ABOUT BALMES BLANCS The hosting organization

The organization in charge of the work camp is <u>Balmes</u> <u>Blancs</u>, a non-profit association created in 2010 to offer unique activities in nature with the aim of presenting new places and new people, thus deepening the knowledge of the Catalan territory. Since its inception, it has organized various activities such as snowshoe outings with animal footprints, astronomical discoveries, kayaking to explore marine fauna, rafting trips, hiking in the mountains, and leveling and safety workshops, among others.

In 2013, the association began working in the Siarb Valley. From that moment on, Balmes Blancs focused its activities around the valley. Some of the activities they offer include guided visits to the "Despoblat de Santa Creu" in Llagunes, visits to the trenches on the Pallars front and the Vilamur bunkers, geological discoveries, and activities related to flora and fauna in the environment. At the same time, the refuge promotes hiking by creating signposted routes around Llagunes, along with a series of actions aimed at recovering the heritage of the Siarb Valley to discover rural life in Pallars Sobirà and the Pyrenees.

Support the Path's Museum

Support the operation of the *Vall de Siarb shelter*:

Welcoming visitors

Maintain the space clean and tidy

Maintaining the old paths:

Training:

According to the ESC program, volunteers will attend the Welcome and Mid-Term training, organized by the National Agency.

Support work camp organization:

Lead the groups of young
volunteers
Plan the tasks to do and the tools

Explain the project to the
participants/volunteers

Personal project:

The volunteer will have the opportunity to develop a personal project, in collaboration with the other ESC volunteers.









Practical parts of the project

Working hours:

The volunteer's schedule will be flexible, depending on the time of year and the specific project they are involved in.

Working hours will range from 9:00h to 14:30h, with the times subject to the needs of the project or season.

The volunteer will enjoy two days off each week (Tuesday and Wednesday).

Accommodation and transport:

The volunteer will live in the Vall de Siarb shelter located in Llagunes, and sleep in a double room. To move around the valley, there is one local bus with limited schedule.

Pocket money:

Volunteers will receive pocket money for personal expenses throughout the duration of the activity, including holidays.

Insurance: volunteers will be covered throughout the activity period by the obligatory European Solidarity Corps insurance plan (Henner) established by the European Commission. This coverage is only supplementary to the mandatory coverage of the **European Health Insurance** Card (EHIC), which volunteers must obtain prior to departure. In certain cases, when national rules deprive participants of coverage under EHIC for the duration of the placement, Henner will provide full coverage. However, you must provide proof that obtaining the EHIC in your case was not possible.

Language courses

The volunteers will have access to EU Academy, and will be encouraged to enroll in Catalan lessons. We also recommend that the participants begin practicing Spanish before their arrival in Llagunes to improve their language skills.









Profile of the volunteer

Open-minded attitude, demonstrating flexibility and adaptability to various situations and environments.

Good teamwork volunteer.

A volunteer comfortable working with their hands and using basic tools to carry out several tasks effectively, such cutting bushes, building drywall stones, and more. Willing to do manual tasks that require physical effort.

Interested in living in a rural area and small village in the Pyrenees.

<u>Llagunes</u> is a small village about 15/20 inhabitants and the largest village in the valley is <u>Sort</u>.
