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# Who are we? What is our mission?

<u>IPDJ or Instituto Português do Desporto e Juventude</u> is a governmental organization that has the task to implement in the whole national territory and at international level the youth policy. The PORTUGUESE SPORTS AND YOUTH INSTITUTE (IPDJ), results of the fusion in 2012, and succeeds in all the powers and obligations, of public bodies in the area of sport and youth, in particular the Portuguese Sport Institute, the Portuguese Youth Institute, the Foundation for the Dissemination of Information Technologies and MoviJovem (Youth Hostels and Youth Card). IPDJ is widespread in the whole continental territory, with presence in the 5 regions (North, Center, Lisbon, Alentejo and Algarve) and their 18 district capitals

We have 8 areas of intervention as we develop several national programs about it – support youth organizations, citizenship and participation; health and healthy lifestyles, studies on youth; Non-formal education, social inclusion and gender quality and innovation and entrepreneurship and employment. At International level we have several youth actions. We are a member of CCIVS and we have been an active partner on International Workcamps (especially through SCI) more than 30 years till now.


# All our camps are only for volunteers with 18 to 30 years old

Avanca belongs to the municipality of Estarreja, District of Aveiro. It is limited by the municipalities of Murtosa, Ovar and Oliveira de Azeméis. It is served by Estrada Nacional 109, by A29, as well as by the North railway line.

The center of the workcamp takes place at the heart of the festival, at Escola Básica Prof Dr Egas Moniz, where the workshops will also take place and where the secretariat and conference are located. The school is located in the center of the small village, from where the volunteers will find it easy to move between places, like supermarket, laundry, drugstore, among other services. In this same place there is a canteen with free access to volunteers.

#### **Camp Description and Aims**

#### General objectives:

- Valorization and promotion of natural and cultural heritage (namely, walking trails and green areas);
- Promotion of sustainability, environmental awareness, and biodiversity protection:
- Promotion of intercultural relationships, good environmental practices, and citizenship;
- Promotion of specific skills in the field of cultural and natural heritage protection.

#### Specific objectives:

- Maintenance of walking trails;
- Removal of invasive species and prevention of forest fires by controlling shrubs and invasive vegetation.
- Installation of shelters for wildlife;
- Improvement and protection of biodiversity and ecosystem services;
- Valorization of natural and cultural heritage through participation in leisure activities and workshops.

#### **Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp**

- Restoration work of some degraded pathways and natural heritage;
- Vegetation trimming and removal;
- Improvement of walking trails;
- Improvement of local fauna, flora, and landscape, including fire prevention actions;
- Building nest-boxes for birds, insects and bats;
- Building a pond for wildlife;
- Control invasive species;
- Presentation and discussion of the natural and social reality of the regions of origin of the participants;
- Promotion of environmentally and socially responsible attitudes and values;
- Development of action-training actions focused on individual and collective learning.

# What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

- Participants will perform field tasks but also learn about nature conservation and engage in conservation-training activities, while getting to know the Portuguese fauna and flora;
- Participants will interact with biology students that are doing their studies in the nature areas where we are going to work;
- Participants will also learn why nature conservation is important and how small environmental projects such as these workcamps can be crucial to preserve an entire habitat:
- Encouragement of international exchange and exchange of experience;
- Presentation and discussion of the natural and social reality of the regions of origin of the participants;
- Promotion of environmentally and socially responsible attitudes and values;
- Development of action-training actions focused on individual and collective learning;
- Get to know local culture and traditions.

#### Accommodation/Food

Participants will sleep in a sports complex in a rural area of Albergaria-a-Velha, in shared rooms (separated by gender) with beds. The sports locker rooms with hot water showers are also separated by gender.

Participants have to bring their own towels and hygiene products, sleeping bag or sheets+blanket, and pillow. The organization will provide breakfasts, lunches and dinners. Lunches and dinners are prepared/cooked by the municipality's staff and served at a canteen, but some lunches will be served in the field (sandwiches, fruits, etc.). There's a vegetarian option.

#### Travelling from Porto Airport by bus or train

There are some Express Bus from the airport to Albergaria-a-Velha. If you can't find a direct bus: just outside the airport take the metro (subway http://en.metrodoporto.pt/) to Porto - Campanhã main station (30min). At Campanhã, take the Express Bus to Albergaria-a-Velha (55 min). Alternative: at Campanhã main station take a train to Aveiro, and from there a bus to Albergaria-a-Velha (local train cheaper and bought on site).

# Travelling from Lisbon Airport by bus or train

Just outside the airport take the metro (subway <a href="http://www.metrolisboa.pt/eng/">http://www.metrolisboa.pt/eng/</a>) to Oriente main station (10 min). At Oriente, there are trains and buses. There are Express Buses directly to Albergaria-a-Velha (about 3h). Alternative: at Oriente main station take a train to Aveiro (fast trains are 2h), and from there a bus to Albergaria-a-Velha.

#### **LOCAL HOST**



Charcos & Companhia is an NGO dedicated to nature conservation, to the protection of the natural and built heritage in the Aveiro region and to the engagement and connection of people to the natural world.

The camp will be organized in close collaboration with the Municipality of Estarreja that implemented and coordinates the pioneering project of nature and biodiversity conservation in Ria de Aveiro – BioRia – and Associação BioLiving, an award-winning environmental NGO which motto is "Nature and Education for All".

These three entities have been working together in the Baixo Vouga Lagunar region to protect this extremely important and rare agroecosystem and the habitats and biodiversity existent in this lagoon system.

# **WORKCAMP DESCRIPTION**

#### **Camp Description and Aims**

This camp will take place in Baixo Vouga Lagunar, in two areas of the Estarreja municipality, both of high ecological and social value. BioRia is a network of nature trails, a paradise for birdwatching, integrated in a Natura 2000 site. In Canelas, the LUSITANICA project has been running since 2016, aiming to convert a degraded area into a model forest for nature conservation and fire prevention, as well as to rebuild heritage buildings: an abandoned water mill and a historic fountain ('Fonte dos Namoricos') which is very degraded. It is an area much cherished by the population, but it requires a major intervention to return to being the social dynamic pole it was in the past. This project integrates environmental and social interventions promoting sustainability as a whole.

#### General objectives:

- Valorization and restoration of natural and cultural heritage (biodiversity, cultural heritage, watermills and fountains);
- Promotion of sustainability, environmental awareness, and biodiversity protection;
- Promotion of intercultural relationships, good environmental practices, and citizenship;
- Promotion of intergenerational contact (some activities will have elderly people helping or explaining local traditions);
- Promotion of specific skills in the field of cultural and environmental heritage protection

The main goals of this workcamp are the recovery of rural heritage, enhancing the biodiversity of our Center, and promoting the animal welfare of donkeys and their quality of life. We want to o enable the discovery of the Miranda Plateau, a unique rural region, rich in natural beauty, biodiversity, culture and traditions. With so aging population in these villages, one of the goals is bringing together the young participants and the local community, therefore promoting intercultural (urban/rural, international/national) and intergenerational (youngsters/ elderly) encounters and exchanges.

Nature Ambassador Workcamp's main goals consist in the promotion of non-formal education among participants and respect for different cultures in an intergenerational environment. The Workcamp will be based in Espinhosela, a village located in the heart of Montesinho natural park, Bragança district, in the Northeastern part of Portugal, near the border with Spain (41.896854, -6.842691). Montesinho Natural Park is one of the best protected areas of Portugal, where it is possible to find red deer, roe deer, wild boar and healthy population of wolves. Its landscape consists of patches of oak tree forests, with forests and orchards of chestnut trees, which constitute one of the main economic incomes of the local community.

Even though Espinhosela is very rural, it is only 17 km away from Bragança city centre. Most of the population is quite aged, but due to the 4 nature routes that cross the village, there is an influx of tourists in the village. The village has a souvenir shop with local products.

It is necessary to adopt responsible attitudes towards the environment on the path to environmental sustainability. It is of utmost importance to promote sustainable development in an innovative action to combat climate change, responding to climate change taking into account the multidimensional challenges to development at global, national and local levels.

It is extremely important to identify and recover the community's material heritage, in order to recover old human practices that were more sustainable and a motor of social cohesion (for example, spaces for intergenerational interaction) or to recover environmental heritage that has been showing a decrease in biodiversity due to the increasing presence of exotic species and that, in a heritage recovery programme, could serve the community with trails and leisure spaces in the forest and greater care for forest spaces. Through the following specific objectives: to build an organic, educational and community vegetable garden, to implement the aromatic bed and create spaces to support the recreational and educational activities; to recover spaces for leisure and exploration of nature at the 7pétalas Conviviality Centre in Fornelos, Fafe.

The main objectives of this project are: to develop healthy habits and lifestyles in the participants; promote self-development, self-esteem, responsibility and autonomy, contributing to the acquisition of personal, social and professional skills; to sensitize youth to the importance of their participation in community development and preservation of natural resources; acquire and / or reinforce the language skills of the participants; European citizenship and sustainable growth to fight climate change.

These objectives contribute to the priorities and goals of the Europe 2030 Strategy, as they will encourage young participants to learn, develop and update skills through participation in non-formal education activities.

#### Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

In Fafe, the tasks include: Creating an organic, pedagogical and community vegetable garden; Repairing garden spaces; Placing a floor for the circulation of articulated chairs (wheel chairs); Painting the exterior walls and repairing the existing one; Repairing playful-pedagogical stimuli, such as trunks, tyres, etc. We will also request the support of participant to recover of environmental heritage through collecting waste and removing invasive species; Creating an organic, educational and community vegetable garden making accessible and signposting the leisure areas to be created in the forest context and identifying and building an interpretative trail in the nature.

#### What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

Participants can learn to plant, to prepare wood structures for tree climbing circuit, to select and use natural materials in constructions (that don't harm the nature), to build a pond to study biodiversity, the effect of specific aromatic plants in the control of invasive species, the problem of invasive plants domination in forests, to design and build inclusive platforms for wheel chairs access with natural materials.

- Cleaning the water spring of Arrifana and the bed and banks of the Rio dos Mouros, combating invasive species, and preserving native ones.
- Cleaning the Rio dos Mouros pedestrian trail.
- Cleaning and preserving the aqueduct and Roman wall of Alcabideque.
- Cleaning and painting various water fountains for community use in the parish of Ega.













# What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

You will learn about local biodiversity and how to identify plants and animals that need to be protected, especially in the water spring

of Arrifana, including some species from the Red List of Threatened Species. You will also learn about the preservation of monuments, using instruments and learning techniques for this purpose.

Apart from the task-related knowledge, during these 12 days, you will be learning by experience, improving your skills, and reflecting on common living, cooperation, collective decision-making, conflict management, cultural diversity, and solidarity. You will certainly develop your intercultural skills, communication skills, and autonomy. You will also learn how to manage a collective budget and plan and prepare meals for a large group of people.

# Free Time, Leisure Time and Visits preview

In your free time, you can enjoy the natural calm of the surroundings for some personal time or use all the space to play games and gather within the group of volunteers. If you take a walk or bike to the town of Condeixa, there are parks, cafes, and several shops.

We will prepare several visits and cultural surprises for the group, which we like to keep (partially) secret... But you can expect a day at the ocean, several evenings of music, animation, and fun with the local community, and a time-traveling experience while visiting the Roman ruins of Conimbriga and an interactive museum.

The camp includes 5 meals: breakfast; morning snack; lunch; afternoon snack, dinner, and evening snack. All meals will be prepared by volunteers individually (breakfast and snacks) or in cooking teams (lunch and dinner). Cooking teams change each day and will also go shopping for food for the whole group (we will provide a daily budget to each team). The first meals will be prepared by the camp leaders! We can easily adapt to special diets and/or food allergies.

- 1) Raise awareness about the importance of youth mobilization and participation in solving local and global problems;
- 2) Promoting youth participation and involvement in environmental and social issues, in particular in the management of water resources and biodiversity;
- 3) Reflect on the causes and consequences of climate change and ways to act as citizens, particularly in terms of managing water resources and biodiversity;
- 4) Reflect on the importance of autochthonous flora species for biodiversity and management of water resources
- 5)To support Marca in setting up and maintaining a nursery of Mediterranean flora species
- 6) Promote reflection on sustainable behaviours, tools that help these behaviours, namely in terms of consumption and their impacts on the management of water resources and biodiversity.

#### Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

Collection and sorting of seeds of native plants. In these activities participants will be able to get to know the region's natural areas; Cleaning of watercourses, control of invasive species and habitat restoration. In order to ensure the normal hydrological and hydraulic functioning of the watercourses, the participants will proceed to clean, cut and remove the invasive vegetation present in the bed and margins of the temporary watercourses, and support biophysics technics implementation; Plant Nursery maintenance work. In this activity participants will be involved in daily plant nursery tasks, such as watering, transplanting, soil preparation, cleaning and organize the plant nursery space, etc.; Zero Waste Cleaning Activity in urban areas. In this activity participants will clean urban areas without producing more waste, like plastic bags.

Participants will acquire theoretical and practical knowledge on:

- Climate Action: how to deal with climate change impacts in a natural and rural environment on the Mediterranean area;

- Autochthones flora species: the importance for biodiversity and water management in rural and urban areas



#### **Camp Description and Aims**

The main objective of this project is for the young participants to help build the Panoramic Garden for the village of Arrouquelas, which also includes the construction of a Swing. Also it has several other objectives such as promoting intercultural activities; involve the population of Arrouquelas in the project; create moments of sharing and knowledge about the different participating countries and cultures; make use of creativity and imagination to build this place; create a comfortable and interesting place for our young people to enjoy in the best way; promote our project on social networks and regional media; use, in construction and decoration, reused, recycled and environmentally friendly materials; and create bridges of communication and interaction between national and international youth.

#### **Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp**

- Carrying out manual activities, painting, simple constructions;
- Maintenance of the existing space and fauna, in order to create a pleasant space for our community;
- Enhancement of our village, through attractive spaces for visitors;

All these skills are the basis of Non-Formal Education and learning by doing.

#### **Camp Description and Aims**

The "Letters Connecting the World!" is a workcamp that aims to revive the tradition and joy of sending letters, fostering intergenerational and multicultural bonds in the community of Constância. Throughout a week in September 2024, the Constância Library will be transformed into a centre of dynamic activities, hosting 12 enthusiastic volunteers. The focus is on building lasting friendships between local and international youth, who will become pen-pals by the end of the project.

The project also aims to revitalise interest in libraries as cultural spaces, encouraging the community to rediscover these knowledge-rich locations. To achieve these goals, we propose a series of engaging and inclusive activities, providing opportunities for learning, connection, and creative expression for all ages.

#### **Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp**

The main tasks to be implemented by the volunteers during the workcamp include the following:

- 1. Facilitation of Activities at the Library:
- Conduct reading activities and storytelling for children.
- Organise thematic exhibitions featuring books related to different cultures.
- 2. Management of the Letter Drop and Collection Point:
- Establish and maintain a central point in the library for letter drop-off and collection.
- Encourage visitors to participate in the project by providing writing materials and envelopes.
- 3. Artistic and Sustainable Workshops:
- Facilitate the visual arts workshop to create a symbolic stamp for the letters.
- Organise upcycling workshops, teaching techniques to reuse materials and reduce waste.
- Lead the sustainable practices workshop, emphasising the importance of eco-consciousness in daily life.
- 4. Promotion of Calligraphy and Artistic Expression:
- Offer the calligraphy workshop to enhance handwriting skills.
- Encourage the creation of artistically decorated letters to make the experience more personal and unique.
- 5. Cultural Night in the Village:
- Coordinate the cultural night, where international youth will share their traditions and stories.
- Collaborate with local youth to create engaging and informative cultural presentations.

This workcamp will utilize creative methodologies, making it an excellent opportunity for those interested in this field to enhance their creative skills. The tasks will enable volunteers to forge stronger connections across generations and cultures, as well as contribute to the transformation of the library into a dynamic centre for learning and cultural exchange in Constância.

English will be the primary language used during the workcamp. However, while engaging with the local community, language barriers may arise. To address these challenges, we will employ creative methodologies, for instance, Portuguese participants will assist with translation and our storytelling activities will incorporate silent theatre techniques. Additionally, during the cultural night, we will introduce dances and games that foster relationships among volunteers and locals without relying on verbal communication.

#### What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

The study component of "Letters Connecting the World!" aims to provide volunteers with a diverse and enriching learning experience. Through a combination of workshops, activities, and cultural exchange, participants will have the opportunity to acquire valuable knowledge and skills, fostering personal growth and intercultural understanding.

- 1. Penpal Correspondence Skills Volunteers will delve into the art of penpal correspondence, refining their writing skills and learning the nuances of effective communication across cultures. The exchange of letters will not only strengthen language proficiency but also cultivate empathy and understanding.
- 2. Sustainable Practices and Upcycling Workshops on sustainable practices and upcycling will empower volunteers with practical skills to reduce environmental impact. Participants will explore creative ways to repurpose materials, contributing to a more ecofriendly lifestyle.
- 3. Cultural Awareness and Appreciation Through cultural workshops and the Cultural Night event, volunteers will gain a deeper appreciation for diversity. Learning about the traditions, customs, and perspectives of both local and international participants will foster cross-cultural understanding and collaboration.
- 4. Artistic Expression and Symbolism The arts and crafts workshops, including the creation of a symbolic stamp for letters, will provide volunteers with a platform for artistic expression. This not only enhances creativity but also emphasises the power of visual communication and symbolism in storytelling.
- 5. Library Engagement and Community Building Volunteers will learn about the importance of community spaces, specifically libraries, in fostering knowledge-sharing and cultural exchange. Engaging with the local library will highlight the role these institutions play in building strong, informed communities.
- 6. Practical Skills in Event Coordination Being involved in the planning and execution of workshops and the Cultural Night event will equip volunteers with practical event coordination skills. This hands-on experience will be valuable in various future endeavours.

The study part of "Letters Connecting the World!" is designed to be a holistic and immersive learning journey, offering volunteers a blend of practical skills, cultural insights, and personal development opportunities. Participants will leave not only as adept penpals but also as individuals enriched by a broader understanding of the world around them.

# Free Time, Leisure Time and Visits preview

During the free time, the volunteers will have the chance to relax in the camping park where you can find green spaces, tables and also a court to play ball games like futebol and volleyball. It is also possible to visit the fluvial beach in Constância and other venues in the city, many of which we will get to know about during the first days, including the butterfly museum, the science centre, coffee places, among others. There will also be a free afternoon during the programme and there will be the possibility to do canyoning or visit another city in Portugal. The official plans are still to be confirmed, since we would like to know about the volunteers' preferences.

MONTIS is a nature conservation NGO that operates in Portugal, founded in 2014. The main goal of MONTIS is to manage abandoned marginal land, with low or no economic value, with an ecosystem restoration approach, to recover ecosystem functionality and support increasing biodiversity. For that goal we put into practice a nature-based approach, relying on the support or restoration of the key natural processes and assets, such as soil quality, water management and habitat enhancement.

In order to get land to manage we buy land for nature conservation through crowdfunding, and we also establish management agreements with landowners.

Ecosystem restoration tasks and activities are performed mostly with volunteers. Since its foundation MONTIS has created a strong volunteering programme, with different types of volunteers. For us volunteering is an awareness-raising tool, and a way to involve people in nature conservation.

#### **Camp Description and Aims**

The work camp has the general objective of bringing together young people from different nationalities, cultures and contexts with the common objective of contributing to the increase of biodiversity, to the restoration of degraded ecosystems and the increase of the landscape's fire resilience. The conservation works will take place in an area managed by MONTIS in the interior of Portugal, in Carvalhais, São Pedro do Sul. The area where the tasks will be carried out, is an ecologically degraded and sensitive area. It is expected that with this joint work, guided by monitors and specialized technicians, the participants will be able to develop new learnings and skills in the areas of nature and restoration of ecosystems. It is also expected, with the joint volunteering tasks, which include individual and collective tasks, fauna workshops and leisure activities, to stimulate cultural, linguistic learning and intercultural interaction amongst the community of participants. The work field is organized in a "learn by doing" logic.

As for nature outputs of the workcamp, the following are expected: to improve the conditions for the vegetation growth; improve habitats; increase fire resilience; improve soil quality; increase water infiltration into the ground; identify and record fauna and flora, which will be publicly available on the open platform iNaturalist (<a href="https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/montis">https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/montis</a>). The ecological restoration techniques to be applied are replicable in other geographical contexts in Europe, so there is a high European added value in international participation and in the transfer of skills and learning between participants and monitors.



The conservation works will take place in areas managed by MONTIS in the interior of Portugal, in Pampilhosa da Serra. 

Tasks to be performed by young participants:

#### **Popular games**

- Collect and organize material for popular games such as bags for the sack race, bows, walking platform and ropes;
- Distribute the material around the place where the popular games will take place;
- Support the organization during popular games with specific tasks for each game, such as delivering bags to local participants, tightening ropes, among others.

- 2. Support the highlighted families in this parish with the **rehabilitation of their homes** or small repairs, providing greater well-being in their homes to families with **few resources**;

Prior visit to the homes that will be requalified to identify problems and plan improvements to the home:

- Take notes of main problems in the house;
- Write/Plan and decide which improvements will be implemented taking into account the cost/benefit;
- Definition of priority level for improvements
- Identify how much paint will be needed and what materials to purchase for repairs, taking into account the problems identified;
- Buy material necessary for the renovation of the house;

#### Rehabilitation of two houses selected by the parish council:
