Presentation

Concordia is a French national non-governmental and non-profit making organisation, founded in 1950 by English, German and French youngsters. Their aim was to enhance the values of tolerance and peace after the 2nd world war by organising international workcamps of young volunteers.

The main objectives of Concordia are the following:

- Education i.e. helping young people to grow up by acquisition of collective life.
- **Culture** i.e. favouring the youth exchanges on an international level, always emphasizing the values of peace, friendship and mutual respect.
- Social i.e. taking part in concrete actions of solidarity, as well as supporting a civic attitude
- **Social economy** i.e. contributing to realisation of local development, in favour of the environment, patrimony, tourism and socio-educational animation.

Workcamps are a perfect tool to reach these goals:

Participating in a workcamp means working voluntarily during 2 or 3 weeks at a project of a common utility, such as environment, archaeology, culture, patrimony. It is a form of informal education, but also an opportunity to discover a new region and its inhabitants. The participants get to know the real life of a small community, as well as the culture and customs of other volunteers, who come from all around the world.

Every year Concordia gives the opportunity to more than 700 French youths to get involved in its partner projects abroad or in its projects in France, and hosts around 800 foreign volunteers on its own workcamps in France.

Concordia is a member of one major **international networks** and one national which support voluntary service:

- The **Alliance of European Voluntary Service Organisations** which is a network of 90 national organisations in 56 countries
- The national association Cotravaux (Coordination of French Voluntary Work organisations).

The **other activities** of the association continue throughout the year with weekend or short holiday workcamps, mid and long term voluntary service, inclusion of young people with difficulties, study and activity groups (North-South, International), sending and hosting volunteers of European Voluntary Service. Concordia also organises various trainings throughout the year.

Those who wish to be even more involved in Concordia's activities can be elected at the management committee; Concordia is a democratic organisation, led by dynamic and motivated volunteers as well as young people, and supported by paid staff. Today the management committee counts 15 members, there are 1500 subscribers, 40 employees and 200 activities leaders.

The Paris head office supports the 11 regional offices activities i.e. the Auvergne, Aquitaine, Brittany, Centre, Ile-de-France, Midi-Pyrenees, Normandy, Picardy, Provence-Alps-Côte d'Azur, Rhône-Alpes and South-East of France.

Concordia has the approval of the French Ministry of Youth and Sport and the Ministry of the Environment.









Concordia's charter for international workcamps

The aim of this charter is to state clearly the conditions considered by Concordia as the essential elements of the international workcamp. This charter has the value of commitment.

Concordia aims:

- To contribute to the enhancement of social life through the involvement of French and foreign volunteers in public projects of common interest;
- To encourage the circulation of people and ideas through global exchanges in the interests of international understanding and peace;
- To promote an educational project/promote its educative mission through encouraging active citizenship, which is essential for a democratic, united and participatory society.

The rural area is the primary field of activity of the association.

It is in this context that Concordia sets up and organizes international workcamps, guided by five criteria:

1. The workcamp is a place of intercultural meetings

The international workcamp representing the mixture of different nationalities and social backgrounds, the encounter of different generations, the confrontation of urban and rural cultures, the willingness to integrate oneself as full as possible into the life of the hosting area and characterised by a communal life:

- Is a place of intercultural meetings in the perspective of a voluntary discover of others;
- Consequently, encourages international understanding, tolerance and international friendship;
- Encourages peaceful resolution of conflicts through learning to discover and respect the differences.

2. The workcamp necessarily participates in the project of general interest.

The international workcamps of young volunteers allow developing educational, social and cultural values, as well as collective solidarity. For that purpose, the following principals are applied:

- Workcamps are organised "with", but not "for" public bodies, which are the guarantors of general interests;
- The result of the workcamps is durable equipment or facilities.
- The result of this work accomplished in partnership is open to everybody.
- That is why we act in different fields: architectural heritage as well as natural heritage, local area or social life heritage.

Our concern for general interests is also reflected in the choice of our partners for the organisation of exchange of volunteers. Concordia does not act for the private sector.

3. The workcamp for a dynamic local development

The preparation and organisation of the workcamp stimulate the emergence of local initiatives in the spirit of economic, social and cultural revitalisation; it allows rallying volunteers for the preservation of cultural, natural or architectural heritage.

Therefore, local development of a small area or a larger territory represents for Concordia an economic, social and cultural dimension.

Thus, the choice and implementation of the projects are based on the mobilisation of local partners, associations, public bodies and human resources, which constitutes the guarantee of the durability of actions.











4. The workcamp encourages the development of citizenship

International workcamps of young volunteers develop citizens through:

- The arrangement of the functioning of the workcamp, i.e. the rules to be adopted by the group in order to jointly attain the set objectives;
- The development of critical mind and the application of a dialogue as a means of conflict resolution:
- The daily encounter with active and participatory democracy in order to avoid any sort of arbitrariness and prejudice, bringing together young people and local representatives.

5. The international workcamp is a place of educative process and work

Workcamps for young volunteers must lead to a high quality, valuable and properly finished work, which should be beneficial to the environment and a given area.

Although the organisation of workcamps requires the use of financial resources, they constitute "non-commercial acts", i.e. the acts that are not remunerated.

The international workcamp is a place of educative process, which leads to:

- The acquisition of technical skills through manual work, know-how and work-organisation;
- Social development through the respect of the others, the capacity of self-expression, listening and living in community;
- Political development through learning to apply participatory democracy, peaceful resolution of conflicts and intercultural understanding.

We are taking steps to ensure that the dynamics of our charter would be present:

- During the training of our leaders and staff of associations;
- During the presentation of our projects to our partners, volunteers and the media;
- During workcamps;
- During the meetings with the local population.

The workcamp contributes to the transformation of social relationships thanks to individual and collective exchanges. The workcamp is not an end in itself, but a means to promote values, which should bring transformation both on the individual and the collective level.

This charter has been adopted in the Meeting of the Board members, which took place on 29 May 1994.









Commitments of Concordia

Our commitments, towards the volunteers, on international workcamps are:

- To propose workcamps that work for peace, solidarity, friendships, citizenship, tolerance and respect for others and the environment.
- To favour local development in a village, a micro-region or district with an emphasis on rural areas
- To have one or two leaders trained by Concordia on each project who actively participate in the workcamp. The leadership of the workcamp favours the emergence of a group dynamic which should be a school of democracy, participation, responsibility, encouraging the spirit of active citizenship, and the development of the individual.
- The gives the impetus to the group, guiding the volunteers towards taking responsibility for the collective life.
- The leaders guarantee the values of Concordia and the application of the charter.
- The leaders will be able to explain for whom and why a project of general interest (as opposed to private interest) leads to local and social development.
- The project should be useful to the community by improving the natural and cultural heritage.
- To encourage the local population to continue the project in the future
- To propose environmental projects that respect nature (selective cutting, environmentally friendly maintenance)
- To give the opportunity of discovering and learning new manual techniques.
- To propose workcamps of French and foreign volunteers while trying to reach a balance in the number of men and women.
- To promise to give extra information about workcamps with specific exchange details.

What you have to know about Concordia's workcamps

Concordia's international workcamps are always organised in co-operation with either local authorities or local organisations; the projects are designed to respond to needs of the community and are always for the common good.

Groups have usually between 10 and 15 participants. Concordia wants to have 1/3 of French volunteers on adults' camps and half of French on teenage camps.

Meetings with the local population are an important part of the projects. Also we try in each workcamp to mobilise young people from the village for an active participation to the workcamp. Sometimes they are coming only for leisure time, sometimes they participate also to the work, and sometimes they are totally part of the project. In general, it's their first « international experience ».

The common language is English during our workcamps; if it's a French speaking camp it is specified.

Two coordinators are present in each workcamp: one for the group life and another for technical work. They will be either French or they will come from our partners' associations abroad (please see below the call for coordinators). Sometimes only one is present (a French coordinator for small groups). Concordia's French coordinators participate in a training week organised by Concordia and the international coordinators follow training in their partners' countries (if they don't have any experience of coordination). All coordinators manage the budget for food, leisure, excursions, etc. with the group.

With Concordia, work time is about 6 hours a day, but in fact it is more important to attain the work's objective, defined between the local partner and Concordia.

Leisure time is not planned before: it will be organised by the group with the local population and it will be based on the discovery of the region. Most of the time, camps are in small isolated villages and there is not necessarily a car available on the camp: volunteers should be ready to accept that.

General accommodation is basic: a common room for sleeping and eating. Volunteers cook for themselves; sometimes they are sleeping on the floor and sometimes in tents (see the description of each workcamp).

Volunteers should bring a sleeping bag, a sleeping mat, work clothes, warm clothes, sport shoes, gloves...Please notice that it's easier to have a backpack, especially in the mountains!

We welcome some volunteers with special needs in our workcamps. If your volunteers have special needs, please contact us. We will do our best to find a way to host them.









Concordia Teenage workcamps (15-17 years old)

Concordia has been organising workcamps for teenagers for some 50 Years. We always have as general goal the mobility of youth of all publics at all age. The teenager exchanges need to be taken into consideration inside of partnership relations. We truly believe that to be able to exchange teenager volunteers, and explain to the volunteer and even to the parents what to expect, it is really important that we communicate about what each organisation means when they talk about a teenager workcamp.

In France, activities for minors are protected by the law which gives a frame. These rules facilitate or determine the organisation of workcamps, leisure activities, health and safety of the volunteer, and also the skills necessary for the group leaders.

The camp language is mainly English with some French. The volunteers work on a concrete project, doing about 25/30 hours per week.

French legislation changed in 2006 hardening rules, consequently we are organizing teenage workcamps only for teenagers between 15 and 17 years old and no other teen places will be offered.

Moreover, teenagers participating in teenage workcamps will be charged of 200 € extra fees to cover the costs of qualified coordinators who will lead the workcamps. Our proposal is that each volunteer's family or tutor pays by bank transfer before the camp start. Another agreement may be found on a bilateral level.

The leader team is composed of 2 to 3 persons who are qualified in leading and they are responsible at all times for the volunteers. Teenagers are taken in charge on their arrival at the meeting point (that will be mentioned in the info sheet) and they can't leave the camp without a written authorisation signed by their parents and sent to our organisation.

According to the French law we cannot host teenagers without the **Medical fact sheet**. This is why we ask you to **send a copy of the Medical Fact sheet together with the VEF** (in pdf by e-mail if possible, or by fax). Please note that we won't be able to accept your volunteers if we don't get it together with the VEF. The **confirmation slip with arrival details and the parental authorization should** be sent **at least 10 days before the camp starts**.

As all volunteers taking part in our workcamps, teens are asked to be volunteers too. They themselves must take the decision to participate because we are expecting from all volunteers a certain commitment to participate at the workcamp as well as the collective task of group life (washing the dishes, cooking, cleaning the accommodation etc.), and not ask the leader to do everything, they will have to be proactive and participative in all aspects of the workcamps.

Also, as the number of teenagers demands are increasing and the number of workcamps decreasing, we may have to privilege French teenagers on our workcamps as we cannot easily send them abroad. As much as we can, we will try our best to find the balance between French and foreigners volunteers.

It is really hard for the local host to change their habits so the volunteers must be prepared or at least aware of cultural changes. It is the same when it comes to what we expect from a teenage volunteer and what rights he or she may have in one country but not in another: therefore, we may expect the teens in France to have a certain degree of autonomy and not expect that the leaders will be like their parents but at the same time, leaders will represent the authority and the volunteer will have to follow the rules.









Call for workcamps' camp leader

Experience a real learning opportunity being a workcamp camp leader in Concordia!

Concordia's international workcamps have the aim to promote peace, solidarity, friendships, active citizenship, tolerance and respect for others and the environment. Coordinating a workcamp means working voluntarily during three weeks in a project for common good, such as environment, archaeology, culture, renovation and discovering a new region and its inhabitants.

Through this experience you will develop important skills that you will use in your professional life such as project, team management and leadership, you will improve your English and French, and you will discover the associative sector.

Each workcamp will be composed of 12 to 20 participants. One third of them will be French volunteers. The workcamps common language is English. Of course, if you have good bases of French, it will be easier to communicate.

Two leaders will be present in each workcamp:

- One for the group life (who will coordinate the group in the organisation of the daily life),
- Another one for technical work (who will transfer his technical know-how to the volunteers).

They will assure:

- The integration of all the participants;
- The learning of the technical and social skills;
- The contact with the local population and the representative of the local Municipality (if the international coordinator does not speak well French, the French coordinator will mostly cover this role).

Leisure time is not planned before: it will be organised by the group with the local population and it will be based on the discovery of the region. Most of the time, camps are in small isolated villages and there is not necessarily a car available on the camp: future coordinators should be ready to accept that.

Conditions

- Workcamp camp leaders have some particular responsibilities but they will be considered volunteers it means that they won't be paid.
- Accommodation and subsistence are covered as the coordinators will sleep and eat at the workcamp.
- Transports' cost in France are covered (for a maximum of 200 € for one way and return).

Who can be a camp leader?

We don't ask any particular certificate but we ask them to have some bases of oral French (the main Workcamp language is English), to be motivated and to be dynamic! If you have any previous experience as a camp leader you will be the perfect person for our workcamp. It will be great if candidate will participate in a training for camp leaders in his/her own country and organisation.

Project and Work:

Get involved for the Saint-Etienne chapel, a real pearl of heritage of the town of Istres! The Saint-Etienne chapel still has and will always have that soul that pushes all Istresians to love it. You will for sure adore it!

The village inaugurates this year an open-air green theatre on an esplanade overlooking the village and its listed monuments with a magnificent unobstructed view. The place will host artists, concerts and many other events for the inhabitants and tourists, participating in the dynamism of the village.

The site being vast, several restoration works are planned to vary the pleasures! Your work will consist in sorting stones (salvage and purchased ones), restoring the dry-stone walls, cleaning the area (ground clearance) and constructing the area's entrance.

Accommodation and food:

You will be accommodated on site in individual tents with access to a building for communal living, toilets and meals.

Remember to bring your floor mat or air mattress and your duvet. As we do not have a bathroom on site,









we will install solar showers.

The group will share the cleaning chores and prepare meals together. The budget will be allocated to the group leader and you will participate in the grocery shopping and in the preparation of meals, prioritizing products from the market and local producers.

Partner:

Chateaudouble is a medieval village with a very rich heritage and sumptuous monuments, some of them being even listed. Very dynamic and invested in the development of its historical and natural heritage, several projects are currently undertaken by the village. This is a renewed partnership with the commune of Chateaudouble for the second year. Our current project is part of a development plan for the plateau of Ste Anne, on the heights of the village, which will become this year an open-air theatre with stone terraces and dressing rooms for artists in the middle of old cobble stone ways, dry-stone walls as well as an old chapel. Our workcamp and your commitment will enable us to restore and enhance this magnificent site for the benefit of the population and tourists.

Location and leisure:

Like a real eagle's nest, overlooking the Nartuby gorges in the upper Var, Chateaudouble has retained its authentic medieval appearance. Chateaudouble takes its name from the presence of two castles in the Middle Ages, each of them located on a bank of the Nartuby. Only the remains of the Tower, a square keep, dating from the 12th century, which overlooks the village, still exist today.

Project and work:

The small village of Rougon is situated in the heart of the Verdon Gorge, just next to Point Sublime, a vantage point where you can spot vultures hovering over the river canyon. The village has 56 habitants — and this number rises to as many as 150 in the summer period.

The Rougon district wishes to continue renovating the village with help of a second youth volunteering project. It is going to aim to support the district and local associations in carrying out the renovation works of a dry stone pavement, traditionally called *calade*, which first began in 2022. The stone pavement is formed in a stair-like manner. The part constructed in 2022 is 5 meters long and 1.5 meters wide. The stones used need to be worked into the overall design, onto which plaster is applied. The latter will be prepared at place. You do not need to have any specific competences to take part, but an overall technical agility would be appreciated. You are going to learn directly on site about the stonemasonry and conditions of that profession!

As a secondary objective, if time allows, wooden stairs adjoined to the pavement will be filled with gravel or mortar.

Accommodation and board:

You are going to be accommodated in the municipal camping Carajuan, 8 kilometers from Rougon. You are going to commute by car or / and bus, depending on the circumstances. You will be accommodated in individual tents, with an access to camping showers and toilets. The group is going to set up a marguee tent or a tarpaulin in order to create a shadowy place in which the collective life of the group is









going to take place. Please remember to take your sleeping mat or airbed and your sleeping bag with you.

The budget is going to be handled by your leaders, you are going to participate in doing shopping and preparing the dishes, favouring local seasonal products.

Since the site is remote, access to telephone signal and internet is not guaranteed. However, you can quite seamlessly get the phone signal in the village of Rougon.

Partner:

We have collaborated with the lovely district of Rougon twice now and its dwellers are impatient to host us again! We want you to discover this lovely district and the culture of its inhabitants.

Geographical location and activities:

Rougon is situated in the heart of the Verdon Gorges. The Verdon is one of the most beautiful rivers of France, famous for its emerald color, which is a result of a reaction between the fluorine and microalgaes. The water is particularly pristine, fresh and abundant in fish. Named one of the most remarkable places of Europe, the Great Verdon Canyon is a place attracting many tourists every year.

Rougon, a fort dating back to 814, is placed at feet of vestiges of its medieval castle. In Rougon, you may spot griffon vultures, first introduced to Verdon between 1999 and 2004, black vultures, introduced in 2005 and white scavenger vultures which dwell in Verdon Gorge since 2007.

The entrainment activities will be mostly nature-oriented: hikes and swims in the river (an every-day!). Festivities of the Rougon village are planned for the last weekend of July, at the end of the project and all volunteers are going to be invited for the anchoïade and ailloli contest which involves degustating local specialities prepared by the locals themselves and to an evening convert with live music played by a DJ.

Special requirements and remarks:

Project and work:

Take part in the renovation of the Sauldre canal basin, a natural and historical heritage in the heart of the Sologne, in Lamotte-Beuvron, about two hours from Paris.

The basin was at the same time a harbour and a manoeuvring area for barges carrying rock cargoes. The canal was built nearly two hundred years ago by Napoleon III and, although it is no longer navigable today, its towpath is popular with hikers, who are seduced by the peace and charm of the landscape.

Located in the town centre, the basin and the esplanade around it are at the heart of a development project led by the town council.

In the continuity of a workcamp organised last year, your mission will be to repair of the stone riprap that composes the structure of the basin. You will need to remove the weed from the banks and fix the disjointed stones by using traditional masonry techniques.

Some of the work will be performed from a floating platform. Even if the water is low in summer, it is essential to be able to swim to participate in this work.

Accommodation and food:

Your accommodation will be located about 15 minutes' walk from the worksite. You will have your own tent, on the field of the stadium, close to the House of Sports, where you will have access to sanitary facilities, showers, as well as a kitchen and a common room where you will be able to have your meals or to withdraw in case of bad weather. Remember to bring your sleeping mat and sleeping bag. In collaboration with the animation team, you will participate in the shopping and to the preparation of meals. Following an eco-friendly approach, you will be encouraged to use local and seasonal products. By the way, feel free to come with your own recipes, it's a great opportunity to share your history and culture with the group. A washing machine or a laundromat will be available (it is still recommended to bring 2 weeks of clothes). Wifi will be available in the town hall or by sharing the connection with the French volunteers and the animation team.









Partner:

The town of Lamotte-Beuvron has been working for years to rehabilitate the Sauldre canal. This is the third time that a work camp is being organized here. Built on the orders of Napoleon III, the canal drains into the Lamotte-Beuvron's basin. Over a distance of 47 km, this canal was created to transport cargoes of marl, a sedimentary rock composed of limestone and clay, in the aim of being spread on the countryside to fertilize the soils of the Sologne. Abandoned almost a century ago, the canal has now become a tourist trail, located both on the equestrian route linking Chambord to Sancerre and on the Grande Randonnee trail no. 31, which is very popular with nature lovers.

Location and leisure:

At two hours in the south of Paris, surrounded by woods and ponds which embellish the Sologne, the town of Lamotte-Beuvron is known as the home of the largest equestrian centre in Europe. It is appreciated for its gastronomy, especially for the famous apple dessert that was invented more than a century ago in an inn in the town: the very tasty Tarte Tatin. You will undoubtedly have the opportunity to discover this sweet dessert while visiting the village on your free time. The city of Orleans, the regional capital of the area, is also easily accessible by public transport.

Special requirements and remarks:

The work site will take place in an urban environment, more specifically in a municipal park. For practical and ecological reasons, travel will be mainly on foot or by bicycle. Remember to bring gloves, clothes and shoes suitable for outdoor work. Don't forget to bring a sleeping bag, summer and rain clothes, as well as a swimming costume and toiletries. This year, the municipality has asked us to work on the small vineyard. Project and Work:

This year we will organize the fourteenth workcamp in Allegre, in the heart of this beautiful historic village! For twelve years, international volunteers have taken turns every summer to renovate pavements of alleyways in the village. This year, the town council offers to continue the development of an ecological medieval garden, which was created last summer during a workcamp. This field is ideally situated at the foot of outer walls, high up, with a beautiful point of view. What is a medieval garden? It is an enclosed, secret, quiet garden, ideal for meditation. It is made up of several areas: a vegetable garden, an orchard and the corner of medicinal and magical herbs called "carre des simples".

You'll spend about 30 hours a week on this site. Your tasks: manual earthwork to make the garden flat, construction of a cover which will later be planted, repairing a well and making large square wooden planters. You will then fill them using a permaculture technique of lasagna cultivation. The tasks will be varied and you will learn to handle many tools alongside a technical animator. It will be a very enriching experience!

Accommodation and food:

You will be accompanied by two camp leaders throughout your stay.

Your accommodation will be located at the municipal stadium, near the campsite, which is 20 minutes' walk from the village. You will sleep in individual tent set up in the grass, near the facilities. You will have a kitchen in a room in the stadium and a large collective tent for socializing.

The group will be sharing the cleaning chores and preparing meals together. The budget will be allocated to the group leader and you will participate in the preparation of meals, prioritizing products from the market and local producers. Wi-Fi available in the campsite and in the village. Hand washing of laundry.

Partner:

Allegre has a very rich historical heritage. It is located at an altitude of 1,000 meters, where the remains of a classified castle overlook the village. The town was selected as part of the "Small town of tomorrow" scheme, which enables it to carry out actions to improve the living environment and ecology. It is in this context that the project to create a medieval garden was born.

Local celebrations, meals with the inhabitants and the discovery of the region will be on your schedule.

Project and Work:

Go and meet children and young people who are left unseen in our society. Together, break down the barriers of disability and live an enriching human experience!

You will be welcomed in a medical-educational institute, the IME Maurice Chantelauze, located a few hundred metres from the small town of La Chaise-Dieu. This institute welcomes children and teenagers with intellectual disabilities. You will work alongside them throughout the project, the first week with the 17 to 21 year olds and the second week with the children and their educators.

Your objective will be to create a large play and sports course in the park of the IME. To do so, you will build wooden modules of different sizes, thinking about how they can be adapted for the children of the Institute. This mobility course will allow them to develop their motor skills and practice physical activity in a fun way. You will spend about 30 hours per week on this workcamp. Project and Work:

A small welcoming town, a green municipal team, a pleasant living environment in the heart of the Auvergne, for a nice high workcamp!

The municipality of Saint-Germain-Lembron values the traces of its past, by safeguarding the historical heritage still present. It recently discovered an old dovecote (pigeon house), a small stone tower that appeared when a building with which it was intertwined was destroyed!

The objective of this workcamp is to restore two facades of the dovecote, using a manual and traditional technique of lime masonry, which is the most ecological possible. You will spend about 30 hours a week on this site, working alongside a technical leader. The different stages of the work you will carry out: removal of vegetation from the tower with pruning shears; removal of the old coat using chisels, sledgehammers and metal brushes; do the joints between the stones with a natural coat made of lime and sand. Your group's work will enable us to get a beautiful "exposed stone" finish for the dovecote.

You will be working at height, on scaffolding. If you suffer from vertigo, this is probably not the best workcamp for you! If you are not afraid, working at heights is generally very pleasant and allows you to enjoy a beautiful panorama.

Accommodation and food:

You will be accompanied by two camp leaders throughout your stay.

You will stay at the Centre Jeanne d'Arc, in the village, about fifteen minutes walk from the site. You will sleep in two rooms on large gymnastic mattresses (men and women separated). You will have a fully equipped community kitchen, showers and toilets, a large room for collective life and a terrace where you can sit in the cool shade of the trees. The site is closed and will be reserved for your group.

The group will be sharing the cleaning chores and preparing meals together. The budget will be allocated to the group leader and you will participate in the preparation of meals, prioritizing products from the market and local producers. Wi-Fi available in the campsite. Partner:

Project and work:

Come discover all the beauty of the region Savoy in the middle of the French Alpes by participating in this new workcamp that works together with the community La Motte-Servolex! Over the years, the workcamp in La Motte-Servolex took part in the culture of this charming town located just a few kilometers away from Chambery, the capital of Savoy. You will be welcomed with lots of generosity and friendliness by the inhabitants of the town. During the workcamp, you will be able to take part in various actions coordinated by the technical services and the environmental service of the city.

You will work in a school while painting games on the floor at the playground (hopscotch, game of the goose...). You will restore an aromatic spiral (Keyhole garden) near the school. You will also volunteer in the retirement home Les Terrasses de Reinach to create outdoor facilities (flower boxes, benches...) in order to offer to the residents a more pleasant living environment. Other actions, e.g. painting, may be offered by the services of the town hall.

Accommodation and food:

You will be accommodated in individual tents in front of the Halle des Sports Didier Parpillon, at the Raoul Villot Stadium, close to the city center. The kitchen, the toilets, the showers and the multi-purpose room are located in the sports hall, which is also a shelter in case of bad weather. Evolving in an urban area, you will have the possibility to wash your laundry in the laundromat.

Partners:

The La Motte-Servolex city celebrated in 2020 their 20 years partnership with Concordia. Like every year, the project is organised with different services (animations, environment and sustainable development technologies) that will assure you to be welcomed in good conditions. The city, part of the agglomeration









of Chambery, is young, dynamic and sportive. The stakes of sustainable development are fully integrated into the policy of the city which is very active in this area (sorting waste, banning plant pesticides, vegetable containers on public property...). It has recently received two new labels: "Territory committed to nature" and "Best small town for biodiversity 2021" around the theme of water and biodiversity. The projects carried out within the framework of the international projects make it possible to participate in the preservation of the heritage and enhance the surrounding environment. Project and work:

Take part in the ecological transition while rethinking the city of tomorrow in the heart of Grenoble, the European Green Capital of 2022!

While diving into one of the neighborhoods of the town, you will take part in the creation of facilities that promote a better use of the space for inhabitants, based on the needs they have expressed. You will embellish the quarter "Village Olympique" (Olympic town) with a fresco, green spaces and wooden constructions... Linked to the technical services of the city, you will support the locals that live in social housing to feel more at home, with the help of a social landlord organisation working in this neighborhood. Partners:

This project is part of the European Solidarity Corps. Concordia coordinates with a network of Grenoble partners to plan various interventions throughout the duration of the project. You will have the opportunity to work with the services of the city of Grenoble that carry out citizen actions, in particular the COP









(Chantiers Ouverts au Public: Workcamps open to the public). You will discover social housing thanks to the participation of *Actis*, which will provide the accommodation and define interventions in its park. This project will also mobilize different artisans who will supervise the activities (woodworker, graffiti artists, ceramist. . .) as well as local associations (ESAT, Maison des Habitants. . .).

Location and Leisure:

Grenoble is the biggest city in the Alpine metropole. It is the third biggest city in the region Auvergne-Rhone-Alpes (680000 inhabitants in and around Grenoble). The city is surrounded by many mountainous formations (Vercors, Chartreuse, Belledonne...) and benefits from other nearby cities like Lyon, Valence and Chambéry. Project and Work:

What if you saw life in a big way this summer by discovering the Alps from Valloire!

Concordia and the town of Valloire offer you the opportunity to carry out an international volunteer workcamp in one of the most beautiful resorts in Savoie. Combine the useful with the pleasant by investing yourself in the realization of a project highlighting the local environment and the Savoyard heritage.

You will work on an old rural road in order to make it functional again for the numerous hikers who practice walking and mountain biking. On one portion, you will have to retrace the path through a wooded area by clearing the overgrown vegetation and digging up the ground to mark the path. Two places are reserved for local young people in order to encourage exchanges and meetings.









Location and leisure:

Located in the department of Savoie, in the Auvergne Rhône-Alpes region, the district of Valloire extends over 17 hamlets in the heart of the Tarentaise massif and a few miles from the Italian border. In the center of the village, the altitude is 1400 meters. But if you like to go higher, the Galibier pass culminates at 2642 meters! What to discover exceptional landscapes. Many hikes are waiting for you like the one leading to the Lake of Cerces. In a close perimeter, many lakes with swimming area will allow you to refresh yourself. And if you appreciate heritage, you can discover the original Fort du Telegraphe. As far as gastronomy is concerned, you will not miss (re)discovering the Savoyard cheeses produced on the spot!

The resort has many sports and cultural facilities (swimming pool, cinema, media library...) as well as local shops.

Special requirements and remarks:

Remember to take clothing that covers and does not fear dirt for the time on the worksite.

In the mountains, despite the sunshine, the weather is surprising and can change quickly. For leisure activities as well as for the workcamp, it is necessary to bring clothes adapted to the climate (polar or warm sweater, shorts and hiking pants, windbreaker, down jacket, warm socks...). High and notched shoes are imperative. Don't forget sun protection (hat or cap is essential, sunglasses with a high protection factor because of the intense reverberation, sunscreen with a high protection factor IP30-50...) and a bathing suit for swimming or activities in white water or at the pool (swimming shorts are forbidden).

For sleeping, remember to take a warm sleeping bag (10°C comfort) as well as a pillowcase (you can put your things in it and easily make a pillow). You should also consider bringing a backpack (in addition to your luggage), comfortable sneakers and a pair of flip-flops. It will also be useful to bring these essential accessories: a cell phone charger, hiking poles (not mandatory but recommended), a water bottle, a set of bandages, a headlamp or flashlight.

Project and Work:

Embark on a water conservation project in the heart of the Hautes-Alpes!

Located in the small village of Le Bez, the Serre-Chevalier Youth Hostel, labeled Cle Verte (Green Key), advocates a sustainable tourism in a sustainable and eco-responsible development approach. The establishment is very active in the creation of local partnerships in adequacy with its values of intercultural opening and international exchanges. It is campaigning with a group of associations and NGOs for the opening of a reception center for refugees, exiles and asylum seekers near the inn!

This project follows a first workcamp realized with Concordia in 2021 around a vegetable garden in permaculture. Our first objective is to preserve water and use it wisely to feed the needs of this orchard and vegetable garden. You will participate in the installation of a water collector for the watering of the vegetable garden as well as the installation of a low-tech water purifier to supply the garden with healthy water. These installations will be completed by the installation of oyas, micro-porous ceramic pots that are buried near the plants and filled with water. Finally, you will help build an arbor that will be covered by climbing plants to provide shade and enhance the new garden equipment.

No specific skills are required. If you are sensitive to the preservation of water and the environment in the mountains and you like to work in a team, this workcamp is for you!

Accommodation and food:

You will be accommodated in the Youth Hostel, in single dormitories with individual beds (remember to bring your sleeping bag). Toilets and showers will be in the rooms or on the landing. Project and Work:

Do you dream of lavender fields and Provence? Saint-Paul-Trois-Chateaux offer you this postcard while allowing you to get involved in a project that will let you dive into the history of the famous quarries of the city...

What do Saint-Paul-Trois-Chateaux, Paris, Lyon, Marseille or New York have in common? It's hard to believe that many of the buildings in these major cities still rest on foundations that originated in this small town in the Drome. In the 19th century, the exploitation of stones from the South of France was in full swing. The site has specific infrastructures allowing the extraction and the transport of blocks of stone









towards the Rhone in particular. The activity ceased after the Second World War and the site became natural again as the years went by. Today, the remains of the activity are still present and there is a will to preserve them in order to transmit the unique history. Thanks to a great richness in terms of biodiversity, the old quarries could become a sensitive natural area in the near future.

With respect to the site, you are working on the restoration of a portion of a path that has been degraded by rainwater runoff. On a sloping, wooded and rocky site, you will create gutters to allow the evacuation of water, you will backfill with the materials present on site and you will create installations to secure the access.

If you like nature, history and travel, this is the job for you! No need for skills, but a good dose of motivation and good humor will make this workcamp unforgettable.

Accommodation and food:

You will be accommodated in individual tents, near the municipal stadium 2003, located near sports facilities (soccer stadium, city stadium, skate park, water sports complex...) and close to the city center. The site will be for the sole use of the group who will have keys to control access. The locker rooms will allow the organization of non-mixed zones for sanitary facilities and showers. A room will be equipped for meals and for retreat in case of bad weather (heat wave, storms). French volunteers may share their internet connection via a hotspot (no Wifi) and laundry will be done by hand. You will have grassy and shaded areas that will also allow you to fully enjoy the outdoors. Together, you will participate in the organization of the collective life (cleaning, activities...) and in the preparation of the meals, in turn, from products that will be bought nearby. Partner:

The city of Saint-Paul-Trois-Chateaux is attached to its history and its heritage. It is a tourist town of the Drome Provençale also sensitive to the preservation of the environment. By hosting this second volunteer workcamp, Saint Paul Trois Chateaux wishes to discover all the cultural richness of its territory by combining Heritage and Nature.

Location and leisure:

Located in the Drome department, in the Auvergne Rhone-Alpes region, the city of Saint-Paul-Trois-Chateaux (9000 inhabitants) is situated in the axis of the Rhone Valley in a territory marked by the Mediterranean climate. The Drome provençale is a tourist region with many assets. In addition to a lot of sunshine, you will find a preserved living environment, a friendly and warm atmosphere in the narrow streets of the medieval city. The city itself, rich in history, has an important cultural heritage with its cathedral, its private mansions and its archaeological collections. Don't look for the three castles that gave their name to the city from a fanciful interpretation of the term tri castri. However, the town is rich in history, which today is at the heart of our construction project. You will have the opportunity to discover its secrets through guided tours and workshops. The cultural program is also rich during the summer, and you will have the opportunity to participate in concerts, presentations of crafts and arts... As for leisure activities, you will be able to access the numerous facilities of the town and organize outings allowing you to discover the territory (Gorges de l'Ardeche, Montelimar, Grotte Chauvet...).

Special requirements and remarks:

Remember to take gloves and clothes adapted for the work. You will be working on a steep site: it is imperative to have hiking shoes with a raised upper and notched, if possible reinforced to prevent the risk of injury.

Don't forget sun protection (hat or cap is essential, sunglasses with high protection factor, sun cream with high protection factor...) and a bathing suit (no

For sleeping, think of taking a sleeping bag and a pillowcase (you can put your things in it and easily make a pillow). Project and work:

Are you a nature and biodiversity lover? This workcamp is made for you!

This workcamp is the result of a partnership between the association Concordia and the association Echologia, located in Louverne. Echologia is a real oasis of nature and promotes strong ecological values. With more than 70 hectares of land, it has an exceptional eco-tourist site at the gates of Laval, the capital of the Mayenne region (in western France).

For this first year of partnership, you will be based at the foot of an old lime kiln. You will continue the construction of a part of the low walls: staking of the mortar, repointing with lime mortar (masonry technique of old building). These walls will become a filtering waterfall for aguaponics.

In a few words, aquaponics is the fusion of 2 techniques, aquaculture and hydroponics, which allows plants and aquatic animals to live together in perfect harmony in a closed system. This system works like a virtuous circle, ecological and healthy to produce vegetables, flowers and fruits. You will learn more on site!

Accommodation and food:

All to the adventure! You will sleep in tents for 2 or 3 people (bring your own sleeping bag and sleeping mat), and will be directly connected with nature. The kitchen and the living space will be set up in a room near the camp. The sanitary facilities: dry toilets and showers in a room near the camp. Volunteers will be able to share their internet connection or use the wifi available at certain locations on the worksite. Laundry will be done by hand. You will share the different collective tasks and prepare the meals together. A budget will be allocated to the leaders, you will participate in the shopping and the preparation of meals, by privileging healthy and local products, and you can exchange your recipes if you wish it. You will also be able to eat organic and seasonal fruits and vegetables, produced directly by Echologia and their aquaponics system.

Partner:

Echologia is built on the site of former lime quarries, closed in 1963. Abandoned for 50 years, nature took over and transformed it into an exceptional site full of unexpected treasures.

This site is now entirely rehabilitated thanks to the work of a team of enthusiasts. Based on a coconstruction approach, each tourist who passes by can contribute to the building by participating, at his or her own level, to the expansion of the site. For many years, Echologia has been organizing workshops or mini-building sites with different schools or social structures. Thanks to this partnership between Echologia and Concordia, it is the first time that the site will welcome a group of international youth for a workcamp.

Echologia's approach is proactive in line with their strong ecological values. The development of the site is respectful of the environment and heritage in the principle of sustainable development. It is also the first aquaponics training center in France.

Location and leisure activities:

Echologia is located in Louverne, a small village of about 5,000 inhabitants at the gates of Laval, in Mayenne (1h30 from Paris by train and 10min from Laval by car).

Project and work:

Since 2021, the delegation Normandie Maine of Concordia is committed into waste reduction through the organisation of Free Zones, one joined action in July, to promote the Circular Economy.

The Circular Economy consists of producing goods and services in a sustainable way by limiting the consumption and waste of resources and the production of waste. The aim is to move from a completely disposable society to a more circular economic model. The Free Zone is a space where objects that are no longer used can be dropped so that they can be given a second life with someone who needs them. This process would allow the reduction of 13kg of waste per person per year.

The Free Zone will be organised over one day, one morning where the objects are collected and the afternoon where they are picked up.

The project is run all year by a team of volunteers working in civic service and long-term social services. In conjunction with this team, you will participate in the logistical organisation of the Free Zone in July, and in the running of workshops on ecological transition.

Accommodation and food:

Project and work:

Come discover the small town of Avricourt, a typical village of the Picardie region!

You will take part in the renovation of the small church of Avricourt, one of the few churches in the area that overcame the First World War.

In the continuity of the masonry work of the previous workcamps you will participate in the renovation of this small church. You will carry out traditional masonry work on the large facade of the church: repairing the joints of the walls, staking, repointing and even laying new bricks and stones. Part of the work may be at height and require climbing on scaffolding.

Accommodation and meals:

Avricourt is located 15 km from Noyon, in the North of Oise. Project and work:

Come discover and take care of a pedagogical garden in the heart of a village with an out-of-the-ordinary heritage!

After the success of the previous workcamps, the work continues in the commune of Saintt Maximin. In the heart of the village, there is an open stone quarry which today houses an educational garden, called the "Jardin de la Tranchee", that exists mainly thanks to the work that previous groups of volunteers have done during several previous workcamps.

In order to continue the work that has been done for the past years, the work will consist in cleaning and taking off the remaining weeds, grasses and tree shoots from the rest of the stone quarry. We will also set up arrangements to welcome walkers and inhabitants (marking of paths, benches, ...). A nature coordinator working for the city will accompany the group in the different works.

Accommodation and food:

You will be accommodated in the garden of the "Maison pour Tous Nelson-Mandela", a bourgeois house from the end of the 19th century, which hosts the municipal music workshops, exhibitions and cultural and leisure associations.

The group will have access to the kitchen of this house. You will sleep under individual tents. Big marquee tents will be installed for the collective life. The infrastructures of the municipal stadium (300 metres away) will offer access to showers with a separation between girls and boys. You will share the various collective tasks and prepare meals together, prioritising products from the market and local producers.

Partner:

The small town of Saint Maximin, nestled in the heart of the stone quarries of the South of the Oise department, has an uncommon cultural heritage (troglodyte houses, old open-air quarries, mushroom beds, etc.) that it promotes in its museum "La Maison de la Pierre".

Today, there are still five stone quarries in operation in Saint-Maximin. The stone extracted there is mainly used for the restoration of historical monuments (e.g. Paris City Hall or the Arc de Triomphe). The quarries of Saint-Maximin also provide the clay used for the tennis courts of Roland-Garros. An initiation to stone cutting is planned during your stay!
