







ABOUT US...

COCAT is a Catalan non-governmental organization and non-profit coordinating platform created to represent Catalonia's international organizations.

COCAT is a link between the international and the national (local) levels of voluntary movement. Our work camps are simulations of real-world volunteering experiences at the local and global levels.

Every year, more than 500 young Catalans carry out volunteer projects abroad and more than 200 young people from all over the world participate in the international work camps that are carried out in Catalonia and organized by Catalan youth associations.

COCAT is a member of three international networks promoting International Voluntary Service: ALLIANCE, CCIVS, and FOCIR Thanks to this membership COCAT can work with partner organizations from different countries.



<u>ALLIANCE</u> is a European Voluntary Service organization that for 30 years has been promoting volunteering among youngsters in Europe. It has 50 members from 30 countries in Europe, America and Asia.

CCIVS is an International Voluntary Service platform made up of organizations from all over the world. CCIVS has been coordinating the IVS for more than 75 years and consists of 80 organizations nowadays. CCIVS bases all its actions on human rights principles and mutual cooperation, participation, respect and non-discrimination.


This area of the Catalan government is involved in the development of workcamps held in Catalonia. It offers financial support to the organizations.



Each hosting organization provides third-party liability insurance.




Camps will fully cover the accommodation and food, but please note that these will be basic conditions.

All our work camps will be implemented in small towns and villages of Catalonia. It is a good chance for volunteers to know more about our country, see its picturesque landscapes and learn about its traditions. Catalonia is situated in the North East of the Iberian Peninsula. It has a territory of 32.108 km2 and close to 8 million inhabitants.

Catalonia is a European Mediterranean country with a strong personality and is very motivated to enhance its customs and traditions. The Catalan landscape is very varied: Pyrenean Mountains contrast strongly with coastal regions, and the desert landscape is mixed with the most beautiful Mediterranean ones.

The historical invasions and political conquests gave Catalonia the awareness to open its door to intercultural dialogue and to live together with the old tradition of the Catalan community and values.

The current administrative structure of Catalonia, after 40 years of dictatorship and denial of its language and traditions, was defined basically by the Statute of Autonomy (1979, revised in 2006) and by the political institutions of the "Generalitat de Catalunya" (Catalan Autonomous Government).



PARLES CATALÀ?

The language of the country is Catalan, one of the groups of languages neo-latin western together with Spanish, Portuguese, French, Italian and Romanian. However, everyone learns Spanish and English at school so there is no problem for non-Catalan-speaking visitors. Catalan culture is a ten million people community, living in France, Spain, Andorra and Italy (l'Alguer). Catalan is a living language studied at schools, colleges and universities. It's used television radio. and on newspapers and most importantly, in everyday life of each person.

Work camps in a nutshell

Work camps are one of the most popular formats of volunteer projects where you collaborate with an entity together with a small group of people from all over the globe during 15-20 days.

This year we propose 7 work camps for adults and 1 for teenagers (14-17 y.o) WITHOUT EXTRA FEE.

There are work camps dedicated to a large variety of topics:



<u>Archeological</u> - for those who are passionate about history and want to do their bit to discover ancient mysteries.



<u>Cultural or heritage</u> camps which are created for those who are interested in digging deep into the Catalan culture and being completely immersed into it during the whole camp.



We are offering <u>environmental</u> camps which can help you disconnect from reality and entirely connect with nature. During these camps you will be taught how to preserve the ecology and take care of the planet.



Other formats



ESC volunteering teams is another format of volunteering projects for young people, who want to participate in a solidarity activity on different topics. Usually the project lasts for 2 weeks and covers the expenses for tickets, food and accommodation, as well as provides a volunteer with pocket money.



Group projects are created for those who want to participate in a voluntary activity with a group of people, who share similar motivation and have the same goal to make this world a better place to live. The organization offers a group several accommodation and meals options for any budget. The price of the project as well depends on the number of participants in the group.

Pocket money: 6 euros/day




