## GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT ANEC

### What is ANEC?

#### **Association Nationale Etudes et Chantiers (National Association Etudes et Chantiers)**

Etudes et Chantiers was created in 1962 by several Youth movements following the idea of non-violence and humanism as well as international co-operation and exchanges in the “Education Populaire” movement – a French concept meaning non formal education. We are engaged in the world-wide movement of international voluntary services (short term and long term) through partnerships with around 130 organisations in more than 70 countries.

#### **Our National Association is composed by 3 regional associations, with an international placement office in Clermont-Ferrand:**

- **ECEnci** : Etudes et Chantiers Engagement Civique – East part of France
- **ECIDF** : Etudes et Chantiers Ile de France – Paris area and North of France
- **CACIAURA** : CHANTIERS ACTIONS CITOYENNETE et INCLUSION AURA, projet Etudes et Chantiers – Centre and South-East of France and the International Delegation.

Each regional organisation runs permanent projects independently from each other, but they work together on the workcamp program which is coordinated at the National and International level by the International Delegation in Clermont-Ferrand.

We organise around 20 international camps every year:

- Camps for minors between 14-17 years old,
- Camps for +18 years old, most of them with no upper age limit.

Another large part of our activities is to develop activities with people facing social or economic difficulties. Our regional organisations manage several local inclusion work projects with youth or adults facing exclusion. This is the larger part of our action that involves us in the employment or social public schemes and in European programs.

## TEENAGE WORKCAMPS 2023

Since 1962, Etudes et Chantiers - ANEC has been organising workcamps for minors between 14-17 years old and sometimes between 11-13 years old. They are organised following the “Minor’s Protection Act” under the control of the French Youth and Sports Ministry. These rules facilitate the organisation of workcamps and the security of the volunteers.

Volunteers achieve a concrete project; they work about **25 hours** per week.

This year, our teen projects will host between 8 and 14 volunteers. Half of the volunteers will be French volunteers; the other half will be international volunteers if the situation enables us to host international volunteers.

**The leading team** will be composed of **2 to 4 qualified campleaders**. They are paid staff, and are responsible for the volunteers. Teenagers are taken in charge on their arrival at the train station; they cannot leave the camp without an authorisation signed by the parents and sent to our organisation.

Each volunteer must send a “**health form**”, a “**parental authorization**” and a **confirmation** of arrival **at least 15 days before the beginning of their camp**.

**Camp languages** are English and French in every project.

On each camp for minors, we open between 1 and 3 places for **youth facing social difficulties** (like living in orphanages or in specialized institutions). Be aware that these volunteers expect a lot from a workcamp experience; it is a big adventure for them and good contacts with International volunteers are really important.

**Insurance:** our organisation covers the volunteers from the first to the last day of the project **for third risk, individual accident, repatriation in case of emergency. Our insurance does not cover lost or stolen objects, nor illness** (except those due to accidents, during the workcamp).

**Volunteers from the E.U. countries MUST bring a European Health Card** to cover their cost (medical, pharmaceutical and hospitalisation cover).

**For all our teenage workcamps** international volunteers must pay **extra-fees (250 €) before the project’s beginning by bank transfer or by cash upon arrival to the campleader**. The extra fees cover a part of the camp leaders’ salaries and costs.

- If an international volunteer withdraws from a project less than 30 days before its start, the participation fee (250 €) is not refunded.
- If an international volunteer withdraws from a project less than 30 days before it starts and the volunteer has not paid their participation fee, they will be asked to do so.
- If an international volunteer withdraws from a project less than 30 days before its start and the volunteer has not paid its participation fee, Etudes et Chantiers International (ANEC) can ask the sending partner for payment of this sum (250 €).

<b>TEEN 14-17 years old</b>	<b>Work type : RENO</b>	<b>Number of total volunteers: 14 (7 international volunteers)</b>
<b>Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project:</b>	<p>Inside a lovely little French village, the castle of Montaigu le Blin is an impressive medieval fortress, classified as Historical Monument. It is located on the top of a hill, overlooking the countryside. Since 2002, volunteers have been participating, every summer, to the restoration of the castle. These last years, the fortress has regained its beauty! Since the 80s, volunteers come every year to restore and protect the castle. These last couple of years, volunteers restored the castle walls using traditional masonry techniques and developed the medieval vegetable garden at the bottom of the Lord's tower. This year, it's your turn to live an experience back in time!</p>	
<b>Description of work :</b>	<p>Come and participate to the preservation and enhancement of this exceptional heritage! Within the castle, you will carry out several restorations works accompanied by a professional. You will learn traditional masonry techniques: remove the old joints around the stones, make mortar with lime and sand that you will apply on the walls. You'll get the hang of it very quickly! You will also participate in the maintenance of the vegetable garden, the woodwork (maintenance of the fences, construction of pallet furniture) and the green spaces of the castle (clearing the brush). There are no special skills required for the work, it's just an opportunity to learn some.</p> <p>Beyond this work, you will reflect together on sustainable development using traditional techniques in the restoration of the fortress, but also in the daily life of the group. You will be accompanied and guided by technical and group life facilitators. You will have the opportunity to present to the local population and tourists the progress you have made.</p> <p>Protecting a building like this takes time and a lot of energy, so come and make your contribution!</p>	
<b>Description of accommodation and food:</b>	<p>Accommodation is under tents (1 person per tent) at the town stadium lent by the Town Hall. Tents will be provided. You will have to bring other camping material (ground sheet, sleeping bag, etc.). You, volunteer, are actor/actress of your project! You will manage the tasks of daily life in teams (shopping, cooking, and cleaning). A rotation will be organised by the camp leaders to ensure the smooth running of daily life. The objective is to gain autonomy and that everyone acts individually to allow a good collective functioning!</p> <p>Altogether, you will reflect about how to work, feed everyone, have fun, get around, visit the region in the most environmentally and human-friendly way. A building on the field includes a kitchen room, 2 showers and 2 toilets for the group.</p>	
<b>Description of location and leisure:</b>	<p>Montaigu-le-Blin is located in the French Bourbonnais area, 30km North from Vichy and 90km North from Clermont-Ferrand, in the French Auvergne region.</p>	

	<p>It is a countryside rich with historical heritage, which you will be able to discover by visiting a few of the numerous castles and medieval cities, by hiking, going by bike or canoeing, according to what the leading team and the weather can propose. The inhabitants of the village are used to welcome volunteers from all over the world come every summer. You will pick up bread from the innkeeper Didier, ask for eggs on a Sunday evening to Monique, the weather the next day to Jean-Pascal, show your progress to Jean Louis who is passionate about the castle, you will feast with the fruits and vegetables offered by the local gardeners...and so much more!</p> <p>The camp leaders will prepare games and activities for the group but will also encourage you to propose and build your own activities according to your desires. Bring ideas and be creative!</p>

<b>Short remarks for the project:</b>	<p><b>EXTRA FEES: reduced to 250€ for international volunteers. Pay attention! Our national participants in France pay the regular 360€ of extra fees. International volunteers coming from our partners in other countries than France pay only 250€ of extra fees.</b></p> <p>Pay attention that there is no wifi access on the workcamp site, the telephone network is also quite low. However, the volunteers will be able to find public wifi in the village. Who needs internet during a Workcamp anyway? The site is unfortunately not accessible to people in wheelchairs.</p> <p>Globally on our teenage camps, we chose to book half of the spots for French volunteers. The aim is to allow a maximum of young people to access intercultural learning, to promote volunteer's commitment as a first step and then experience international workcamp abroad.</p>

<b>10/07/2023 – 28/07/2023</b>		
<b>Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project:</b>	<p>Head for the town of Saint-Mihiel, which for several years has welcomed volunteers from all walks of life to restore its built and natural heritage!</p> <p>The city has two exceptional sites: The site of the Rocks, at the exit of the city, where seven massive rocks also called the ""Ladies of Meuse"" are enthroned and then the Promenade des Capucins, composed of multiple terraced gardens, between which several paths and stairs meander.</p> <p>At Les Roches, as at Les Capucins, many walls and low walls, sometimes in whitewash and sometimes in dry stone, add to the charm of the town. Since 2019, volunteers have been working on their restoration every year.</p>	
<b>Description of work :</b>	<p>This year, go to the terraced gardens of the Capuchins, to complete the work started in 2021 and 2022!</p> <p>Objective: complete the restoration of the walls with two ancestral and environmentally friendly techniques: lime masonry and dry stone, for the greatest pleasure of tourists and locals!</p> <p>On the masonry walls, you will participate in various tasks: repointing the stones with a lime plaster, raising the wall to its original height, laying tiles, etc. On the dry-stone walls, you will learn to sort the stones according to their uses, to cut them and to arrange them to give a new youth to the wall.</p> <p>You will have the chance to be accompanied by a professional wall builder: The opportunity to discover (or perfect) the techniques of masonry and dry stone !</p>	
<b>Description of accommodation and food:</b>	<p>Along with the other volunteers, you will be accommodated permanently, at the Saint-Mihiel youth hostel, a stone's throw from the work site. You will have rooms for 3 or 4 people equipped with beds and mattresses, with bathrooms, a large kitchen, and a relaxation area. Volunteers from previous projects are unanimous: the accommodation in Saint-Mihiel is very comfortable! In addition, the setting is bucolic, because the place of accommodation is close to a river.</p> <p>All aspects of collective life (shopping, meal preparation, cleaning) will be managed between volunteers, on the basis of a functioning that you will have decided together (eg: use of planning, formation of pairs, etc.). You will be helped in this task by a community life facilitator. The goal: for each volunteer to be an actor in their stay with respect for others and community life.</p>	
<b>Description of location and leisure:</b>	<p>The region is rich in history, landscapes, and culture, that's why you should come and discover it!</p> <p>The small town of Saint-Mihiel is located in the valley of the Meuse, the river which crosses the town. It is a "Small city of character", a label that the city owes to its remarkable architectural and historical heritage.</p> <p>Close to memorial sites and to Verdun, Saint-Mihiel is also conducive to the discovery of vestiges and the history of the First World War.</p> <p>In the heart of a rural and green region, the location is ideal for discovering numerous hiking trails and outdoor activities. Right next to Saint-Mihiel, a National Center for Contemporary Art allows you to discover many works of art in the middle of the forest! And then in summer, many shows and festive</p>	

	evenings are organized in the region. Your facilitators and our partners will be happy to take you on a discovery of this exceptional heritage!

<b>Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project:</b>	<p>The town of Aurillac and Etudes et Chantiers have been working together for 22 years! Since 2001, volunteers from all around the world have participated to the historical heritage renovation, construction, and environmental protection of the city of Aurillac. Aurillac is in a French region called Auvergne, known for its beautiful sleeping volcanoes! This partnership was established for local volunteers and workcamp volunteers to meet and share activities during the summer. More than 20 groups of volunteers have already intervened in the city: in the community gardens of Aurillacs' social center to participate to its development, but also along the riverbanks, in the parks, city stadiums and various workshops... <b>Description of work :</b>	<p>This year, the work will be focused on embellishing the shared gardens of Aurillac.</p> <p>The shared gardens are imagined to be a place of biodiversity and for the local inhabitants to meet. Various tasks are waiting for you in the gardens:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- creation of a shared compost,</li> <li>- development of a piece of land to encourage biodiversity,</li> <li>- creation of bird boxes and insect hotels, etc.</li> </ul> <p>You will also have the opportunity to build recycled wooden furniture for the relaxation area and make ecological paint to color the shared gardens! This will be an opportunity for you to learn a lot about gardening and biodiversity, and to meet the gardeners of Aurillac.</p> <p>The group will participate in the life of the gardens and discover this little corner of paradise which is also a great initiative for our planet!</p>	
<b>Description of accommodation and food:</b>	<p>Accommodation is in tents (1 person per tent, provided by the association) at the municipal stadium, on a special spot dedicated to us. Do not forget to bring your camping gear (ground sheet, sleeping bag, etc.).</p> <p>Two big tents will be set up for cooking and for groups activities (meals/games, etc.). We have private access to the changing rooms, toilets/showers, and a place to safely lock your belongings.</p> <p>The workcamp sites are less than 10 minutes away by foot.</p> <p>You will be actor/actress of your stay, and will participate to daily tasks (shopping, cooking, tidying up, cleaning etc...). Camp leaders will help to organize the rotation and ensure the smooth running. The facilitating team is made of 4 qualified leaders: a director, 2 camp leaders and a technical facilitator. A rotation will be organised by the camp leaders to ensure the smooth running of daily life. The objective is to gain autonomy and that everyone acts individually to allow a good collective functioning!</p> <p>Altogether, you will think about how to work together, feed everyone, have fun, get around, visit the region in the most environmental and human-friendly way.</p>	

<b>Description of location and leisure:</b>	Aurillac is in the French department of the Cantal, in the French Auvergne region. The mountain scenery offers breathtaking viewpoints on the volcanoes and mounts of Auvergne. The region's architectural legacy is very rich: castles, bread oven, chapels... Come discover the typical rural villages built with slate and wood. The city of Aurillac offers numerous activities during the summer: <a href="http://www.aurillac.fr">www.aurillac.fr</a> . The region is favorable to hiking, walking, cycling, or canoeing. You can also find beautiful lakes to take a swim. Camp leaders will organise games and activities, but you are welcome to create and propose your own activities! Be creative!

<b>TEEN CAMP 14-17 years old</b>	<b>Work type: ENVI/CONS</b>	<b>Number of volunteers:</b> 15 (8 international volunteers)
<b>Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project</b>	<p>For the third time, Etudes et Chantiers will welcome you in the heart of Fosse Maussoin's park in Clichy-sous-Bois. This nature case is now listed "Natura 2000". It's a place to create, to experiment and to share where, every saturday afternoons, group activities are organised to cogitate and to open its eyes and ears!</p> <p>Close to the forest, with an incredible view over cities, we find:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- an open greenhouse: to do seedlings and do swap</li> <li>- a mandala and a pedagogical space: to learn how to cultivate respectfully</li> <li>- an experimental space: to create and try some new methods about gardening</li> <li>- a biodiversity space: to observe and make a special attention to insects</li> <li>- a space to relax: to have a lunch, take a break or read</li> <li>- the shared gardens shaped like a leaf and called "the Leaf Maussoin".</li> </ul> <p>Every summer, organisations are here to fill with life the park and propose doing activities!</p> <p>During the last sessions, volunteers have done the greenhouse construction, the relax space, and the revegetation of a container. Thanks again to them for their work!</p>	
<b>Description of work :</b>	<p>You will participate, if you accept it, to the construction of an outdoor movable kitchen, a place to waste stabilization (in order to clean the water thanks to plants and reuse after), a shady zone and wood constructions like table and benches. You will be accompanied by a technical facilitator who will share the right techniques to construct and shape wood. Many people will work by your sides and will support you in the project (nature leaders and facilitators, associations specialized in urban agriculture, Civic Service volunteers, researchers, etc.).</p>	
<b>Description of accommodation and food:</b>	<p>You will be accommodated in an establishment where you will have access to shared rooms (between 2 and 4 beds each), showers, toilets, kitchen. The facilitators and volunteers will pay particular attention to food so that it is as local and responsible as possible. All aspects of the collective life (shopping, meal preparation, cleaning) will be managed by the volunteers themselves, based on an operation that you will have decided upon together beforehand (e.g., use of schedules, constitution of pairs...). You will be assisted in this task by a group facilitator. You will cook in turns for all the participants. It will be an opportunity to show your culinary skills (bring some recipes!)! The aim is for each one of you to be an actor/actress of your stay, while respecting others and community life.</p>	
<b>Description of location and leisure:</b>	<p>The workcamp site is located in the heart of the Park of the Fosse Maussoin (2300 m<sup>2</sup>). The park is near the forest of Bondy where you will enjoy a panoramic view of the entire city. The Park is located between the towns of Clichy-Sous-Bois and Montfermeil.</p> <p>On the program:</p>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Discover the "Seine Saint Denis»: Fosse Maussoin's park, Bondy's forest, Oise's Natural Park, Saint Denis's Basilica, and Ourcq's docks... many places to enjoy a walk and outdoor's activities!</li> <li>- Visit of Paris: historical monuments (Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame, the Champs Elysées), visit of museums (Louvre, Museum d'Histoire Naturelle), discover Montmartre and its oldest streets in Paris, docks and summer festivities!</li> <li>- Games and all-nighters organised by your animators and you!</li> </ul> <p>Many activities and outings will be planned on the afternoons, but you could also make proposals if you want !</p>

<b>Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project</b>	<p>Located in the east of Paris, the forest of Vincennes is one of the green lungs of the capital. Many organisms are located there and allow the discovery of the forest's biodiversity. The school of Breuil, a gardening school located in the heart of the Vincennes Forest, welcomes us for the very first time. ## ANEC ADULT WORKCAMPS 2023

This year our adult workcamps will host between 7 and 14 volunteers. Half of the volunteers will be French; the other half will be international volunteers if the situation will enable us to host international volunteers. On our adult projects volunteers work about **30 hours per week**; most of the time they do not work on weekends, but it might happen for different reasons.

In our workcamps, all activities are decided amongst together with the volunteers and the camp leaders. You will live a group experience.

**The languages** spoken on our workcamps are English and French, except on specific international French speaking camps (indicated in the description).

**Everyday life:** the group will organise teams so that everybody can participate in the cleaning, tidying up, and preparation of the meals... do not forget your recipes!

**Activities:** on your arrival, leaders will propose several activities; but your ideas are welcome, and everything can be discussed. So be imaginative, the workcamp is a place for having fun! We do not expect you to do activities on your own, going to visit friends living nearby or going alone to watch a movie!

**Leading team:** camp leaders are not there to manage everything; they advise volunteers, suggest various activities; they are also a link between the different actors/actresses of the workcamp: the organizing association, the project sponsor, the local population, and the volunteers. Our camp leaders are usually volunteer leaders, but we might also have some paid leaders.

**Age Limit:** 18 years old minimum –no age limit.

***Sometimes, we can accept 17-year-old participants in some of our adult camps if they already have had a volunteering experience and if they are mature enough to join an adult project (a motivation letter is necessary for minor volunteers). Priority goes to French Access 4 All.***

On each adult project we open 1 to 3 places for people facing social or psychological difficulties (like living in youth homes or in specialized institutions). Be aware that these volunteers expect a lot from a workcamp experience; it is a big adventure for them and good contacts with international volunteers are really important.

**Insurance:** our association covers the volunteers **from the first to the last day** of the project (**third risk, individual accident, repatriation in case of emergency**). **Our insurance does not cover lost or stolen objects, or illness** (except those due to accidents, during the workcamp).

**Volunteers from E.U. countries MUST bring a European Health Card** to cover their cost (replacing the E111 form) (medical, pharmaceutical and hospitalization cover).

No advance of money will be given to them.

Our projects are adapted to the current sanitary situation and implement the applicable sanitary measures.

**Our adult camps have no extra fees.**

Thus, since 2019, a dozen volunteers from Joinville have created an association to safeguard the Convent. Several workcamps have already taken place, but this year, local volunteers wanted to widen the borders: they and they want to welcome a group of international volunteers! Located on the banks of the Moselle, and the wine-growing coasts of the region, it is a village where you can appreciate beautiful landscapes.</p> <p>The vines, around the village, offer a whole network of paths for walking. These are very popular with locals, tourists and sports enthusiasts. They are supported by small dry stone walls, which give them their charm.</p> <p>The Municipality of Ancy-Dornot and the Regional Natural Park of Lorraine are offering you this year to come and help them preserve them!</p>
<b>Description of work :</b>	<p>For this year, the project concerns the restoration of a dry-stone wall several tens of meters long which supports a path along the edge of the vineyard. This is a great opportunity for you to learn an ancestral construction technique: dry stone. This technique makes it possible to build walls without having to use mortar to consolidate them. 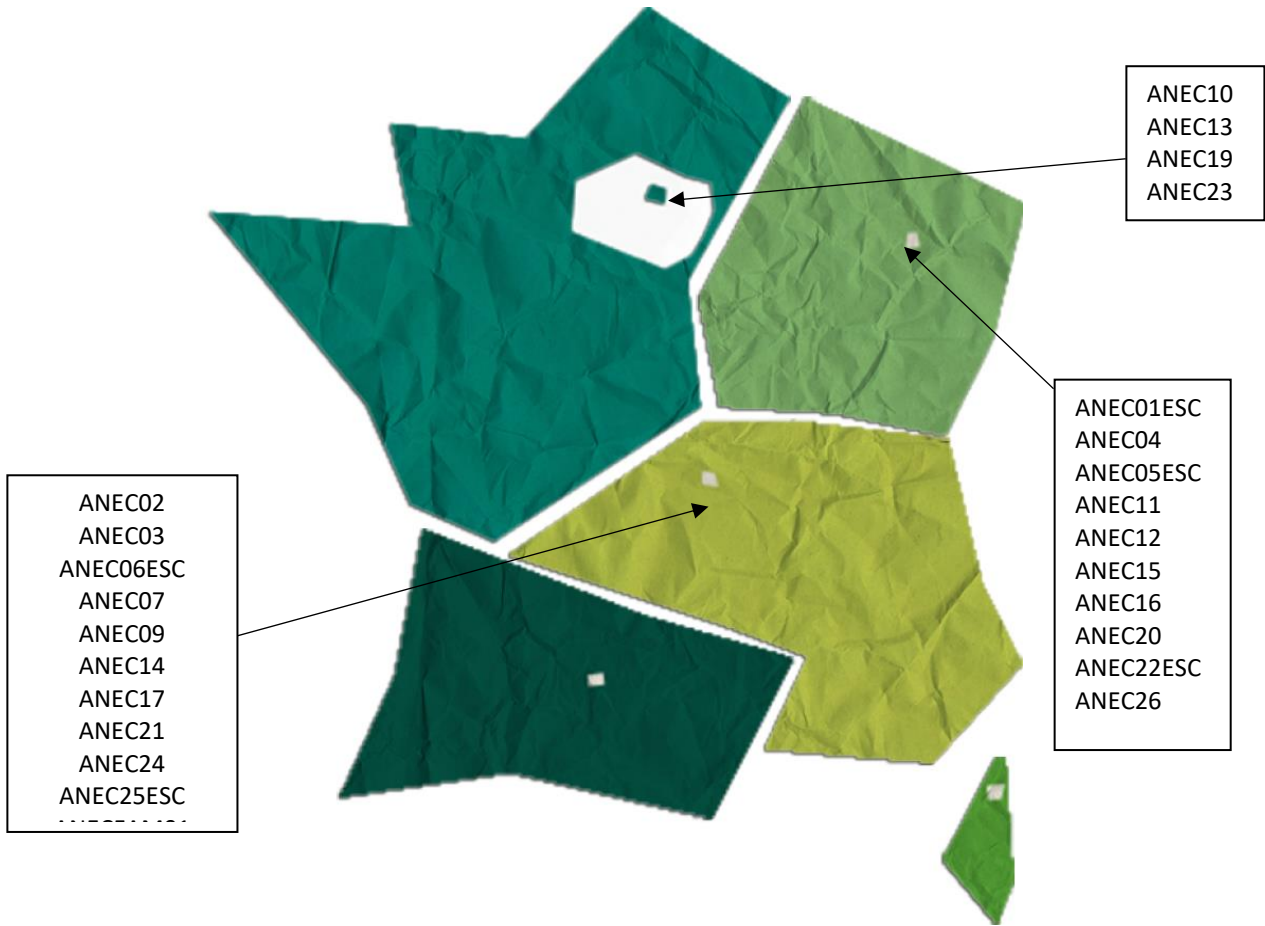
