Dear partners,

Please, find below, our program of workcamps for 2013. We do hope to host many of your motivated volunteers this summer, and that they will have a good time in Belgium. We would like to point out some general remarks and specificities regarding our workcamps:

Workcamps

This year, our workcamps will last **8 days to 2 weeks** and will take place from **May to September**. The number of international volunteers in the camp will vary from **6 to 12**. If possible, we try to avoid having more than 2 participants of the same nationality in the camp. Usually English is the camp language, but there are some projects where notions of French are necessary (see workcamps' descriptions).

Conditions for participation

Volunteers should be at least 18-year-old and there is no maximum age limit. There are no special skills required from volunteers. Participants should be motivated to do voluntary work, be ready to meet the realities of local life and demonstrate flexibility, tolerance and be open to new experiences.

PARTNER:

Created by Eunice Kennedy Shriver in 1968, "Special Olympics" aim to providing year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities. Today, Special Olympics is a global movement serving more than 4 million people with intellectual disabilities in 178 countries and representing 30 different types of sports.



Special Olympics Belgium was founded in 1979 and is officially recognized by the

Belgian Olympic and Interfederal Committee. It organises National Games every year (alternatively in Flanders, Brussels and Wallonia) and send delegations of Belgian athletes to the Winter and Summer Special Olympics World Games. These competitions are open to any athlete with intellectual disability who regularly practise a sport at his/her own level. More than just a physical and sport training, these activities enhance the social development of the athletes.

The 2020 National Games will take place in Anvers and will host about 3400 athletes and 1200 coaches from 320 sport clubs to compete in 19 adapted sports and disciplines. The programme will include a torch run, opening and closure ceremonies, an Olympic village, a healthy athletes programme and an art exhibition from artists with mental disability.

WORK:

For this edition of the Belgian National Games, volunteers will help on several aspects of the event logistics, such as assembling and dismantling of structures, building and putting up the decorations, transport and unloading of material, waste management, ...

Volunteers will work with several teams of the organisation before and after the Games. During the 3 days of competitions, volunteers will provide guidance to athletes for one of the disciplines of the competition: a precision ball sport, related to bowls and "pétanque" called **Bocce**. The Opening Ceremony as well as the Torch Run will take place on May 17th while the Games will close the 20rd of May.



→ **Physical work** will be asked to volunteers so it is important to take this into account. Volunteers will also have lighter tasks like guidance of athletes, decorations, waste management, ...

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will be accommodated in dormitories on the Olympics Village site. Please bring a sleeping bag.

FOOD:

Meals will be taken with the different teams of the organisation and will be prepared by local volunteers. Vegetarian food will be available but should be asked in advance.

LOCATION:

The 2023 National Games will take place at the Nekkerhal in Mechelen (Malines in french). It's in the big city and it's easy to take a public transportation. Adress: Plattebeekstraat 1, 2800 Mechelen.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp requires physical efforts at some moments.
- Volunteers are asked to prove a **strong interest for the thematic** of this event.
- There will be one free day before and one free day after the competition.

Please bring good working shoes and clothes that can get dirty as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.

It is also important to know that the organization of such an event can sometimes involve last minute changes (example: a truck to be unloaded does not arrive on time or a technical problem delays the assembly of a structure). We therefore expect flexibility and understanding from the volunteers.

LANGUE:

The language of the workcamp is English. Basics of French or Dutch are useful but not essential.


ACCES:

Accès

The meeting point is at Mechelen railway station at 4 pm. From there, someone will pick up the group to the site (Nekkerhal)

- By plane: Zaventem airport (Brussels-Capital) is the nearest airport.
- Once you arrive at the airport, take the train to Mechelen. There are two possibilities:
- 1. It is an IC train to Amsterdam.
- 2. OR the IC train to central Antwerp as in the example below.

Use Google Maps. Enter "Mechelen station" as your destination to find out which is the first train to Mechelen.

SUMMARY OF THE WORKCAMP:

For this edition of the Belgian Special Olympics, a competition hosting about 3400 athletes with intellectual disabilities, a workcamp will take place in the city of Mecheln in order to help on several aspects of the logistics around the competition. Volunteers will also guide athletes for one of the disciplines during the National Games.

PARTNER:

" La CITE s'invente " is a non-profit educational organisation for sustainable development. Its mission is to raise awareness about environmental issues and to promote sustainable ways of life.

The main objective of the organisation is to build and design an eco-centre for pedagogical purposes in the hillside (coteaux) of the Citadel of Liège. An eco-centre is a multi-purpose facility dedicated to demonstration of innovations and



knowledge transfers for environment protection and sustainable development.

In addition to the development of the eco-centre, the organisation is carrying out numerous activities related to environment:

- Activities, workshop and trainings around nature, vegetable garden, forest garden, biodiversity, wild plants
- "tables d'hôtes", sustainable food workshop, home-made bread workshop
- Workcamps about eco-renovation and recycling
- Awareness raising about sustainable accommodation
- "Healthy house" workshop on how to make hand-made home care products

WORK:

The main objective of the workcamp will be to help improving the outdoor and indoor facilities of the eco-centre and support the organisation of the festival "Ecoteau" which promotes the activities of the eco-centre and other local initiatives.

Examples of tasks and activities to foresee during the workcamp:

- Rebuild the wooden shelter of the vegetable garden
- Re-roofing with wooden tiles, straxw or other materials
- Take care of the vegetable garden, the forest garden: weed, rebuild the wooden boxes, plant, harvest prepare the soil for future planting
- Maintain the surroundings, create walking paths
- Dig new pond
- Set-up nest box
- Spend one or two days at an organic plantation to learn how to harvest fruits and vegetables (the harvest will be cooked back at the centre)
- Bake homemade bread and pizza in our wood-fired oven
- Gather, discover and cook wild plants
- Pick and cook everything which grows on our site



ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in tents on the site the eco-centre. Please bring a sleeping bag and a mattress.

We wish the volunteers to only bring organic and natural care products (shampoo, soap...)

FOOD:

Volunteers will be provided with an inside and an outside kitchen where they will cook for themselves. Food will be local, organic and mainly vegetarian.

LOCATION:

The eco-centre is in the Saint-Léonard area of Liège located, at the foot of the hillside of the Citadel. Liège is the biggest city of Wallonia and the third city of Belgium after Brussels and Antwerp. The hillside of the Citadel is a rural area of more than 90 hectares partly located in the historical centre of Liège, which half is classed as Natural Heritage of the Walloon Region. This site has more than 60 monuments recognized as Material Heritage by the Walloon Region and counts 13 km of walking trails.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

This workcamp targets volunteers who are sensitive to environmental issues with a strong interest for sustainable development.

Please bring good working shoes and clothes as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.

LANGUAGES:

The language of the workcamp is English. Basics of French are useful but not necessary.


ACCES:

Acces

The meeting point is at Liège St-Lambert station on 12 June.

- By plane: There are two international airports (circled in red on the map) in Belgium. There is Zaventem
 airport in Brussels and Brussels-Charleroi airport in the city of Charleroi.
- Once you have arrived in Belgium, you can type in "Gare de Liège Saint-Lambert" on Google maps (circle in blue on the map):
- 1. From Zaventem (Brussels airport), it's just over an hour by train.
- 2. From Brussels-Charleroi (Charleroi airport), it's a just over two hours by train.

JAVVA 23-03 - Couleur café

BRUXELLES 15/06–28/06 FEST 12 VOLS 18+

PARTNER:

The Couleur Café festival is a festival of world and urban music. It is organised as a large convivial village in the city of Brussels and offers, in addition to the music, entertainment, fireworks, workshops for children, dance and music lessons, art exhibitions ranging from traditional to contemporary art and multicultural meeting places.

WORK:

Volunteers will help with various logistical aspects of setting up the festival: assembling and dismantling structures, loading and unloading equipment, setting up scenery, setting up artists' boxes, participating in waste management, etc.

It is important to remember that this type of work is very physical.

Volunteers will be working with part of the festival team as well as with other volunteers (outside JAVVA).

During the festival, which will take place on 23, 24 and 25 June from 3pm, the volunteers will be integrated into

the different teams (catering and eco-cleaning). After their shifts, the volunteers will be able to enjoy the festival.

The group of JAVVA volunteers will be on day-off on 18/06 and 25/06 with the possibility to visit Brussels or other

cities in Belgium.



ACCOMODATION:

Volunteers will be required to stay in tents in the volunteer camp during the workcamp. Conditions are basic.

Bring your sleeping bag, mattress and toiletries. If you have the possibility, you can also bring your own tent. Beware, the nights can be very cold in Belgium! Showers and toilets are available on site.

FOOD:

Meals (morning/midday/evening) are provided by Couleur Café.

SITUATION:

The site will be located in the Osseghem Park at the foot of the Atomium in Brussels (capital of Belgium). The campsite is only a few minutes walk from the Festival.



SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

Bring good shoes and clothes suitable for work (clothes that can get dirty) as well as warm clothes and

waterproof clothes in case of rain (good jacket). More casual clothing for festival days is of course allowed.

LANGUAGE:

The language of the work site is English. Basic French is useful but not essential.

ACCES:


The meeting point is at the PARC D'OSSEGHEM festival site in Brussels on 15 June.

- The nearest train station is Brussels South. Train timetables on: https://www.belgiantrain.be/fr . To get there afterwards (if you arrive by train at Brussels South station):
 - 1. Get off at the Brussels South train station
 - 2. Take metro line 6 (direction Roi Baudouin) and get off at the Heysel stop.
 - 3. Walk for 5 minutes.
- By plane: the nearest international airports are Brussels (Zaventem) or Brussels-Charleroi (note that
 this one is in the city of Charleroi) and they are circled in red on the map.

Brussels airport (Zaventem) is the closest because it is directly in the city. It will take you 30 minutes to get there. Put: Parc d'Osseghem in google maps to get your route.

Brussels Charleroi airport (located in Charleroi) also allows you to reach the meeting place in 1h30. You will need to take a shuttle from the airport to Brussels and then take public transport within the city. Put: Parc d'Osseghem in google maps to get your route.

JAVVA23-04 - Building Youth (L'enfance de l'Art)

TEMPLEUVE 15/07-29/07 RENO/ENVI 14 VOLS 18+

PARTNER:

"L'Enfance de l'Art", founded in 1997, is an association which aims to help parents in their education role. The organisation aims to gather people willing to bring to their children a creative learning environment where they can find the joy in learning and experience the richness of childhood rather than early specialisation or academic hot-housing. Parents and professionals work together in the structures created by the organisation: leisure workshops, nurseries, schools, kindergarten. To do so, the association follows the principles of Steiner-Waldorf pedagogy.



Altogether, those activities gather a total of 155 children. The nursery, the kindergarten and the primary school, which are all recognized by the authorities, are located in a former boarding school which was abandoned in 2004. This building in now in a process of renovation which the volunteers will take part in.

WORK:

The main task will therefore be to contribute in the renovation of the old boarding school which L'Enfance de l'Art has been occupying since 2011.

Material and techniques of construction are eco-friendly. The aim is to create a welcoming and well-equipped place with lavatories, kitchen, dorm, game room, ...

Volunteers will work from Monday to Friday, from 9 to 12am and from 2 to 4pm. Depending on the needs, they will work in teams on different tasks:

- Eco-renovation: coating with a straw-soil mix, dismounting of building, materials sorting, painting
- Taking care of the surroundings
- Furniture building in the carpentry workshop
- Cooking for the team



ACCOMODATION:

On the workcamp place, in other buildings to be restored or in a tent (possibility to choose).

- two showers and several toilets
- a room to cook and eat
- two dorms

Comfort will be closed to what you can find in a scout' camp.

Please bring a sleeping bag and a torch (to move inside the buildings).

FOOD:

The meals (light at lunch: sandwiches, salads, soup... and hot meal for dinner) will be prepared_by a member of the organisation with the help of two volunteers. A focus will be put on a good management of the collective

cooking in order to have quality meals with as few waste as possible.

LOCATION:

The building of "l'Ecole de la Providence" is located in Templeuve which is a small village close to the French border (2 km) and 20 km from Lille and 10 km from Tournai. There is a market and small shops in the village. A bus line makes the connection with Tournai (every hour during the day). The countryside is flat,



which makes it easy to bike (a few bikes will be available). Tournai is a touristic place for old stones, history and museums lovers. Its cathedral is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

SPECIFIC INFORMATIONS:

- This workcamp is open to anyone interested in meeting and sharing with others.
- Smartphone use will be limited, based on rules which will be decided collectively on the first day.
- Please bring clothes you're not afraid to dirty, good working shoes and remember that even during summer weather is often variable.

LANGUAGE:


Language of the workcamp will be English. Basic knowledge of French is useful but not mandatory.

ACCESS:

Acces

The meeting point is at Tournai station on 15 July at around 4pm.

- Brussels airport (Zaventem) is the closest because it takes 1h30 by public transport to reach Tournai station. Brussels - Charleroi airport (located in Charleroi) is also a good way to reach the meeting place in 2 hours.
- Use google maps.
- From Brussels City, go to Brussels Central Station and take the direct train to Tournai. If you are under 26 years old, ask for a GoPass 1 ticket. You can go anywhere in Belgium for 6,6€. All timetables and routes on www.belgianrail.be/en/

SUMMARY OF THE WORKCAMP:

This eco-construction workcamp with "L'Enfance de l'Art" aims at renovating the building hosting kindergartens and a school following Steiner principles for children of the neighbourhood using only ecological materials and

techniques. Volunteers will work on the renovation of a building in order to transform it into a welcoming place for kids.

JAVVA23-05 – Arthur Regniers Centre

LOBBES 07/08-21/08 DISA 8 VOLS 18+

PARTNER:

The Centre "Arthur Regniers" hosts people suffering from cerebral palsy or from other motor disabilities.

The aims of this Medical and Teaching Institute is to provide educational support, health care and well-being to the teenagers and adults of the centre and also lend support to their families.

The centre provides an open-space, various activities, and technical support in order to promote the social, professional and cultural autonomy of the residents.



WORK:

- ✓ Volunteers will be asked to give support to the residents of the centre for some basic needs (such as helping with the meals,...) and to participate in the organization of artistic and cultural activities, discussion groups, various workshops and excursions together with the centre's staff.
- ✓ Volunteers will have the possibility to work with the teenagers and/or with the adults of the centre. The schedules will be flexible and will be adapted during the following weeks according to the centre's needs and the volunteers' proposals.
- ✓ They will indeed have the opportunity to suggest their own activities (games, music, recipes,...) related to their native country and/or talents, interests and wishes.

ACCOMODATION:

Volunteers will be accommodated in one of the centre's dorm. They will have access to a multipurpose room Please bring a sleeping bag.

FOOD:

Meals will be taken in the centre's refectory and will be prepared by the cooks of the centre. Volunteers will help the residents during meals. Picnics can be prepared and taken away during excursions or activities during weekends.



People who eat vegan of halal food will have to make their own food from time to time.

LOCATION:

Bienne-lez-Happart is a very small town near Binche and Charleroi. No supermarket within 4km but in the village there is a restaurant and also some festivities in August (village festivals).

The centre itself is very isolated in the countryside but a car* can be available.

*If you can, bring your driver's license and check if it's valid in Belgium.

SPECIFIC INFORMATIONS:

- This project targets people who are motivated to work with persons with disability and aware that this context may be emotionally challenging. A portion of the residents indeed bear heavy handicaps.
- Please also keep in mind that the centre is quite isolated.



♦ Volunteers are invited to bring with them small activity/presentation of their native country (music, food, ...).

LANGUAGE:

Basic knowledge of French would be useful as residents usually don't speak English. However, motivation remains the most important criteria to participate in this workcamp.

Language of the camp will be English.

ACCESS:

Acces

The meeting point is at Binche station on 7 august at 16 PM. Someone will pick you up.

- If you come by train, check the train timetables on: https://www.belgiantrain.be/fr
- In Belgium, there are **two international airports**: Bruxelles-Zaventem (in the city of Brussels) and Bruxelles-Charleroi (in the city of Charleroi) It's in red on the map
- It takes around 1h45 from Bruxelles to Binche.
- It takes 1h20 from Charleroi to Binche.

SUMMARY OF THE WORKCAMP:

The Centre "Arthur Regniers" hosts people suffering from cerebral palsy or from other motor disabilities aiming to provide educational support, health care, and well-being to the residents of the centre. Volunteers will give support to the residents for some basic

needs and join the organization of artistic and cultural activities, discussion groups, various workshops and excursions.

JAVVA23-06 - Nomade Theatre Festival

BRUSSELS 12/08 TO 25/08 FEST 10 VOLS 18+

PARTNER:



Since its creation in 1994, "La Compagnie des Nouveaux Disparus" strives to give access to culture and particularly theatre - to a socially disadvantaged public, less inclined to cultural activities. Democratisation of culture and promotion of diversity are the guiding principles of the company's activities. These are divided in three types of projects: theatre plays creation, "Theâtres Nomades" festival and Mimouna Festival.

Every summer, the Brussels' Park hosts more than 50 shows over 4 days for the Festival Théâtres Nomades Festival. The fountain and surrounding area are transformed into a colourful nomad village made of marquees, caravans, berber tents, and open-air stages.

The programme is diversified through various shows for children, a circus, street theatre, classical theatre, puppet shows, as well as creative workshops on the stage.

WORK:

Volunteers will help on several aspects of the festival logistics, such as meals preparation for the entire team of the festival, assembling and dismantling of tents, building and putting up the decorations, stage-managing, transport and unloading of material, installation of the "village of organisations", waste and composting toilet management, ... Volunteers will work with all people working on the festival (technicians, stage managers, facilitators, organizers, cooks...).

Volunteers will also be integrated in the different teams during the festival (tickets, bar, catering, stage-managing, ...) which will take place from August 17th to August 20th 2023.



→ Please be aware that **heavy physical work** will be asked to volunteers at setting up and dismantling.

Volunteers will also have lighter tasks like meal preparation, waste management, ... during the festival. Depending of the programme schedule, volunteers may also have the possibility to actively take part in entertainment activities of the festival.

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in caravans on the site of the festival. The living conditions are **very rudimentary** close to conditions of a "scout camp". Volunteers will use dry toilet and a shower placed in the park. Please bring your **sleeping bag** and a **camping mattress**.

FOOD:

Meals will be taken with the diverse teams of the festival and will be prepared by the volunteers together with the kitchen team of the festival. Lunch will consist on sandwiches and a warm meal will be prepared for dinner. Vegetarian and halal food will be available.

LOCATION:



Brussels, the European capital, capital of Belgium, is populated by 1.2 million inhabitants. Very well connected to many other capitals of Europe, this city is a rich cultural center.

SPECIFIC INFORMATIONS:

- This workcamp requires strong physical efforts at some moments and an active participation and involvement of volunteers during 2 weeks, due to the deadlines set for the good progress of the festival.
 Volunteers are asked to prove a strong interest for the thematic of the festival.
- ✓ There will be 2 free days during the workcamp: 15 and 22 august.
- ✓ Please bring good **working shoes** and clothes which can get dirty as well as a raincoat in case of rainy weather.

If you have a music instrument or juggling material, feel free to bring it!

LANGUAGE:

WORK:

Volunteers will help on several aspects of the festival logistics, such as meals preparation for the entire team of the festival, assembling and dismantling of tents and structures, building and putting up the decorations, stagemanaging, transport and unloading of material, installation of the market area, waste management,... Volunteers

will work with all people working on the festival (technicians, stage managers, facilitators, organizers, cooks...).

→ Hard physical work will be asked to volunteers so it is important to take this into account. Volunteers will also have lighter tasks like meal preparation, waste management, decorations,... The festival will take place from September 8th to September 11th 2020.



ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will sleep in tents during the workcamp. The living conditions are rudimentary close to conditions of a "scout camp". Please bring your sleeping bag, mattress and toiletries. Nights can be very cold in Belgium.

FOOD:

Before and after the festival, meals will be taken with the diverse teams of the festival. Sandwiches will be prepared for lunch and a warm meal for dinner. During the festival, volunteers will receive meal tickets to get warm meals from the caterer of the site.

LOCATION:

The castle-farm of Marsinne, built in the XII century, is located in the old village of Couthuin (Commune of Héron), in the Province of Liège in Wallonia in Wallonia, the French-speaking part of Belgium. The site of the festival is about 10km away from the city of Huy and 40km away from the city of Liège. The caste-farm hosts also a brewery that produce a craft beer: the «Léopold 7».

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

- This workcamp requires hard physical efforts at some moments and an active participation and involvement of volunteers during the workcamp, due to the deadlines set for the good progress of the festival. Volunteers are asked to prove a strong interest for the thematic of the festival. There will be 3 free days during the workcamp: two days during and one day after the festival.
- It is also important to take into account the fact that the organisation of a festival might be subject to last minutes changes or unforeseen events (for example: the truck to unload doesn't show up at the predicted time, a technical issue will delay the assembly of a stage,...). We are therefore expecting volunteers to be <u>flexible</u> and <u>understanding</u> in this kind of situation.



- Please bring good working shoes, gloves, clothes that can get dirty and a raincoat in case of rainy weather (+ sleeping bag & mattress). If you have a music instrument or juggling material, feel free to bring it! and your dancing outfit!
- One or two evening will be organize to initiate volunteers to folk dances.
- We aim to encourage the participation of refugees living in Belgium on this workcamp



PARTNER:

"L'Enfance de l'Art" is a non profit organisation whose aim is to help parents to become more involved in their children's education. To that purpose, the organisation set up hosting facilities for children or people with reduced autonomy, leisure workshops, nurseries, schools. The organisation uses alternative pedagogies (Steiner & Loczy). Loczy pedagogy respects the whole child and develops its autonomy, which requires observation capacity to meet their real needs at the right time. Steiner



pedagogy brings in more contact with nature and creativity, which requires to also work outside every day. Children in Steiner approach begin their learning through imitation, rather than instruction. Thus great care is put into the adults' gestures, speech and movement in the kindergarten and nursery.

L'Enfance de l'Art hosts about 140 children from 0 to 12 years old. The nursery, the kindergarten and the primary school are recognized by the French-speaking Community of Belgium and the organisation is now established in the former boarding school of « Dames de la Providence ». The kindergarten and the school are located in that building in Templeuve (near Tournai) while the nursery is located in Tournai.

PROJECT:

L'Enfance de l'Art can host up to 4 ECS volunteers:

- One volunteer will work in a nursery (with kids between 0 and 3 years old) in Tournai
- The three others will be in a kindergarten (with kids between 3 and 6 years old) in Templeuve, a small village near Tournai.

With the support of the educators, volunteers will carry out different kind of activities with the children: painting, drawing, fairy tales and nursery rhymes (volunteers can share some in their own language), making cakes and breads, outdoor games, crafts, walks in woods,...

PRATICAL ARRANGEMENT:

Volunteers will live in a share house in Tournai. Each of them will have their own bedroom and they will share a common area all together (bathroom, kitchen, living room)). They will receive a monthly allowance in order to buy food and also pocket money (about 310€ in total).

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

It is important to be sincerely willing to work with children under 7, and have related qualities: smiling, gentle, patient, helpful, attentive, responsible, creative, empathic, loving crafts,...

CARITAS « Logis de Louvranges » for asylum seekers

PARTNER:

The project in Louvranges consists of vulnerable female asylum seekers, single or with children in 21 apartments. The team assists the residents in the legal, social and medical field. The goal is to give the women a maximum of autonomy starting from their own capacity in order to be ready to leave the Logis and start an independent life.

The Logis host about 20 women and between 40 and 45 children, all asylum seekers. They are from: Congo, Guinea, Rwanda, Nigeria, Somalia, Macedonia, Kosovo, Iraq, Afghanistan, Dagestan, Kosovo,... The Logis is in the commune of Wavre and is close to the municipalities of Chaumont-Gistoux and Louvain-La-Neuve. The place of the Logis is isolated. There is a big pasture and a courtyard for the children.

PROJECT:

Volunteers will be working together with the team to provide individual support and carry out activities for residents.

Their main role will be to guide, inform and motivate families regarding activities and appointments. They will also:

- help with the organisation of the daycare (0 to 3 years old babies)
- co-lead & to co-organise activities for children (creative & artistic workshops, sports activities,...)
- co-organise workshops with families in order to improve communication & community harmony (cooking workshop or any other activities)
- offer individual support to new families (ex: how to read a map, to take public transportation,...)

ACCOMMODATION:

During the week, it is possible to take a bus from the Logis but during the week-end one has to walk 2 km to reach the first bus stop. Bikes are available and if volunteers have a driving licence valid in Belgium, they will be allowed to use a van easy to ride.

The 2 ECS volunteers will be hosted in one of the flat of the Logis de Louvranges where they will have their own bedroom and share the kitchen - living room and the bathroom.

They will receive a monthly allowance in order to buy food and also pocket money (about 300€ in total).

SPECIFIC INFORMATION:

Due to the current asylum policy in Belgium, the number and the profile of the residents can be subject to changes beyond control of the centre and JAVVA.
