Partner/project host/ project overview

This project will be hosted by the Lutheran Parish in Rongai which is intending to address provide early childhood accessibility to all children in the community. Distance travelled to school every day by pupil has substantial adverse effects on attendance at school. Younger children at the age of 4-6 are often the most vulnerable to access early childhood educational centers. Walking several kilometers every day is more strenuous for a small child than a teenager. Schools are located further from children's homes. These factors among many others create significant barriers preventing millions of the world's younger children from attending school. This project is aiming to renovate old church building into day care center where young children from the community can access early childhood education. It is also aiming to provide extracurricular activities for students after school hours.

Description of work

Volunteers will engage in assisting various tasks that includes: Renovation: This will include manual work (Making new floor, partitioning rooms, painting and cement mixing); Children games (children's Indoor and outdoor games that will stimulate learning, team building and activeness. Local games will be introduced as well foreign ones from the volunteers. Please bring new games to share with Kids); Nature activities (Bird watching, plant a tree, Tree feeder, learning about various plants, birds, animals, worms, and insects available in the area); and academic development activities (After school hour home works, various competitions aiming to motivate children's academic development).

Food & accommodation

Accommodation will be at a community residential house. It is a basic accommodation where you should expect to use water, toilet and have bath. Mattresses will be provided in shared rooms. Volunteers are expected to help in meals preparation and cleaning. Vegetarian meals will be available for the entire period of the project.



Location & leisure activities

Kamwanga is an area of Longido District, Arusha Northern Tanzania. Located about 112km from Moshi town. The community is accessible via public transport starting from Moshi main bus terminal to Tarakea and then change to Kamwanga via Lolarash. Indigenous inhabitants are Masai tribe, however due to the economic activities happening in the North Kilimanjaro Forest there is good mixture of people from various parts of the country. The community shares boarder with Kenya as well the Kilimanjaro Forest. If you are coming from Kilimanjaro Airport (About 43km) you will need to take shuttle to Moshi town. Possibilities and options for leisure activities are: - Wild-life safari: Ngorongoro Crater, Lake Manyara, Serengeti and Tarangire National parks. Volunteers will join series of activities that will include: - **Community economic Life (I do what they do):** Participation in the daily of the community members. This will include working in a small businesses, farming, hand craft, Arts, taking care of animals and other daily economic



activities of the community members; ***Social-Cultural life:*** Participate in various social aspects of community life including traditional medicine and health care (Learning and experience), Rituals: Visiting ritual sites, learning and understanding, Ceremonies: Participating in wedding, initiation and other traditional and religious ceremonies available during that time. ***Language exchange:*** This will include; Kiswahili Language (1-2 Hours every day), Optional foreign Language teaching Class (1 hour per day preferably English or French); ***Knowledge exchange:*** Knowledge exchange will include Inter-generational exchange: age groups knowledge and experience sharing events, Images of my (Self, Culture, Country etc.) Vs Others, Community Exhibitions: Sharing various arts, music food etc.

Climate change is one of the most general threats to peace and security worldwide at the least at this moment. However, it has been obvious that not many people would list this as a key factor in international relations and domestic welfare. Climate change touches all areas of security, peace building, and sustainable development. The impacts of climate change are already adversely affecting vulnerable communities, as well as stretching the capacities of societies and Governments. Climate change is a 'threat multiplier', i.e. something that interacts with existing pressures (such as social conflict, economic inequality, large-scale migration, or competition for resources) and further compounds these issues—increasing the likelihood of instability or violent conflict. This project is organized in cooperation with Mafia Local Youth center to increase awareness on the impact of climate change in peace and sustainable development.

Description of work

Volunteers will be engaged with establishment and management of tree nursery at the Youth center to increase supply of various trees species needed for conservation in the Island; Planting trees in various open and public areas in the Island; Environmental cleaning and waste management in the public areas and sea show (Beach) including provision of garbage separation



demonstrations; and Climate change education and awareness through workshops and other creative means including sports, arts, music and exhibitions.

Some studies have proved that, Children spends more time in School than home during the week. In this regard, the physical environment of school buildings and school grounds is therefore a key factor in the overall health and safety for pupils, teach, non-teaching staff, and visitors. School buildings and grounds are expected to be designed and maintained to be free of health and safety hazards, and to promote learning. Friendly environment for Children will increase their performance hence contribute to their future. This project is therefore complementing the efforts of the host community in improvement of learning facilities hence support children's future. The host of this project is Mbahe/Ng'aroni Primary Schools in Marangu.

Description of work

Volunteers will be engaged will assist in renovation and painting of school classrooms; drawing symbols/letters that will simplify reading and learning for early childhood education classes; establishment of garbage disposal sites including trash bins in the classes and provide education on how to separate and dispose garbage; organizing extra-curricular activities to the kids and teenagers (7-17 years old) after school hours. This could be sports, games, English Language, arts, crafts and remedial classes.

Partner/ Host / project overview

Mangrove trees that are expected to stretch along coastal lines are important as animal habitats and natural seawalls. However, despite this reality Mangrove Forest are among the most



threatened habitats in various countries. These trees may be disappearing quickly than other inland forests than expected. Experts are informing us that, the outcome of disappearing of mangrove will result to fisheries declines, Threats to migratory bird species, degradation of clean water supplies, Erosion and land subsidence. Sea forest: Sea wall project is an initiative that aiming contribute to conservation of coastal environment to ensure sustainability of Islands. This project is hosted by a community-based organization ZAVECO an environmental based working to preserve coastal environmental.

Description of work

Volunteers will assist in picking and collection of mangrove seedling from the forest; replanting mangroves in the open/ destructed areas; collecting non composting materials/garbage in the forest and sea show; Environmental education and awareness; Educational visit to various organizations working on environmental conservation.

SECTION IV: WORKCAMP PARTICIPATION CONDITIONS 2025

- a) **Application:** Applications will be received only through sponsoring sending organization (s) in the country of volunteers' residency or citizenship at least three weeks minimum before the project start. Confirmation will base on the availability of the placements and fulfilled of requested conditions.
- b) **Duration of the Project:** Minimum duration to participate in the workcamp project is seven days and maximum two weeks. This means, a volunteer with no enough time to join the whole period can participate partially at least seven days.
- c) **Arrival and departure in the projects:** Arrival/Starting and ending dates of the projects are indicated in project's description. Our schedule are flexible and we will respect you convenience arrival and departure time, however this need to be communicated before the project start.
- d) **Age limits:** The minimum age to participate in Work-camps projects is 16 years old with no age limit. Younger volunteers can participate provided that they are accompanied by their parents or an authorized guardian.
- e) **Family, group, Senior, couple and disabled volunteers:** Families, groups, couples, seniors and volunteers with disabilities, are encouraged to apply and join Work-camps projects. However, they should contact UVIKIUTA in advance through their sponsoring organizations to allow preparation of appropriate environments that fit their special needs.

- h) **Extra Fee 2025:** Each project has different amount of extra fee based on their length, nature etc. Please have a look on the fees indicated in each project. Extra fee is a non-refundable contribution by each individual volunteer to support the operations of the program. Extra fee is to paid on arrival in **local currency**.
- i) **Explanation about extra fees:** Extra fee does not cover the cost of medical/health services, all types of insurances, visas or any other Government charges if any, pocket money, transport cost, meals on transit and other personal expenses.
