## ABOUT ECUADOR

Ecuador is situated along the north west coast of South America, and it borders the countries of Peru and Columbia. Ecuador's capital is Quito which is less than 15 miles from the equator. The Galapagos Islands are considered a province of Ecuador. The islands are located in the Pacific Ocean, approximately 600 miles off the Ecuadorian coast. Ecuador is divided into 24 provinces. Its three largest cities are Guayaquil, Quito, and Cuenca. The national currency is the US dollar. With the Andes Mountains and the Galapagos Islands, Ecuador is one of the top tourist destinations in South America. Tourists from the United States and most parts of Europe and Asia can visit without needing a visa for up to 90 days.

Ecuador's main international airports are located in the cities of Quito (Mariscal Sucre Airport-UIO), Guayaquil (Simón Bolívar Airport- GYE) , and Manta (Eloy Alfaro Airport-MEC). In the [Galapagos](#), the main airport is located on the island of Baltra. Ecuador has regional airports in Cuenca, Ibarra and other destinations. LAN Airlines is the primary international air carrier, with domestic flight service available from three local airlines including TAME. Ecuador is served by approximately 20 international air carriers including Delta, American, Continental, United, British Airways, Air France, KLM and Lufthansa. Direct flights are available between Miami and Quito with a total flight time of about 4 hours and 15 minutes, with a travel time of approximately 17 hours from London to Quito. Getting to Ecuador by cruise ship is another travel option. Princess, Carnival and Norwegian Cruise Lines all offer itineraries with stops at Manta and the Galapagos.

Ecuador is one of the world's most environmentally diverse places and its many destinations offer travelers a range of attractions to explore. A unique landscape awaits visitors as Ecuador hosts warm sunny beaches of the Pacific to impressive mountain villages in the Andes to the Amazon rain forest, to the world's ecological wonder – the Galapagos Islands. The Ecuadorian Andes offer outdoor activities such as hiking, kayaking, and mountain biking, making it ideally suited for the outdoor sports enthusiast and one of the most popular tourist destinations in South America. With its rain forest, the Ecuadorian Amazon is home to thousands of distinct animal species such as eight-pound toads as well as some of world's most exotic food stuffs. Due to the country's proximity to the equator and its diverse geography, Ecuador is an adventure traveler's dream vacation. Where else on earth can you see first-hand prehistoric creatures roaming their indigenous habitats, see giant marine tortoises and marine iguanas, trek alongside active volcanoes, immerse yourself in the ancient culture of the Inca civilization, visit a world capital city standing only 15 miles from the Equator and situated at 2850 meters (9,000 feet) with over a million inhabitants! Other must-see attractions include Ecuador's protected areas – its national parks and reserves included.

The Galápagos Islands, 596 miles (960 kilometers) west of the mainland of Ecuador are part of Ecuador and are home to unique reptiles, birds, and plants. The Costa, or coastal plain region is where many of the world's bananas are grown. The Sierra is also made up of farmland. The Oriente is east of the Andes and is rich in oil.

Ecuador is considered one of the most diverse areas of the world. There are some 25,000 plant species, and over 1,600 known bird species. The search for oil has caused environmental devastation due to oil leaks and destruction of forests.

Ecuador has nine national parks, including the Galápagos Islands. These 18 islands are home to some of the most amazing creatures, including the [Galápagos tortoise](#), Galápagos penguin, blue-footed booby, and iguanas. This is where Charles Darwin noticed the diversity of species and began to study evolution.

## GENERAL PRACTICAL INFORMATION

### VISA ISSUES

the majority of nationalities can stay in Ecuador for 90 days with no visa, the foreigners who arrive through the international airport, the official stamps they receive on their passports, means a legal stay of 90 days, after this time

the foreigner need to ask an extension of a tourist visa, it is possible to ask an extension just for once.

We ask a volunteer visa when the volunteers let us know their decision with at least 3 months in advance, because we need time to prepare their documents, and they need more than 1 month to get the documents they need to process in their countries and the Ecuadorian Consulate need at least 1 month to give the appointments to issue the visa.

In case you decide to make a volunteer experience longer than 12 weeks please let us know with three months in advance, in order to send the documents, you need from our side and you'll also need to process of your personal documents according to the requisites.

**Introduction Seminar:** For those who make an MTV or LTV there will be an orientation seminar for two days, including a visit to the old city in Quito, the accommodation during these two days will be in the house of the Fundación Proyecto Ecológico Chiriboga in Quito, three meals will be provided.

All our programs ask for a fee, due to FUNPROCH solely depends on volunteer contributions to support its activities, this fee is informed in the information of every program.

## MEDIUM AND LONG TERM PROGRAMS

### FUNPROCH SELVA Y VIDA STV- MLTV 01/23

**Code to apply: ENVISMFPECH**

Project located in Canton Taisha- Province of Morona Santiago in the Amazon region of Ecuador, the project is part of the Forest Kutukú- Shaimi the protected land which belong to the Shuar nationality.

#### PROJECT DETAILS

Selva y Vida is a permanent program who works from January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year, it was created by FUNPROCH and managed by an Indian Shuar family. Our mission is to preserve the biodiversity and the natural resources with the local inhabitants for the benefit of the current and future generations.

This program is dedicated to true nature lovers who want to experience an eco- adventure and who would be willing to adapt to the modest accommodation offered in the project.

The volunteers will have the opportunity to learn about the jungle during their stay, the traditions and customs of the Shuar culture while they support the schools nearby and make community work, construction of houses and latrines, path cleaning with machete, reforestation and agriculture, as well as handicrafts in the afternoons.

**Type:** Permanent.: From January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year

**Age:** Older than 18 years old.

**Language:** Basic Spanish is necessary

**Minimum time of participation:** 12 weeks up to 1 year, but could be offered for less time,

**Accommodation:** Modest accommodation in cabins in the project, shower in the waterfall of the river

**Work:** From Monday to Friday – Weekends are free to travel around or just to rest.

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** There is not current water but there is a water fall nearby, no electricity, no signal for phones no internet, you can wash your clothes by hand in the river.

**What to bring:** Long trousers, long sleeves T-shirts, towel, rain jacket, cap, rubber boots, items for personal hygiene, swimsuit, sunblock, mosquito repellent etc.

**Program fee for four weeks: 500,00 American dollars,** must be paid at your arrival before going to the project, in case you want to make short stays or longer stays please ask us about the fees.

**Cost includes:** Four weeks of accommodation in the project, including breakfast, lunch and dinner.

**Cost does not include:** Any kind of transportation, bottled water, extra food and beverages, calls and internet access.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** there is NO presence of Zika, malaria nor dengue.

## RESCUE CENTER - CLINIC FOR WILD ANIMALS JB - STV- MLTV 01/23

**Code to apply:** ENVIJBFPECH

The Wildlife Rescue Center was created by Mr James Brown Sweeney, a North American living in Ecuador since the 1940s and pioneer in agricultural production in the territory of Santo Domingo de Los Tsáchilas. This Center is dedicated to rescuing and rehabilitating endangered wildlife, and after its rehabilitation reinserting it into its natural environment. The objective is, save wildlife and restore the right to freedom. This wildlife rescue center is located in a natural conservation farm in the canton of La Concordia - Province of Santo Domingo de Los Tsáchilas - Ecuador. We receive animals from different organizations like, from the National Police, the Ministry of the Environment, Environmentalists, NGOs or any agent that has a species that is wild fauna.

As this is a Wildlife Rescue Center, it is a kind of hospital for **Rehabilitation and Release**, it is a permanent program who works from January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year.

The volunteer activities are as follows:

- Be part of the specimen rescue group (go out to the different places that are required to capture or recover a specimen)
- To assist in the reception and checking the animal's status on arrival.
- Provide medicines and vitamins to the specimens in recovery.
- Neonatal feeding
- Control, monitoring and data collection of specimens in recovery.
- Veterinary assistant.
- All wildlife hospitalization activities
- Market activities and fruit collection for the pantry of the specimens
- Preparation of the food,
- Prepare diets for recovering specimens
- Feed the different specimens in recovery
- Environmental education and guidance to groups.
- Possible maintenance activities on paths and cages.
- Be part of the specimen release group to release the animals into their habitat when needed. (Go out to different parts of the country if it is necessary)
- Office activities.

**Type:** Permanent.: From January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year

**Age:** Older than 18.

**Language:** Spanish is necessary - English.

**Minimum time of participation:** 12 weeks up to 1 year

**Accommodation:** In the project in the volunteer house

**Schedule:** Work is from 08h00 to 17h00 WITH 1.30 hours for lunch time, the volunteer should be flexible with the schedule in emergencies with animals after and before working hours or during the nights if it is necessary.

**Program fee:** 1.500,00 American dollars, must be paid at your arrival before going to the project.

**Cost includes:** 12 weeks of accommodation in the volunteer house of the reserve, including breakfast, lunch and dinner, internet access, facilities for laundry.

**Cost does not include:** Any kind of transportation, bottled water, extra food and beverages, calls.

**What to bring:** Long trousers, long sleeves T-shirts, T-shirts, towel, rain jacket, cap, rubber boots, items for personal hygiene, sunblock, mosquito repellent etc.

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** There is water, electricity, telephones. Internet wiffi after working hours, laundry facilities or you can wash your clothes by hand.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** During the winter season there is presence of Zika, malaria and dengue

## **ANIMAL SHELTER IN AZUAY - STV- MLTV 01/23**

### **Code to apply: ENVIRCCFPECH**

This animal shelter is a permanent program who aims to take care of animal welfare, through good nutrition and care, was created on 2000 year and it has an operating license issued by the Ministry of Environment, Water and Ecological Transition. It is located in the Province of Azuay in the southern highlands of Ecuador.

The refuge hosted the following wild animals: margays, penguins, blue-footed boobies, tapir, buffalo, deer, ostriches, yamalas (dwarf deer), cuchuchos, a wide variety of birds, alligators, ostriches, peacocks, turtles, etc. Initially, the refuge had five deer and a Capuchin monkey, but the number of animals increased due to donations from the people who kept them in their homes. We receive animals from different organizations like, from the National Police, the Ministry of the Environment, Environmentalists, NGOs or any agent that has a species that is wild fauna.

Yurak Allpa Animal Shelter received and receives animals that were "pets" in private homes or were circus animals, or were found orphaned in the wild by the Ecuadorian Ministry of the Environment or the Environmental Police who send the animals recovered from hunters or traffickers of wild animals, if they are injured they are treated and reintroduced but if they are babies it is more difficult to do so, so they stay in the shelter.

The shelter receives visitors, students and the general public who are informed about each of the animals that are in the center, about the importance of respect for animals, promoting awareness among the visiting public.

Among these activities Yurak Allpa also send its technicians to the schools and high schools of its area to give workshops to the students in order to raise awareness in the children about the importance to preserve the flora and fauna of our country, as well as classes on handling and welfare of the animals at the center for the university students and volunteers for refuge interns.

At the moment we are working with a germplasm Bank of the terrestri tapirs from the refuge and we want to do it with the endangered animals that are in the center, we are also close to working with deer genetics.

Yurak Allpa does not receive economic support from the government, the animals are fed thanks to the entrance fee of the visitors as well as weekly sports festivals and fundraises organized by the Manager, in addition to the contributions of the NGOs that we send volunteers.

The volunteer activities are as follows:

- Preparation of food for animals.
- Put food in the containers.
- Cleaning of cages
- Weeding and acclimatization of the cages.
- Preparation of organic waste compost
- Care of gardens in the recreational area.
- Signaling and maintenance of the ecological path.
- Guide for visitors and tourists.

**Type:** Permanent.: From January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year

**Age:** Older than 18.

**Language:** Spanish is necessary. English.

**Accommodation:** In the project in a modest volunteer house near of the shelter.

**Minimmum time of participation:** 4 weeks up to 1 year

**Schedule:** According to the project's director, agreed with the volunteers, Work 5 days per week, 2 days off  
**Program fee:** 500,00 USD, must be paid at your arrival, before going to the project, for longer stays please ask us the total fee

**Cost includes:** Four weeks of accommodation in the volunteer house, three meals breakfast, lunch and dinner.

**Cost does not include:** Any kind of transportation, bottled water, extra food and beverages, calls and internet access.

**What to bring:** Long trousers, long sleeves T-shirts, towel, rain jacket, cap, rubber boots, items for personal hygiene, warm clothes.

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** There is water, electricity, telephones. Internet wifi after working hours, laundry facilities or you can wash your clothes by hand.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** In the highlands there is no presence of Zika, malaria nor dengue

## RESCUE CENTER LOS JAGUARES STV- MLTV 01/23

**Code to apply:** ENVIRCMFPECH

This little Rescue Center is located in Macas - Morona Santiago Province is a permanent program, it started to work since 2006 as a rescue center with some species of wild animals, rescued from citizens who caught them for pets and who had them in very bad conditions. The Center rescued mammals, reptiles, birds, etc. we started bailing a tapir. We ensure that the animals have good living conditions and atmosphere required for their mobility, and simulate their habitat for recovery.

The staff of Los Jaguares visit the schools and high schools of its area to give workshops to the students in order to raise awareness in the children about the importance to preserve the flora and fauna of the Amazon region, as well as they receive students from university for internships. The center attends to emergencies from the Ministry of the Environment in Morona Santiago and also works with irrecoverable or imprinted animals

Los Jaguares does not receive economic support from the government, the animals are fed thanks to the entrance fee of the visitors as well as fundraises organized by the Manager, in addition to the contributions of the NGOs that we send volunteers.

The volunteer activities are as follows:

- Preparation of food for animals.
- Placement of containers for animal feeding.
- Cleaning cages.
- Weeding, cleaning and conditioning cages.
- Compost from organic wastes.
- Fertilization and plant care.
- Road maintenance.
- Guide for tourists and visitors

**Type:** Permanent.: From January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 23<sup>rd</sup> of every year

**Age:** Older than 18.

**Language:** Spanish is necessary. English.

**Accommodation:** In the Center in a modest volunteer house, in rooms double, triple and quintuple.

**Minimum time of participation:** 4 weeks up to 1 year

**Schedule:** According to the project's director, agreed with the volunteers, Work 5 days per week, 2 days off

**Program fee:** 500,00 USD, must be paid at your arrival, before going to the project.

**Cost includes:** Four weeks of accommodation in the volunteer house, three meals breakfast, lunch and dinner.

**Cost does not include:** Any kind of transportation, bottled water, extra food and beverages, calls and internet access.

**What to bring:** Long trousers, long sleeves T-shirts, towel, rain jacket, cap, rubber boots, items for personal hygiene, swimsuit, sunblock, mosquito repellent etc.

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** There is current water, electricity, telephones. Internet in the project after 16:00 hours, laundry facilities.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** there is no presence of Zika, malaria nor dengue

## **GALAPAGOS – SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND- STV- 01/23**

**Code to apply: GFPECH**

The project is located in the San Cristobal Island- sector of the Leaks, 21 kilometers from Puerto Baquerizo Moreno, the capital city of the province of Galapagos, in this island there is a sector where there is a wall with an eye of water which comes out at a height of approximately 8 meters, it falls to the ground drop by drop forming a pool of water, in this place where there are approximately 15 families who are dedicated to agriculture and livestock, 35 years ago, use to go to this place by donkey to collect water in chimbuzos of five gallons to cook, to do the laundry, to take a bath was carried out in the same place,

Our objective is to make reforestation in the San Cristobal island, with endemic and native plants in rural and urban areas with the help of international, individual or group of volunteers and local families, to help in the conservation and protection of the environment, o strengthen community agricultural work and support for activities of social interest.

Our motto is, drop by drop to conserve the endemic and native plants of Galapagos that are in danger of extinction.

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** On the island there is water, electricity, telephones. Internet can be found in Internet cafes and Wi-Fi areas. Laundry services are available for \$ 2 / kilo at the port, but you can wash your clothes by hand.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** there is no presence of Zika, malaria or dengue in the islands

**Type:** Permanent, the project works from January 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 20<sup>th</sup> of every year.

**Age:** Older than 18.

**Language:** Basic Spanish is necessary. English.

**Schedule:** Monday to Friday from 8:00 to 12:00 and 14:00 to 16:00, weekends off.

**Accommodation:** The project has a large room for 6 people, with bathroom, kitchen, living room, and dining room, kitchen utensils, microwave, refrigerator, kitchen, among others, it also has an area of 500 m2 of natural grass for camping, tennis volley court rest areas.

**What to bring:** · Cap or hat, Sunglasses, Light clothing, insect repellent , sunblock, towel, rain jacket, mountain, shoes or rubber boots, items for personal hygiene, work gloves, environmentally friendly soap, long sleeves t-shirts.

**Program fee 500,00 American dollars, must be paid before their arrival to Galápagos through a Bank transfer.**

**Cost includes:** Three weeks of accommodation in the project, and bottled water, electricity, gas, house cleaning products.

**Cost does not include:** Food, flights or any kind of transportation, tours, taxes, phone calls, internet, insurance

Volunteers are responsible for their food.

**NOTE: If you want to make less than 3 weeks of placement ask us for information. We receive groups up to 6 persons**

The Galapagos program does not include food, as soon as the volunteers arrive on the island, the coordinator accompany the volunteers to the store to buy their supplies.

The activities in the program could be:

- Fence maintenance
- Deforestation of invasive plants (blackberry, chupirosa, guava)
- Reforestation of endemic and native plants
- Various construction work to improve the farm
- Animal feed
- Take out the milk
- Cheese making
- Preparation of seedlings
- Seed collection
- Organic garden work
- Communitary works
- Water irrigation
- House cleaning, stables
- Fruit picking
- Soil preparation, fertilizer

## EDUCATION

### SUPPORT ENGLISH TEACHERS- MLTV 01/23

Code to apply: **EDUFPECH**

Volunteers are needed nationwide to assist the English teachers, this program is offered in provinces of the Coast, Highlands and Amazon.

For those who have good Spanish knowledge and they have the will and the time, in the afternoons after the school, they can assist the children with learning problems helping them in reading, writing, grammar, mathematics, gym etc. principally in the schools from the Coast.

The volunteer assists the teachers and students *with pronunciation, checking homework, exams and test scores*, reading texts out loud, doing English Warm Ups (ex.: singing and analysing English songs, playing Vocabulary games, talking about short videos or stories etc.), doing short presentations, explaining/teaching English grammar, having English conversations with the students, what the official teacher's needs.

**"Perhaps some things in the programs could change according to the needs of the project and because of the reality of the country"**

**PUBLIC SERVICES:** The majority of the communities where we work in, have public services like current water, electricity and communications, Internet can be shared in schools or internet-café's, family homes and some parks have free wi-fi.

**TROPICAL DISEASES:** There are no infectious or tropical diseases in the highlands, but in the rural areas of the Coastal

and Amazon regions, during winter there could be dengue, zika, malaria and chingunguya,

Scholar period depends on the region, from September to the end of June in Highlands and in the Amazon and from May to the end of January in the Coastal region, work from Monday to Friday, weekends free, apart of a good English is necessary to have basic knowledge of Spanish

Minimum time of participation : 5 MONTHS

**What to bring:** As your work will be in schools, please take into account that you have to respect the dress code in schools, please bring “normal” cloth to attend to the school like:

- Pants or trousers or skirts · Blouses or shirts
- Sweaters and/or jumpers
- Items for personal hygiene, towels, shampoo, soap etc.
- Light and warm clothing
- The highlands usually have lower temperatures, you will need sweaters and warm clothes

**Age:** Older than 18.

**Accommodation :** With an ecuadorian host family.

**Program fee for 5 months : 2000 USD, the fee of total time of participation must be paid at in one payment before your arrival through a bank transfer or before going to the project.-**

**Cost includes:** 5 months of accommodation in local families, including breakfast, lunch and dinner, laundry facilities, and Mentor visit, Introduction information at your arrival and final evaluation.

**Cost does not include:** Any kind of transportation, bottled water, extra food and beverages, calls and internet access.
