ABOUT INEX-SDA

INEX – Association of Voluntary Activities is a non-governmental not-for-profit organization founded in 1991 to carry out and support international voluntary work and intercultural education. We arrange voluntary placements abroad for Czech volunteers and organize voluntary projects in our country for incoming foreign volunteers. Annually we send almost 500 volunteers abroad to short-term or long-term projects and welcome around 300 volunteers in the Czech Republic.

The mission of INEX-SDA is to:

1. encourage the development of a respectful and open society,
2. promote an active and responsible approach to the world around us both locally and globally.

Our tools are international voluntary projects, educational programs and campaigns.

We create space in which especially people can gain new experiences, expand their skills and develop their views of the complexity of the world around them.

BASIC GENERAL INFORMATION FOR WORKCAMP PARTICIPANTS

Age limit: Minimum age is 18 years. If not stated differently, there is no maximum age limit. For teenage workcamps, the age limit is 15-17. For family workcamps, the age limit for children is 5+.

Duration of the projects: 3 - 18 days

Number of volunteers per project: 5 - 15 volunteers + 1-2 campleaders

Project language: English

Working hours: Approximately 6 hours per day with 1-2 free days/week

Insurance:

INEX-SDA provides basic liability insurance for project participants above 15 years old. INEX-SDA does not provide any travel health insurance or COVID-19 insurance for the workcamp participants. Nevertheless, volunteers cannot stay at the workcamp without this insurance! We strongly advise volunteers to arrange additional travel insurance for the whole duration of the workcamp including travel days. The insurance should cover all the activities listed in the infosheet. Volunteers need to bring all the necessary documents along with them. Volunteers from the EU need to bring their EHIC cards as well.

Study part:

Excursions, discussions, workshops, guided tours or intercultural evenings for the public are planned as part of each project depending on the local possibilities. In this way, INEX-SDA supports non-formal (intercultural) learning in relation to the projects' topics. This year, our local partners were asked to focus especially on the study part of the projects.

Other requirements:

No special knowledge or skills are required, but enthusiasm and interest in the project are necessary. For some projects, we ask for a motivation letter, a certificate of good conduct and/or a medical form. The motivation letter needs to be handed in with the application form. Some projects require additional documents – a sworn declaration of the non-existence of a criminal record, a medical form filled in and signed by a doctor, etc. After acceptance of the volunteer, INEX-SDA will send you a template of these forms. Please note the additional information in the project descriptions.

Teenage workcamps:

INEX-SDA teenage workcamps are open for participants from 15 to 17 years old. We require each underage participant to send us **parental authorization** and a **medical form** filled and signed by a

parent or a legal guardian. Both documents will be provided after acceptance and must be sent as scan copies no later than 4 weeks before the start of the workcamp (by email) and then brought to the workcamp (in hard copies).

Participation fee:

Due to the limited outgoing resources INEX-SDA, we kindly ask participants to contribute 10 EUR (5 EUR for weekend workcamps) towards the costs of the general incoming administration of our workcamps. The fee will be collected upon arrival in cash by the campleaders. Please note that this fee does not directly contribute to the workcamp budgets. (

For teenage and family workcamps, we ask participants to contribute with a fee which covers the costs of some free time activities and/or accommodation, food, and costs of the local campleader/main campleader. The fee needs to be sent to us by bank transfer in advance. Bank details and the deadline for payment will be provided in the acceptance email.

Cancellation policy:

If the volunteer cancels the application ...

... more than 43 days before the start of the project -> The volunteer will be refunded 75% of the fee

... between 42-31 days before the start of the project -> The volunteer will be refunded 50% of the fee

... in case of last-minute cancellation (30 or fewer days), the fee will not be refunded to the volunteer

If participation won't be possible due to COVID (due to sickness or travel restrictions) we will not enforce the cancellation policy. Nevertheless, we require the volunteers to send us a note from the doctor. INEX-SDA will send an email with bank transfer details to send the remaining part of the fee.

Campleaders:

Our workcamps are led by one or two campleaders who coordinate the everyday life in the group. They cooperate with the local partners and facilitate decision-making in the group. Our campleaders are required to complete an intensive 3-day training specially designed to their needs. Our campleaders also have basic first-aid training.

Alliance Access 4 All Campaign:

We welcome volunteers with fewer opportunities at our workcamps. Placement to the right project will be based on volunteers' needs and cooperation between all the parties involved. We use A4A tools. The placement of volunteers with fewer opportunities is mainly upon the agreement with our local partners. Do not hesitate to contact us to discuss the possibilities.

COVID-19:

In case of a COVID-positive volunteer, the workcamp will either have to be cancelled immediately or the volunteers will have to stay in a mandatory quarantine, depending on local health authorities' statement. If either situation occurs, volunteers will have to arrange their travels at their expense.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE INEX-SDA WORKCAMP

Our workcamps can be classified into four thematic groups:

1. Help the Community (project code starts with 1)

The projects take place in small rural communities and focus on the sustainable development of the villages and the surrounding countryside (there are also projects in cities). Volunteers support local municipalities and non-governmental organizations by helping with renovation, organization of local festivals and events and preparing activities for children and youth.

2. Help the Landmarks (project code starts with 2)

The projects focus mainly on the preservation and renovation of historically significant objects such as castles, historical cemeteries, churches and other monuments. The volunteers will get familiar with the history of the Czech Republic. Through their practical work awareness of the importance to preserve historically and culturally important sites are raised.

3. Help the People (project code starts with 3)

The volunteers support various social projects which offer help to people facing social exclusion, children and youth, the elderly, people with special needs and others. According to the needs of the local partner, the volunteers do manual work (e.g. renovation, maintenance, construction work) or work directly with the projects' clients.

4. Help the Nature (project code starts with 4)

The projects aim at environmental protection and education towards an environment-friendly lifestyle. The volunteers will do practical environmental work in natural preserves, forests and other environmentally important areas. Most of the work takes place outdoors and can include planting trees, scything protected meadows or reviving springs etc.

1. Community projects

SDA 100 Make Broumov a European Capital of Culture

23/06 – 30/06/2023

Vols: 9 + 2 team leaders

Age: 18+

Requirements/Note: -

Project: The workcamp is organised in cooperation with the Broumov Foundation, which focuses its resources on the cultural development of the city and the whole microregion. The goal of this project is to clean and tidy up the mill of the Broumov monastery to prepare it for a one-day public display. The long-term objective is to transform the mill into a cultural community centre. Broumov is also a candidate for the European Capital of Culture for the year 2028, and this workcamp is an indivisible part of its success. At this workcamp, you are actively contributing to the achievement of UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: Your work will consist of: sweeping, moving light objects, preparing rooms for the exhibition, preparing the bonfire, preparation for the “mill open” event. You will also have an opportunity to contribute to the photo exhibition and the mill opening community program. During the week, you will get to know the students of the Broumov grammar school and will be able to establish new friendships. Bring suitable clothes and shoes that can get dirty during work. No previous experience is required.

Study part: Meeting the local community, sightseeing tour of the city, and visiting the Broumov monastery. You will also have the opportunity to show parts of your culture as part of the opening day. You will thus also learn about the different cultures of your colleagues.

Leisure time: In your free time you can primarily do outdoor activities. The city offers electric bikes for lease, or nearby, there is a national natural reservation which is ideal for rock climbing. The local monastery also hosts collective meditations each Tuesday morning. On the 25th of June, there is a meeting with the community and an option to attend the ‘Experience Brewery Differently’ event. June also hosts a variety of other cultural events which you can join.

Accommodation/Food: You will be accommodated in a guest house of the monastery, where you will sleep in one big room with the rest of your peers. You will have access to shared bathrooms and toilets. Bed sheets are included as well as free WiFi. There is no washing machine. Accommodation in the Broumov monastery is a great experience - you can experience how Benedictine monks used to live but you have to respect quiet hours after 10 PM. Breakfast will be provided in the place of accommodation and lunch with dinner will be served in a nearby restaurant.

Location: The workcamp will take place in the medieval city of Broumov, which is surrounded by walls from medieval times and known for its baroque features. The town has a population of approximately 7500 residents and is located on the border with Poland in the Northern part of Czechia. Nearby, you will find ATMs, stores, supermarkets, pharmacies, an info centre, a cinema, a theatre, and touristic paths.

Requirements: Bring suitable clothes and shoes that can get dirty during work.

Notes: Broumovsko is unique for its baroque past and wild nature. As part of the candidacy for the European Capital of Culture, we want to connect Broumov with the rest of Europe and the world and turn the periphery into a lively place.

Directions to the meeting point: From the airport take bus 119 to Nadrazi Veleslavin stop. Change to green metro line A in the direction of Depo Hostivar, get off at “Muzeum” and change to red metro line C in direction of Letnany, go 1 stop and get off at “Hlavni Nadrazi” stop (main railway station). From here, take train LE 1259 Leo Express at 13:00 to “Pardubice hlavni nadrazi”. At 14:06 (careful, you will have 5 mins to switch trains), you

will take train Sp 1482 from station "Pardubice hlavní nadrazi" to "Hradec Kralove hlavní nadrazi". At 14:31 (8 mins to catch the train), you will take train Sp 2002 Dobrosov from station "Hradec Kralove hlavní nadrazi" to "Broumov". You will arrive at 16:30. Your camp leader will be waiting there for you. Detailed information will be provided in the infosheet.

SDA 101 Summer in the Elbe Lowlands

02/07 – 14/07/2023

Vols: 16 + 2 team leaders

Age: 18+

Requirements/note: -

Project: The workcamp is organized in cooperation with the Local Action Group (LAG) Podlipansko in the small village of Dobrichov. The LAG focuses on the development of all parts of the region and helps to distribute European and state subsidies to improve the quality of life in the entire region. One of the projects is the reconstruction of the rectory with a neglected garden, which is in an unusable condition after years of no maintenance. Many ruins of old buildings of no historical value forbid a safe environment for the locals' visit. The goal of this project is to renovate the garden to make it accessible to the public for cultural or environmental events. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of the UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: Your work will primarily be to clean the ruins of one of the old buildings which will be demolished as part of the reconstruction. You will also recycle some of the materials from the old buildings, so they can be reused for the renovation itself. Additionally, you will weed the garden and rake the grass to make it brighter the place. Most of the work will be outside and manual, so bring suitable clothes and shoes appropriate for work, long sleeves and pants are recommended. In cases of rain, you will work on emptying an old building which is part of the rectory.

Study part: Football or volleyball tournaments with the local community, as well as a visit to the nearby Radim castle and the ancient town of Kourim, a tour of the nearby towns of Pecky and Kolin.

Leisure time: You can play table tennis, table football, piano, lacrosse, and basketball, try archery, badminton and more sports activities. Musical instruments are welcome.

Accommodation/Food: You will sleep directly in the rectory in two renovated rooms on sleeping mats. There are three toilets, a shower, a small kitchen and a washing machine available. WIFI is available. You will need to bring a sleeping bag and a pillow. You can also bring an inflatable mat for better comfort. Lunch will be provided by a local partner. You will be responsible for preparing your breakfast and dinner from provided ingredients. Bring your favourite recipes.

Location: The project will take place in Dobrichov, which is a village of over 700 residents located 1 hour from Prague. It is surrounded by larger towns, such as Kolin or Cesky Brod. In the village, you can find a supermarket, a local pub, a soccer field, tennis courts, playgrounds, a church and more. An ATM and a pharmacy are both right in the city centre, not far away from the accommodation.

Requirements: You are not allowed to smoke on the premises of the town's rectory. Please bring a sleeping bag, a pillow, sturdy shoes and appropriate clothing for outdoor work.

Notes: Because the work will take place outside in the garden, beware of allergies to grass, pollen, and insects

Directions to the meeting point: From Prague airport, take bus 119 to "Nadrazi Veleslavin" station. From here, take train Os 9827 to "Masarykovo nadrazi" at 15:01 where you need to change to train Os 9341 to "Pecky" at 15:58. Lastly, you will walk from Pecky to Dobrichov (aprox. 17 mins), your campleader will guide you. Detailed information will be provided in the infosheet.

SDA 102 Get creative, paint cabins, drink Mattoni!

14/08 – 22/08/2023

Vols: 10 + 2 team leaders

Age: 18+

Requirements/note:

Project: This workcamp is organised in cooperation with Local Action Group Krusne hory (LAG Ore Mountains) and the municipality of Kyselka. This LAG focuses on the support and development of the region through organizing and funding educational and cultural projects, connecting various stakeholders, preparing tourist brochures or co-organizing volunteer activities. Kyselka is located 11 kilometres from Karlovy Vary in the forested valley of the Ohre River and its history is associated with Heinrich Mattoni and the spa industry. This workcamp aims to renovate cabins at Ontario Recreation Area. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: The work will be mainly manual and consist of sanding the exterior and interior of the cabins, cleaning, painting and minor repairs. There will be an opportunity to apply your creativity while painting. The goal is to renovate 5 cabins in total. No previous experience is required, bring clothes and shoes that can get dirty or damaged and a raincoat.

Study part: You will have a chance to meet with local citizens in the Ontario area and they will introduce you to their daily life, you will learn about the history of the village, Czech culture and nature, and you might taste the local cuisine.

Leisure time: You might visit the spa areas, the Mattoni museum or the Bucina lookout tower. You might use a sports area, a swimming pool or make a bonfire. If interested, it is possible to arrange a boat trip on the Ohre river.

Accommodation/Food: You will be accommodated in two cabins directly on the premises of Ontario Recreational Area. Each cabin is divided into several rooms, you will sleep on beds, blankets, pillows and bedsheets will be provided. There is basic kitchen equipment in the cabin such as a cooker, a kettle, a pot, cups, glasses, etc. The bathrooms are in one building within the recreational area, you might use a washing machine if you need it. There is WIFI available. Bring your own towel. You will help with the preparation of breakfast and dinner, lunch will be provided by the local host.

Location: The Ontario Recreation Area is located in Kyselka near Karlovy Vary in the western part of the country. Kyselka means acidulous mineral water which is produced in the village. It is a very popular bottled water sold in the Czech Republic called Mattoni. In Ontario Recreational Centre, there is a central building, wooden cabins, sanitary facilities, a pub, a playground, a fireplace, and a swimming pool. The phone coverage is good. The closest cities are Ostrov and Karlovy Vary, famous for the film festival, where you can find all the services such as ATMs, grocery stores and pharmacies.

Requirements: Bring suitable clothes and shoes for work, a raincoat and a towel. You need to respect the other people accommodated in the Ontario Recreational Area.

Notes: Beware of allergies - dust, pollen etc.

Directions to the meeting point: Directly from the Prague airport, take the Regiojet bus at 13:00 to the Karlovy Vary bus terminal. Then change to bus 421180 at 15:10 in the direction to the Kyselka bus stop where your camp leader will pick you up. Detailed travel information will be provided in the Infosheet.

SDA 103 Rock Summer in Kozolupy

21/08 – 01/09/2023

FEST/MANU

Vols: 12 + 2 team leader

Age: 18+

Requirements/note:

Project: The workcamp is organized in cooperation with the Local Action Group (LAG) Radbuza and the municipality of Kozolupy. LAG Radbuza aims to protect regional values such as well-preserved nature, aesthetic landscape, local culture and healthy environment; and to support citizen initiatives at the local and regional level, including support of small enterprises, housing, education, use of leisure time, etc. The aim of the workcamp is active interaction with the local population and expanding the local population's awareness of the national differences of the individual participants. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: During their work, participants will focus on four areas. The first is the revitalization of a neglected municipality's orchard; the second is the maintenance of public and nursery playgrounds. In the middle of the workcamp (26.8.), participants will help with the preparation of the traditional music festival Rock Summer on Mze and the subsequent cleaning. Lastly, the volunteers will dedicate their working time to landscaping the river island, which is to serve as a relaxation zone for local residents in the future. All work activities will take place within walking distance.

Study part: Having discussions with local people and the members of the Local Action Group, organizing a sports tournament with the local community, an international evening focusing on gastronomy, an excursion to the city of Pilsen and the most important monuments of the area.

Leisure time: A guided tour of Pilsen the possibility of choosing specific places to visit (e.g. Pilsen brewery, Pilsen tower, historical monuments of the city, FC Viktoria Pilsen); trips to nature and the sights of LAG Radbuza (e.g. Chotesov Monastery, the ruins of Buben Castle, the town of Dobrany, the lookout tower Krizovy vrch), swimming in the Hracholusky dam, sports activities in the area of the Kozolupy Cultural Center (football and basketball courts), etc.

Accommodation/Food: In the local cultural centre. You will sleep on the floor in one of the halls of the centre on mats, small pillows and blankets will be provided. Toilets and showers are available in the building. There is wifi and a laundry machine. You will prepare breakfast together as a group in a small improvised kitchen (fridge, electric stove, microwave oven, kettle) from provided ingredients, lunch and dinner will be provided in a local restaurant nearby (you can taste traditional Czech cuisine).

Location: Kozolupy (1,100 inhabitants) in the Pilsen Region. It is located near the Hracholusky Dam and about 10 km from Pilsen. In Kozolupy there is good phone reception, a small shop where you can buy food and hygiene products, a pharmacy and ATM.

Requirements: Bring suitable clothes and shoes for work. Bring your favourite recipes and any special ingredients you might need from your home country.

Notes: We are looking for responsible and passionate volunteers who are eager to get to know the local community.

Directions to meeting point: From the airport take bus 119 to Nadrazi Veleslavin stop. Change to green metro line A in the direction of Depo Hostivar, get off at "Muzeum" and change to red metro line C in direction of Letnany, go 1 stop and get off at "Hlavni Nadrazi" stop (main railway station). From here, take the train EC354 in the direction of Munchen Hbf at 13:43. Get off at Plzen main train station at 14:58. Go to the bus terminal in front of the train station. Take the bus 490722 at 15:20 and get off at Kozolupy at 15:45. Your campleader will be waiting there for you and take you to the accommodation. Detailed travel information will be provided in the infosheet.

SDA 104 Mingle with the locals in Dysina

21/08 – 10/09/2023

MANU/FEST

Vols: 7 + 2 team leaders

Age: 18+

Requirements/note: -

Project: This project is organized in cooperation with the municipality of Dysina located in northwestern Bohemia, near Pilsen. The village has had a long tradition of ironworks and due to this Dysina has lost its village character and has become more industrial. There is a monument to Gen. Patton who liberated the west and southwest of Bohemia at the end of WWII with his army and the community still maintains contact with the descendants of this American general. The goal of the workcamp is to help with the maintenance of the green areas, to organize a traditional beer festival and to prepare a local primary school and a kindergarten for the beginning of the new school year. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: You will help with the maintenance of public places (cutting bushes and grass, raking, landscaping etc.), renovation and maintenance of the local kindergarten and primary school. Project: The workcamp is organised in cooperation with the town of Ceska Kamenice located on the borderline of three protected landscape areas. The nearest one is Bohemian Switzerland National Park just on the outskirts of the town. The city centre consists of a well-preserved urban heritage zone with several cultural monuments. For these reasons, the town is a natural centre of tourism. The workcamp will take place in the nearby valley, where ruins of the former concentration camp of Rabstejn lie. The goals of the workcamp are two: 1) to ensure the rehabilitation of the former Rabstejn concentration camp, and 2) to improve the tourist infrastructure in the entire valley. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of the UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: The work will be carried out in the area of Rabstejn Valley and it will be accessible from the camp on foot. The work will include removing woody plants, digging the soil, cleaning, installing educational signs, and marking and creating hiking trails (e.g. installing wooden stairs). The physical demands will correspond to the capabilities of the individual participants. An employee of the technical services of the town will supervise the work. All the work described above should take place outside. In case of rainy weather; you will work in the roofed building of the former textile factory or in the town

Study part: There will be a meeting with witnesses (displaced Sudeten Germans, some of them lived directly in the Rabstejn concentration camp after the war before they were relocated) and students of the English College of Prague, which will be conducted in the form of lectures and discussions.

Leisure time: You can go on a trip to the surrounding areas. There are three protected landscape areas, Czech Swiss National Park, and several cultural monuments – in Ceska Kamenice and the nearby area. There is also a swimming pool, a sports complex (ball games and outdoor tennis/badminton courts), a water park in Decin, Via Ferrata, a slackline, etc. We can organise a match with the locals. Feel free to bring your musical instruments.

Accommodation/Food: There will be a camp built for the purpose of the workcamp. Accommodation in tents for 2 people, you will need to bring a mat and a warm sleeping bag. Facilities (such as a kitchen or dining room), toilets and will be on the premises of the former textile factory just next to the camp. A shower is outside and the water is heated by the sun. Requirements/note:

Project: The workcamp is organized in cooperation with the association Hojnost (abundance) which sees the future in collaboration and living soil. Therefore, they support organic farming and a dignified and meaningful life in the countryside such as a restoration of the old orchards of the Porta Coeli monastery, a self-sufficient community garden and projects aimed at environmental education. The goal of the workcamp is to help with all those activities and to mingle with the local community. In this workcamp, you are actively contributing toward the achievement of the UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities and UN SDG15 Life on Land.

Work: You will rake, turn and pile hay in the nuns' garden, remove invasive trees in the orchards, try to produce biochar, landscape the monastery garden, maintain the community garden, and sort building stones from the reconstructed parts of the monastery. We would also like to dedicate one day of work to the local community, which we will probably help with the maintenance of the park. The work will be varied and adjusted to the physical abilities of the volunteers and the weather conditions. Part of the team will always be involved in cooking for everyone from provided ingredients - for environmental and ethical reasons, we will cook only vegetarian food. No previous experience is required. Bring suitable clothes and shoes for work that can get dirty or damaged.

Study part: You will have an opportunity to present the culture and cuisine of your country to the local community or children from local schools. You will also go on a guided tour of the Porta Coeli monastery and see parts of the monastery where the public is not allowed. There is also a brewery on the grounds of the monastery, so volunteers can learn about beer production during the excursion. Project: The workcamp is organised in cooperation with the association "Terezín - City of Change", which aims to repair the historical buildings of the Terezin fortress, make them accessible to the public and organize educational and cultural activities. Thanks to its rich history and unique 18th-century monuments, Terezin is on the UNESCO indicative list (waiting list). The aim of the workcamp is to help with the restoration and preservation of the fortress city and learn about the history of the city that goes far beyond the infamous WWII era. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with the association Fara Semnevice („Rectory Semnevice“) in the village of Semnevice. The association strives to build a sustainable community, support regional ecological and educational activities and revitalize the Baroque rectory. According to the association's vision, the rectory should become a place where people of different personalities, cultures, nationalities, and religions can meet and live together. The aim of this workcamp is to renovate the rectory and its surroundings, including the community spirit. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of the UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: You will work on the interior design of the building (grinding window frames, painting, moving material, varnishing) and in the rectory garden (landscaping, renovation of stone walls and fences, chopping wood, mowing, moving soil, taking care of vegetable beds, planting trees and shrubs). Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with the NGO Benediktus which is a community of people with and without disabilities. Benediktus provides social services, a daycare centre, social therapy workshops and sheltered housing, in order to involve people with disabilities in everyday life. Benediktus also creates sheltered jobs for people with altered working abilities such as drying fruits, cultivating a garden, organizing public events, or reconstructing historical buildings. The aim of the workcamp is to help with the preparation and implementation of the largest annual cultural event, the pilgrimage to St. Anna, and to blur the lines between people regardless of their disability status. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG10 Reduced Inequalities.

Work: The meaning of the pilgrimage to St. Anna is to spread the work of Benediktus among people. Volunteers will help to prepare and implement the event. The pilgrimage starts with Holy Mass and includes food and drink stalls, countless games for children, live music, theatre and much more. The work tasks will include mowing and raking grass, carrying things, setting up tents, tables and benches, cleaning, cooking, baking, frying, accompanying people with disabilities at work and in their free time, attending community meetings, selling products, making banners or doing face painting. The work will not be physically demanding and does not require any previous experience. Most of the work will be carried out outside, please, bring adequate boots and clothes that can get dirty and a raincoat.

Study part: As part of the pilgrimage, there will be a meeting with the general public and the volunteers will have the opportunity to present their culture, either in the form of theatre, fun games for children or making typical food. Other Czech and foreign volunteers also take part in the pilgrimage, with whom there will be an opportunity not only to work but also to spend free time together. During the workcamp, volunteers have a unique opportunity to learn about the life and work of people with and without disabilities in the L'Arche community.

Leisure time: Modletin is located in the heart of the protected landscape area of the Iron Mountains that offers a wide range of activities: hiking, swimming in a nearby dam, mushroom picking, sightseeing in the area (castles, chateaux, historic villages, geomorphological formations, natural monuments), cultural events (concerts, exhibitions, openings). In the area of Benediktus it is also possible to play sports.

Accommodation/Food: Accommodation for volunteers is located in the Benediktus complex in Modletin in the building of the former spa. It is a large attic room with a shower, two toilets and a kitchen. You will sleep on mattresses with sheets but bring your own sleeping bag. There is WIFI and a washing machine. Food will be provided by Benediktus (breakfast, lunch, dinner, snacks and good coffee). By prior arrangement, volunteers can also cook for themselves in the kitchen in their accommodation. We welcome volunteers who want to participate in the preparation of Czech dishes or cook dishes from their countries.

Location: The Benediktus community is located in the picturesque village of Modletin, between the villages of Horní Bradlo and Rusínov, in the heart of the Iron Mountains. The complex has a timbered fruit dryer, orchard and vegetable garden. Everywhere in the village, there is good phone coverage, nevertheless, the village is small so there are no services such as ATMs or pharmacies.

Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with the Local Action Group Mezi Hradý ("Between Castles") that strives to improve the quality of the environment in the 20 cities between the famous castles Karlstejn, Krivoklat and Tocník in Central Bohemia. Mezi Hradý unites schools, associations, entrepreneurs, firefighters, farmers, church representatives and citizens. The aim of the workcamp is to help to prepare and implement an experiential program full of games and activities for the children's English camp (21.-25.8.). At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of the UN SDG4 Quality Education.

Work: Volunteers will prepare and implement an experiential program full of games and activities for the children's camp which will be held from Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., from August 21-25, 2023. The camp is organized by Hyskov Municipal Office and intended for children aged 7-14 with a maximum capacity of 15 children. Project: This project is organised in cooperation with the NGO Free Farm in Ceske Kopisty, which is part of the Camphill Community movement. It is a family-like community that welcomes people with and without disabilities and creates a pleasant environment for everyone to live and work together. Vegetables, herbs, and fruits are grown and processed organically. Free Farm aims to raise awareness of biodynamic farming and the role of a farmer nowadays. The goal of the workcamp is to connect people from different countries and experience the operation of a Czech organic farm, develop a tolerant open society and acquire a responsible approach to the world. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG2 Zero Hunger and UN SDG10 Reduced Inequalities.

Work: Your work will mainly consist of manual farm work of all kinds. These include weeding, planting, hoeing, harvesting, watering, cleaning and storing vegetables, etc. In addition to vegetables, there are medical herbs grown, which you can also help to collect and process. You might also do gardening work and help out with the maintenance of the farm and its premises. You will mostly work outside in the farm area or on the fields which are located within walking distance (500m) from the farm. Bring suitable work clothes and shoes, a hat, and a raincoat to protect yourself from the sun and rain. Working on a farm can be physically demanding, please be prepared for that, nevertheless, it can be done with a collective effort and a positive attitude.

Study part: Talking about organic farming and Camphill community movement, guided excursion around the farm.

Leisure time: There is a football pitch in the village and after the game, you can refresh by swimming in the river. You might visit the nearby Terezin Memorial at the location of the former concentration camp and the Terezin Ghetto Museum. You can also go on trips to the nature-protected area of Ceske Stredohori and/or visit the historical cities of Litomerice, Usti nad Labem where there is a cinema and a ZOO. We will also have a barbecue with the members of the community.

Accommodation/Food: Accommodation is provided directly at the farm. You will sleep in the attic on mattresses in a renovated historic farmhouse. Bring your own sleeping bag! There are two showers with hot water, two toilets, a common room, and a kitchen available. There is WIFI and a washing machine. You will prepare breakfast and dinner together as a group. Lunch will be prepared by the members of the community, you will eat all together with the community. The local project partner will provide ingredients, including local organic vegetables. Meals will be mostly vegetarian.

Location: Ceske Kopisty – a small village near the historical town of Litomerice. The farm uses 11 hectares of fields; there is a garden and a yard with a couple of animals (a cow, a horse, chickens, ducks, and pigs). The area is quite vast – there are 3 residential houses, a candle workshop, and a common hall. There are 8 adults, 4 children and 7 people with special needs living there. You might meet around 10 other external co-workers. Everywhere in the village is good phone reception. There is an ATM 3 km away in Terezín, and a pharmacy 5 km away in Litoměřice.

Requirements: As you will stay in a place where people with various disabilities live you must respect the privacy and night rest of the residents. Be aware that not all members of the community can speak English. Please, bring a sleeping bag, enthusiasm and a good mood!

Notes: The workcamp is mainly suitable for people who are interested in farming and community life and don't mind working from early hours.

Directions to the meeting point: From Prague airport, take bus 119 to “Nadrazi Veleslavin” station. Change to green metro line A in the direction of Depo Hostivar. Project: This workcamp is organised in cooperation with the environmental centre PROUD which provides environmental education courses for school groups on their educational farm. PROUD courses offer an alternative to the teaching of science, ecology and social science disciplines at schools in the region. The emphasis is on direct contact with the environment and experiential pedagogy. The goal of the workcamp is to improve the environment of the widely used teaching farm area, to ensure its daily operation and to enable families to have direct contact with the animals on a daily basis. At this workcamp, you are actively contributing to the achievement of the UN SDG15 of Life on Land and UN SDG11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: Volunteers will be involved in the operation of the farm (preparing food and feeding the animals or cleaning pens), and garden work (watering, weeding, harvesting fruit and vegetables, cutting grass, and raking). This work is also suitable for children. Adult volunteers might be occasionally involved in making minor repairs, chopping wood or pruning bushes. No previous experience with a similar type of work is required. The work will take place mainly outdoors, on the educational farm approx. 500 m from the accommodation. Bring suitable clothes and boots that can get dirty and a raincoat.

Study part: PROUD is equipped with a lot of tools for educational and scientific activities which participants can try such as catching aquatic or terrestrial invertebrates, microscopy, etc.

Leisure time: Volunteers might go on a trip to the ruins of Rabi Castle with a guided tour and, if the water conditions of the Otava River permit, a rafting trip down the river. We can go on a town tour with a cryptographic game, on a trip to the ruins of Prachen, swim in the Otava river, go to an aquapark, make handicraft activities, and play board games or sports. During the workcamp there will be an international evening, where you can present specialities from your country or games for children.

Accommodation/Food: You will be accommodated in a renovated building of a former mill. There are rooms for 6-10 people with shared bathrooms and a fully equipped kitchen. Project: The workcamp is organized in cooperation with the local NGO Cmelak - Friends of Nature Society whose activities focus on a sustainable lifestyle, nature protection, and environmental education. An example of such activities can be the replacement of unnatural spruce tree monoculture with seedlings of original trees or maintaining wetlands and meadows. The aim of this workcamp is to involve volunteers in activities in the New Forest on Jested mountain and Jablonne wetland park and introduce volunteers to a way of life outside the comforts of civilization at one of our mountain cottages. At this workcamp, you are actively contributing to the achievement of UN SDG15 Life on Land.

Work: Work includes repairing forest fencing for seedlings, raking hay, pulling weeds, preparing firewood, picking up trash in the backcountry, etc. The specific work schedule will be determined depending on weather conditions. You have the opportunity to discover different places in the region during your work. Most of the work will be done outside in the forest and in the wetlands. Bring suitable clothes and boots that can get dirty or damaged, including waterproof clothes with long sleeves, long trousers, and a raincoat. No previous experience is required, you will be trained on how to use the tools on spot.

Study part: Interactive field excursions are planned for the volunteers to get to know the locations where they will work and understand why their work is needed and beneficial.

Leisure time: You can play sports, go on hikes to the natural areas, climb the Jested Mountain - the highest peak in the region, or visit nearby castles. Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with the Association for the Jizera Mountains operating in the Jizera Mountains since 1999. The association runs an eco-centre in the middle of the forest where they plant trees, restore tourist infrastructure and offer educational programs drawing children and adults into the adventure of exploring nature. Currently, they are setting up a new eco-centre in Hrabetice, part of the village of Janov nad Nisou. The aim of the workcamp is to expand the forest playground that is used by school groups and create a pool for retaining water in the landscape and modify the natural character. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG15 Life on Land.

Work: Volunteers will have two main tasks. 1. Expansion of the forest playground - construction of obstacles, and creation of a forest path. 2. Work: The work will include: taking care of the forest (cleaning of brushwood after logging, repairing fences against animals' gnawing, peeling of tree bark after bark beetle infestation), maintaining the meadows (raking, removal of invasive trees and plants, mowing with a scythe, breaking up the turf, making turf after wild pigs, collecting stones), collection and cleaning of garbage, disposal of illegal dumps, cleaning of gutters, etc. Most of the work will be outdoors, bring a long-sleeved T-Shirt and full-length trousers, boots and a raincoat. No previous experience is required. Transport to the places of work will be provided by KRNAP Administration vehicles.

Study part: Science excursions, lectures and workshops on environmental education and nature protection, management in the natural park and organization of an international evening.

Leisure time: There are many possibilities for trips such as trips in the Krkonose Mountains (Snezka, Labska Bouda, Pancavsky waterfall), a treetop trail in the Krkonose Mountains, a trip to the ZOO in Dvur Kralove nad Labem, Trutnov swimming pool, games and discussions with environmental topics, visits to Krkonose museums, learning about traditional Krkonose crafts, a visit to the KRNAP environmental centre etc.

Accommodation/Food: You will stay in a mountain cottage Stare Polesi in Horni Mala Upa. You will sleep in rooms for 2-6 people on beds, blankets and sheets will be provided. There are bathrooms and a kitchen. There is no washing machine. WiFi is available. You will prepare your own meals together as a group.

Location: The workcamp will take place in Horni Mala Upa and its surroundings. Since the area is mainly used for recreation and is located close to the border with Poland, there are not many services in comparison with the cities. There are several restaurants, an information centre, a post office, and an ATM, but there is no grocery store, the nearest pharmacy is in Svoboda nad Upou (18 km) and a hospital is in Trutnov (28 km). Notes: You will spend a lot of time outdoors so you can get into contact with different kinds of plants, herbs, pollen, and insects (risk for people with allergies). The workcamp is suitable for everyone interested in the environment and its protection.

Requirements/Note:

Project: This workcamp is organised in cooperation with the Association for Development 3K which aims to develop three areas: 1. Education through promoting the knowledge and skills needed for the harmonious development of man, humanity and the planet in the third millennium. 2. Language skills, international understanding, and local cooperation. 3. Permaculture and circular relationships. The aim of the workcamp is to prepare the orchard for autumn planting according to the rules of permaculture to increase the long-term resistance of crops and support local biodiversity. Volunteers will also learn how to increase food self-sufficiency and reuse local materials. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG15 Life on Land.

Work: The work will be mainly manual and outdoor - digging holes for trees, mulching the surrounding soil with organic material, shredding branches, retaining water in the landscape, collecting waste in the forest and in the village, drying hay, building bird boxes, preparing for the construction of an apiary, planting honey plants,

preparing compost. Work will be carried out in all weather conditions. Please, bring appropriate shoes and clothes that can get dirty or damaged and a raincoat.

Study part: We will go on a trip to Kutna Hora, a UNESCO city with silver mining history. It is possible to organize a trip to Prague, to the Sazava Monastery, to Cesky Sternberk Castle or the open-air museum in Kourim. We will organize two evenings with international cuisine, and learn to sing songs in other languages. We will discuss the rules of permaculture, mulching, how compost works, water retention in the landscape or fighting "pests" in a permaculture orchard.

Leisure time: We can play sports such as football, petanque, outdoor exercise (yoga), jogging, volleyball, badminton or ping-pong. It is possible to rent a canoe/raft or bike in a nearby town. In the evenings we can watch movies, make a campfire, and sing. There will also be time to organise hiking trips.

Accommodation/Food: You will be accommodated in a spacious, newly renovated attic where there is one room for 4 people with a bathroom and two larger open spaces with another bathroom. WIFI is available. You can use a washing machine in the accommodation. Water is heated by the sun. Bring a sleeping bag, a mat, slippers, and a water bottle. Volunteers will cook their own meals from provided ingredients and vegetables grown in the garden (the diet would be mostly vegetarian) in a fully equipped kitchen.

Location: Ujezdec is a very small village southeast of Prague with only 62 inhabitants. The village and its surroundings are agricultural, surrounded by extensive monoculture fields. On the other hand, an oasis of biodiversity, food self-sufficiency and abundance according to the rules of permaculture is gradually emerging on the property next to the house where you will work. Phone coverage is good. The closest bigger city is Sazava, where you can find ATMs, pharmacies and other services.

Requirements: Workcamp is suitable especially for those who like nature, spend their free time outdoors, have a positive attitude to work, don't mind a bit of discomfort and walking, and appreciate the silence at night and the early chirping of birds. Beware of possible allergies to hay or outdoor cats. Smoking is only possible outdoors with caution due to fire. We are generally not fans of alcohol. The language of communication will be English, but we are not at all opposed to French either.

Notes: Please keep in mind that the work will be outdoors and manual. Bring your favourite recipes, ideally simple or typical for your country.

Requirements/note:

Project: This project is organised in cooperation with the NGO Free Farm in Ceske Kopisty, which is part of the Camphill Community movement. It is a family-like community that welcomes people with and without disabilities and creates a pleasant environment for everyone to live and work together. Vegetables, herbs, and fruits are grown and processed organically. Free Farm aims to raise awareness of biodynamic farming and the role of a farmer nowadays. The goal of the workcamp is to connect people from different countries and experience the operation of a Czech organic farm, develop a tolerant open society and acquire a responsible approach to the world. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG2 Zero Hunger and UN SDG10 Reduced Inequalities.

Work: Your work will mainly consist of manual farm work of all kinds. These include weeding, planting, hoeing, harvesting, watering, cleaning and storing vegetables, etc. In addition to vegetables, there are medical herbs grown, which you can also help to collect and process. You might also do gardening work and help out with the maintenance of the farm and its premises. You will mostly work outside in the farm area or on the fields which are located within walking distance (500m) from the farm. Bring suitable work clothes and shoes, a hat, and a raincoat to protect yourself from the sun and rain. Working on a farm can be physically demanding, please be prepared for that, nevertheless, it can be done with a collective effort and a positive attitude.

Study part: You will learn about the Camphill movement and life on an organic farm.

Leisure time: There is a football pitch in the village after that, you can refresh in the local pub or swim in the river. You might visit the nearby Terezin Memorial at the location of the former concentration camp and the Terezin Ghetto Museum.

Accommodation/Food: Accommodation is provided directly at the farm. You will sleep in the attic on mattresses in a renovated historic farmhouse. Bring your own sleeping bag! There are two showers with hot water, two toilets, a common room, and a kitchen available. There is WIFI and a washing machine. You will prepare breakfast and dinner together as a group. Lunch will be prepared by the members of the community, you will eat all together with the community. The local project partner will provide ingredients, including local organic vegetables. Meals will be mostly vegetarian.

Location: Ceske Kopisty – a small village near the historical town of Litomerice. The farm uses 11 hectares of fields; there is a garden and a yard with a couple of animals (a cow, a horse, chickens, ducks, and pigs). The area is quite vast – there are 3 residential houses, a candle workshop, and a common hall. There are 8 adults, 4 children and 7 people with special needs living there. You might meet around 10 other external co-workers. Everywhere in the village, there is good phone reception. There is an ATM 3 km away in Terezin, and a pharmacy 5 km away in Litomerice.

Requirement: As you will stay in the place where people with various disabilities live, there are specific rules you are asked to respect: smoking and consumption of alcohol within the community area are restricted, and it is necessary to respect the privacy and night rest of the residents. Be aware that not all members of the community can speak English. Please, bring a sleeping bag, enthusiasm and a good mood!

Notes: The workcamp is mainly suitable for people who are interested in farming and community life and don't mind working from early hours.

Directions to the meeting point: From Prague airport, take bus 119 to "Nadrazi Veleslavin" station. Change to green metro line A in the direction of Depo Hostivar. At the "Muzeum" stop, change to red metro line C in the

The activities take place in a reconstructed barn with a beautiful garden in Jizbice and at the headquarters of the organization in Nymburk. Project: This ESC project is organised in cooperation with the NGO Free Farm in Ceske Kopisty, which is part of the Camphill Community movement. It is a family-like community that welcomes people with and without disabilities and creates a pleasant environment for everyone to live and work together. Vegetables, herbs, and fruits are grown and processed organically. Free Farm aims to raise awareness of biodynamic farming and the role of a farmer nowadays. The goal of the workcamp is to connect people from different countries and experience the operation of a Czech organic farm, develop a tolerant open society and acquire a responsible approach to the world. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG2 Zero Hunger and UN SDG10 Reduced Inequalities.

Work: Your work will mainly consist of manual farm work of all kinds. You might meet around 10 other external co-workers. Everywhere in the village is good phone reception. There is an ATM 3 km away in Terezin, and a pharmacy 5 km away in Litomerice.

Requirement: Smoking and consumption of alcohol within the community area are restricted, and it is necessary to respect the privacy and night rest of the residents. Be aware that not all members of the community can speak English. Please, bring a sleeping bag, enthusiasm and a good mood!

Notes: The workcamp is mainly suitable for people who are interested in farming and community life and don't mind working from early hours.

Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with the association Tvrz Veseli („Fortress Veseli“) in the small village of Veseli nad Uhlavou near the Sumava National Park. Veseli Castle was built on the site of an older fortress in the second half of the 19th century, and previous regimes left the castle in very poor condition. The mission of the association is to renovate the castle to its original form and reopen its gates to the public again - mainly for cultural and educational purposes. The goal of this workcamp is to maintain and restore the castle park, build a fence, repair a stone wall and clean the cellar of the castle. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG 11 Sustainable Cities and Communities.

Work: Work tasks are divided into three parts including the construction of a wire fence (hammering, screwing, and stretching of the wire mesh), work in the castle park (mowing and raking grass, removing wood, and trimming small branches, taking care of flowers) as well as cleaning up work in the castle clearing debris in the castle cellar or repair of the stone wall. Project: This workcamp is organized in cooperation with Nova Lhota, a small Moravian village located in the White Carpathian Mountains on the Slovak border. The village runs an eco-centre and is very active in environmental activities and education. In the village, herbal tea blends from local types of herbs are produced. The workcamp aims to involve volunteers in collecting herbs and fruits, getting to know the local culture and nature, and maintaining the public spaces, greenery and valuable flowery meadows. At this workcamp, you will actively contribute to the achievement of UN SDG2 Zero Hunger and UN SDG10 Reduced Inequalities.

Work: Your work will mainly consist of manual farm work of all kinds. These include weeding, planting, hoeing, harvesting, watering, cleaning and storing vegetables, etc. In addition to vegetables, there are medical herbs grown, which you can also help to collect and process. You might also do gardening work and help out with the maintenance of the farm and its premises. You will mostly work outside in the farm area or on the fields which are located within walking distance (500m) from the farm. Bring suitable work clothes and shoes, a hat, and a raincoat to protect yourself from the sun and rain. Working on a farm can be physically demanding, please be prepared for that, nevertheless, it can be done with a collective effort and a positive attitude.

Study part: You will learn about the Camphill movement, Rudolf Steiner's anthroposophy theory, living in a community, and biodynamic agriculture. Together you will talk about Czech, European and each other's cultures and various related topics. There is also the possibility to organise workshops focused on eurhythm and intuitive pedagogy. The volunteers are encouraged to organise an international evening for community members on their own initiative and present their national cuisine and culture. Bring your favourite recipes and some specific ingredients if needed.

Leisure time: There is a football pitch in the village, and after that, you can refresh in the local pub or swim in the river. You might visit the nearby Terezin Memorial at the location of the former concentration camp and the Terezin Ghetto Museum. You can also go on trips to the nature-protected area of Ceske Stredohori and/or visit the historical cities of Litomerice, Usti nad Labem. We will also have a barbecue with the members of the community.

Accommodation/Food: Accommodation is provided directly at the farm. You will sleep in the attic on mattresses in a renovated historic farmhouse. Bring your own sleeping bag! There are two showers with hot water, two toilets, a common room, and a kitchen available. There is WIFI and a washing machine. You will prepare breakfast and dinner together as a group. Lunch will be prepared by the members of the community, you will eat all together with the community. The local project partner will provide ingredients, including local organic vegetables. Meals will be mostly vegetarian.

Location: Ceske Kopisty – a small village near the historical town of Litomerice. The farm uses 11 hectares of fields; there is a garden and a yard with a couple of animals (a cow, a horse, chickens, ducks, and pigs). The area is quite vast – there are 3 residential houses, a candle workshop, and a common hall. There are 8 adults, 4 children and 7 people with special needs living there. You might meet around 10 other external co-workers. Everywhere in the village there is good phone reception. There is an ATM 3 km away in Terezín, and a pharmacy 5 km away in Litomerice.

Requirements: Smoking and consumption of alcohol within the community area are restricted, and it is necessary to respect the privacy and night rest of the residents. Be aware that not all members of the community can speak English. Please, bring a sleeping bag, enthusiasm and a good mood!

Notes: The workcamp is mainly suitable for people who are interested in farming and community life and don't mind working from early hours.

Directions to the meeting point: From Prague airport, take bus 119 to "Nadrazi Veleslavin" station. Change to green metro line A in the direction of Depo Hostivar. Here, take a bus from platform 7 at 16:00 to your final destination "Terezin, U Pamatniku". The campleader will be waiting for you there at 17:00 and take you to the accommodation.
