwondo athletes and their support staff.
- 12.4 Entering the Contest Area: Following the inspection, the contestant shall enter the contestant waiting area with one coach accompanied, when required, maximum of two (2) assistants.
- 12.5 Pre-contest and post-contest procedures
- 12.5.1 The contest shall begin after the declaration of "Chool-jeon", "Cha-ryeot", "Kyeong-rye", "Joon-bi" and "Shi-jak" by the competition coordinator;
 - 12.5.2 When an athlete finishes a Poomsae they shall return to their starting position and stance at the coordinator's command of "Ba-ro", "She-uh";
 - 12.5.3 After the end of each Poomsae, the contestants shall stand in their respective positions and make a standing bow at the coordinator's command of "Cha-ryeot", "Kyeong-rye". Contestants shall wait until the coordinator's declaration of "Pyo-chul".
 - 12.5.4 At the end of the last Poomsae of the match both contestants shall be called onto the mat and the referee shall declare the winner according to the results of the judges.
 - 12.5.5 Contestants exits the court.
- 12.6 Coordinator's Signals:
- 12.6.1 Field coordinator hand signals depending on the method of competition:
 - Single elimination tournament system
 - Double elimination tournament system
 - Cut off system
 - Combination system (Cut off + elimination tournament system)

Article 13:

Competition coordinator

13.1 The Organizing Committee shall nominate competition coordinators who are WT recognized Dan holders and experts in taekwondo to officiate as competition coordinators.

13.2 For the P10 and P20 Sport Classes, the Coach is allowed to give commands to their athlete, where needed.

Article 14:

Recorder

14.1 The recorder shall time the contest, including suspended time during the contest. The recorder shall also calculate, record and announce or display the total score.

Article 15:

Procedures of suspending the contest

When a contest is to be stopped during the competition, the referee shall take the measures prescribed in this article.

15.1 At the time of suspending the match, the referee shall order the recorders to suspend timekeeping during which time the competition coordinator shall examine the reason(s) for the stoppage of the competition.

15.2 In the case whereby a contest is stopped due to problems related to a contestant, and should a contestant not demonstrate the will to continue the contest within 90 seconds, the referee shall declare the opponent as the winner. In the case whereby the stoppage of a contest is not related to the contestants, the problem shall be resolved swiftly, and another chance of performance shall be given to pertinent contestants.

15.3 All other problems that may arise shall be resolved through the meeting of the Competition Supervisory Board members.

Article 16:

Scoring criteria

16.1 Points

- The total score is 10.0 points

16.2 Scoring for Para Taekwondo Poomsae Competition is divided into two (2) point categories and the maximum for each point category is as follows:

- Technical maximum points (4.0)
- Presentation maximum points (6.0)

16.3 Technical scoring (4.0)

The scoring criteria for Technical is divided into two (2) sub categories:

- Accuracy of basic technique such as Stance, Practicability of movement, Balance & posture relative to the Sport Class (2.0)
- Accuracy of individual Hand & Foot techniques of Poomsae relative to the Sport Class (2.0)

16.4 Presentation scoring (6.0)

The scoring criteria for Presentation is divided into the three (3) sub-categories:

- Memorization of recognized Poomsae sequence relative to sport class (2.0)
- Power/Speed/Rhythm & Tempo relative to the sport class (2.0)
- Expression of energy/Volume of Movement relative to the sport class (2.0)

Article 17:

Methods of Scoring

17.1 Scores shall be awarded at the end of the contestant's performance, taking into consideration the impact of the athlete's impairment, relative to each sport class.

17.2 Technical (4.0)

17.2.1 Stance, Practicability of movement, Balance & Posture (2.0)

Stance

- Check that all stances and Joonbi are executed correctly

Practicability of Movements

- Sequence of directions in Poomsae;
- Movements carried out in the correct order;
- Turn in the correct direction;
- Starting and finishing the Poomsae in the correct position;

Balance

- Without wobbling, shuffling or hesitation

Posture

- Techniques should be executed with the correct positioning of the feet, hands & body. Looking the right direction according to individual capabilities

17.2.2 Hand & Foot techniques (2.0)

- The precision of each individual hand or foot technique such as punches, strikes, blocks and kicks.

17.3 Presentation (6.0)

17.3.1 Memorization of recognized Poomsae Sequence (2.0)

- Ability to perform the Poomsae Shall be evaluated whether the techniques are performed in accordance with the characteristics of the pertinent movement.
- The Poomsae should be recognizable, i.e. if watching without being told what Poomsae is being performed, judges should be able to recognize it.

17.3.2 Power / Speed / Rhythm / Tempo (2.0)

- Control of power means the strongest power shown at the most critical moment of the movement through speed and softness;
- Control of speed means an appropriate connection between actions and changes of speed;
- Rhythm mans repeated actions according to set rules and length of note, and flow of power.

17.3.4 Expression of Energy / Volume of Movement (2.0)

- Whether actions are presented with quality and dignity that come from mastering of the energy;
- Size of body action (volume of movement), concentration, courage, sharpness, confidence, etc. according to the characteristics of actions of Poomsae.

17.4 Deduction of Points

- Restart (0.3) deduction for every restart of the Poomsae performance
- Finishing outside the set contest time (All sport classes) (0.3) points shall be deducted from the final scores.

Article 18:

Publication of the scores

18.1 The final score shall be announced immediately after collating the referee and judges' total scores.

18.2 In the case of using electronic scoring instruments

18.2.1 Judges shall input points in the electronic scoring instruments after the performance of Poomsae, and total points shall be automatically displayed on the monitors.

18.2.2 The final score (average point) and the individual scores shall be displayed on the monitor following the automatic deletion of the highest and lowest scores in both technical and presentation among the referee and judges.

18.3 In the case of manual scoring

18.3.1 The coordinator shall collect each scoring sheet and convey the results to the recorder immediately after the completion of the Poomsae.

18.3.2 The recorder shall report the final score to the referee, following the deletion of the highest and lowest scores, and announce the final score or have the final score displayed.

Article 19:

Decision and declaration of winner

19.1 The winner shall be the contestant who is awarded more points in total

19.2 In the case of a tied score, the following shall decide:

19.2.1 The winner shall be the contestant who is awarded more points in total

19.2.2 In the case of a tied score the winner shall be the contestant who has more points in presentation.

19.2.3 In the case scores are still tied then the one who has the higher total points (total points of all judges, including highest and lowest points that were dropped) is the winner.

19.2.3.1 In the case still tied: Re-match.

19.2.4 In the best of three competition system no rematch will be required.

19.3 The rematch will feature one compulsory poomsae that will be randomly drawn from among the compulsory Poomsae for the sport class. The previous score will not affect the score of the rematch.

19.3.1 In the case of a tied score after the re-match, the winner shall be the contestant who is awarded more points in total, including the highest and lowest scores from referee and judges.

19.4 Decisions

19.4.1 Win by score (PTF)

19.4.2 Win by withdrawal of opponent (WDR)

19.4.3 Win by disqualification of opponent (DSQ)

19.4.4 Win by referee stop the contest (RSC)

19.4.5 Win by disqualification for unsportsmanlike behavior (DQB)

19.4.6 Win by Change in Sport Class (CSC)

19.4.7 Win by Bye (BYE)

19.4.8 Did not start (DNS)

Article 20:

Refereeing officials

20.1 Qualification of refereeing officials (Referee & Judges)

- 20.1.1 Holder of 3rd class International Poomsae Referee Certificate
- 20.1.2 Successfully attend an International Poomsae Referee Refresher course in the two years prior to the pertinent competition
- 20.1.3 Successfully complete the WT Para Taekwondo Poomsae International Referee Course
- 20.1.4 Successfully attend one WT Para Taekwondo Poomsae International Referee refresher course in two years.

20.2 Duties of the refereeing officials

- 20.2.1 In the case there is any conflict of interest or something that can be perceived as a conflict of interest for a referee/judge assigned to a specific match, the referee/judge must declare this to the Referee Chair of the tournament.
- 20.2.2 Referee
The Referee shall document all valid points.
- 20.2.2.1 The referee shall declare the winner. The referee shall declare only after the judges' decision has been confirmed.
- 20.2.2.2 The referee shall issue "Kyeong-go" (deduction by penalties)
- 20.2.2.3 The referee is permitted to summon the judges during the competition, if the need arises

20.3 Judges

- 20.3.1 The judges shall document all valid points
- 20.3.2 the judges shall state their opinions forthrightly when requested to do so by the referee

20.4 Uniform of the refereeing officials

- 20.4.1 Refereeing officials shall wear uniforms designated by WT
- 20.4.2 Refereeing officials shall not carry or take any materials to the arena that might interfere with the contest.

Article 21:

Formation and assignment of Refereeing Officials

21.1 Composition of refereeing officials shall be as follows:

- 21.1.1 Five-judge system: one (1) referee, four (4) judges
- 21.1.2 Three-judge system: one (1) referee, two (2) judges

21.2 Assignment of refereeing officials

- 21.2.1 The assignment of the referees and judges shall be made after the contest schedule is fixed.
- 21.2.2 Referees and judges with the same nationality as that of either contestant shall not be assigned to such a contest. However, exceptions can be made when the number of refereeing officials is insufficient.

Article 22:

Competition Supervisory Board and Arbitration

22.1 Composition of the Competition Supervisory Board (CSB)

22.1.1 Member qualifications;

22.1.1.1 6th WT recognized Dan

22.1.1.2 recommended by WT President or Secretary General

22.1.2 Composition

22.2.1.1 One (1) Chairman (Technical Delegate)

22.2.1.2 Four (4) members including the Referee Chair and Games Chair

22.1.3 Appointment of CSB

The Chairman and the members of the CSB shall be appointed by the WT President on the recommendation of the WT Secretary General.

22.2 Responsibility

The CSB shall make corrections to misjudgments according to their decisions regarding protest and take disciplinary action against the officials who committed the misjudgment or other illegal behavior, the results of which shall be notified to the WT Secretary General. The CSB shall also be entitled the on-spot Sanction Committee concurrently at the competition for the matters in relation to competition management.

22.3 Procedure of protest

22.3.1 In case there is an objection to a referee judgement, an official delegate of the team shall submit a WT-developed protest sheet, along with the protest fee of US\$200, to the CSB within 10 minutes after the end of the pertinent contest, so as to ensure that a decision on the result may be announced after 30 minutes

22.3.2 Deliberation of a protest by the CSB shall be carried out;

22.3.2.1 Excluding those members with the same nationalities as the contestants concerned

22.3.2.2 A majority decision is required for resolution of the deliberation

22.3.3 In order to ascertain facts, the members of the CSB may summon the refereeing officials of the contest concerned and question them

22.3.4 The resolution made by the CSB shall be final and no further means of appeal is possible.

Article 23:

Sanctions and appeal

23.1 The WT President or Secretary General or the Technical Delegate may request that the on-spot Extraordinary Sanctions Committee should be convened for deliberation when unsportsmanlike behavior is committed by a coach, a contestant, an official, and/or any member of the pertinent member national association (MNA).

23.1.1 Interfering with the competition management

23.1.2 Agitating the spectators or spreading false rumor

23.2 The Extraordinary Sanctions Committee may summon the person concerned for confirmation of events

23.3 When judged reasonable, the Extraordinary Sanctions Committee shall deliberate the matter and take disciplinary action with immediate effect. The result of deliberation shall be announced to the public and reported in writing with relevant facts and rationale to the WT President and Secretary General afterwards

23.4 Potential violations on conduct of a contestant;

23.4.1 Refusing the referee's command to complete the ending procedures of the contest, including but not limited to bowing to the opponent at the end of the contest or participating in the declaration of the winner;

23.4.2 Throwing belongings or equipment as an expression of dissatisfaction with the contest outcome;

23.4.3 Not leaving the competition area after the contest;

23.4.4 Not returning to a contest after a referee's repeated command;

23.4.5 Not complying with the Competition official's ruling or command;

23.4.6 Manipulation of scoring equipment;

23.4.7 Any serious unsportsmanlike behavior during a contest or aggressive misconduct toward competition officials

23.4.8 Non co-operation during Athlete Classification or committing International Misrepresentation (IM).

23.5 Potential violations on conduct of a Coach, Official, or representatives of a MNA;

23.5.1 Complaining or arguing against an official's decision during or after a round;

23.5.2 Arguing with the referee or other official(s);

23.5.3 Violent behavior or remark toward officials, athletes or spectators during a contest;

23.5.4 Provoking spectators or spreading false rumor;

23.5.5 Instructing athlete(s) to participate in misconduct, such as remaining in the competition area after a contest or refuse bowing;

23.5.6 Violent behavior such as throwing or kicking personal belonging(s) or competition material(s);

23.5.7 Not following instructions of competitions officials to leave the Field of Play or Venue;

23.5.8 Instructing an athlete to not cooperate during classification or to Intentional

- Misrepresentation (IM) during classification and first appearance;
 - 23.5.9 Attempt to bribe competition officials;
 - 23.5.10 Any other serious misconducts toward competition officials;
- 23.6 Disciplinary actions: Disciplinary actions issued by the Extraordinary Sanctions Committee may vary according to the degree of the violation. The following sanctions may be given:
- 23.6.1 Disqualification of the athlete
 - 23.6.2 Warning and order to issue official apology
 - 23.6.3 Removal of accreditation
 - 23.6.4 Ban from the competition venue
 - 23.6.4.1 Ban for the day
 - 23.6.4.2 Ban for the duration of the tournament
 - 23.6.5 Cancellation of Result
 - 23.6.5.1 Cancellation of the contest result and related merits
 - 23.6.5.2 Cancellation of the WT World Para Taekwondo Poomsae Ranking points
 - 23.6.6 Monetary fine of between US\$100 to US\$5,000 per violation
- 23.7 The Extraordinary Sanctions Committee may recommend to the WT that additional disciplinary actions be taken against the members involved, including but not limited to longer term suspension, lifetime ban, and/or additional monetary fines.
- 23.8 Appeal to the disciplinary actions taken by an Extraordinary Sanctions Committee may be made in accordance with Article 6 of the WT Bylaws and Dispute Resolution.

Article 24:

Other matters not specified in the Rules

In the case that any matters not specified in the Rules occur, they shall be dealt with as follows;

24.1 Matters related to a contest shall be decided through a consensus of the refereeing officials of the pertinent contest;

24.2 Matters not related to a specific contest throughout the championships such as technical matters, competition matters, etc. shall be decided by the Technical Delegate.
