For 30 years, we've been helping young people explore the world through various programs like working in hotels, languages courses, volunteering, and gaining work experience. We've done this not only in Finland but also in different countries in Europe and around the globe.

MEET OUR TEAM:

During this time, we've assisted more than 20 000 young individuals in gaining a better understanding of different cultures and perspectives through our programs.

Our commitment remains strong as we continue to provide opportunities for young people to grow and connect in our increasingly globalized world. We look forward to many more years of inspiring and empowering the next generation.

At present, our primary focus is on a diverse range of programs that include volunteering opportunities, vocational education mobility initiatives, youth exchanges, and training programs.


ANIMAL RESCUE HOME

Soup sharing



Allianssi Youth Exchanges is part of the KA2 strategic partnership called "SOUP SHARING" with the objective of implementing SOUP events in different communities around Europe and to raise civic engagement. Through this project, we developed International SOUP, which takes place in Helsinki. International SOUP was developed in order to facilitate communication between the citizens of Helsinki and create an open space where dialogue and exchanging of opinions is encouraged.

All Aboard Inclusive Train (AAIT)

All Aboard Inclusive Train (AAIT) is an Erasmus+ KA2 development project. The objective of supporting group leaders' skills in dealing with diversity at volunteer camps. The purpose of the project is to develop methods that support group leaders, specifically, 4 detailed workshops that trainers can easily integrate into existing seminar concepts for new campleaders or that can be implemented as a separate training for campleaders.






Coordinating Locally to Initiate More Changes (C.L.I.C) with the European Solidarity Corps is a Key Action 2 Cooperation Partnership project, including 10 partner organisations, under the ERASMUS+ Programme. The main purpose of the project is to coordinate organisations at the local and regional levels to develop and disseminate methods and tools increase support methods for volunteers.

Hotspots

The project aims to develop non formal education tools and methods, within a newly designed pedagogical approach, to enhance intercultural learning among young people, both online and offline, in national and transnational Youth Participation Activities, within the E+ program.



PAST ACTVITIES

MEXICAN TEACHERS

Allianssi Youth Exchange hosted a delegation of Mexican educators from the state of Guanajuato, who visited Finland to gain insights into the Finnish education system and youth work. The visit is part of the EDUCAM project, an acronym for "Educadores de Clase Mundial" or "World Class Educators." These teachers aim to promote global education, foster the development of competencies and values in students, and support international exchanges.

During their stay, the teachers visited various educational institutions, including universities and high schools, to observe the differences between the Mexican and Finnish educational system. Additionally, they explored several points of interest, such as the Heureka Science Center and Suomenlinna Fortress Island.

SUOMENLINNA WORKCAMP



Allianssi Youth Exchanges is a member of the Alliance of European Voluntary Service Organisations and cooperatess with the network members and partners around the globe.

Allianssi Youth Exchanges coordinate an international World Heritage Volunteering camp in Suomenlinna! Suomenlinna is a historic sea fortress and UNESCO World Heritage site located on a group of islands in the Gulf of Finland, near Helsinki. 13 volunteers from 7 different countries worked mostly at renovation, but also prepared wooden boat sailing race, did a visitor survey and removed some invasive plants.



YOUTH EXCHANGES

SUSTAINABLE BREAK





Participants went to a French village called Beaumotte with a group of 19 people. There were participants from Finland, Greece, Spain, Mexico, Ecuador, and Germany. The location was near the Swiss border, making it a bit challenging to reach due to limited transportation options. Everyone arrived safely, and the ecological exchange program began with the aim of promoting a more communal and environmentally friendly lifestyle. Despite initial limitations, the participants successfully learned about each other's cultures. During their free time, the participants engaged in card games, volleyball, and cultural exchanges. They created art, including Moomin figures, with a memorable Greek friend's self-portrait as a Moomin character in their end-of-camp envelopes.

SEEDS OF ART

Participants spent three weeks in the French village of Cause de Clerans on a youth exchange with participants from various countries. The theme was creativity, and they learned new skills through workshops, including handcrafting bracelets, making Italian pasta, basic Chinese language pronunciation, and meditative collage-making. Participants embraced a wilderness atmosphere, staying in tents and using outdoor facilities. Despite the challenges, the camp was functional and clean, creating a unique mood for activities. The exchange allowed them to share knowledge, make friends, and learn about European cultures.

LEAVE THE ROAD, TAKE THE TRAILS



climatechange themed exchange, "Leave the Road, Take the Trails," took place in the French village of Le Creneau. Participants faced challenging conditions while living in tents and exploring the countryside for two weeks. Activities revolved around climate-related discussions personal projects. group One climate researched policies presented their findings, while another group campaigned to improve local receiving strong transport, local support.Participants explored nearby areas, bonded through group activities, and enjoyed leisure activities like bike trips and game nights, forming deep connections.

International youth exchanges promote empathy and a broader perspective beyond nationality, emphasizing human connections. These experiences boost participants' enthusiasm for similar projects and their faith in international opportunities.

COTTAGE OF CULTURES

Our volunteers project, "Cottage of Cultures," received Solidarity project financial support from European Solidarity Corps! Our volunteers identified a critical need to promote cultural exchange and integration between foreigners and Finnish people. Internationals need to feel more as a part of the community and more connected to locals. The idea of the project is to promote diversity, tolerance, and interculturality, to include minorities in community life and to make the distance between locals and internationals shorter.

So far, we've organized six successful events, each featuring a different country's culture like Italy, Poland, Ukraine, Greece, the Czech Republic and Vietnam.

Our event schedule typically unfolds as follows: We start with a lively presentation about the country, giving participants a taste of its culture through the eyes of a native speaker. Then, we offer a variety of workshops, from cooking to dancing to language lessons, so you can experience different aspects of the culture. We also have discussions about important topics like sustainability, religion, minorities, and LGBTQ+ issues to help participants understand the country better. To wrap it up, we have a fun social session with tasty traditional food and a chance to socialize and network.

Targeted Mobility Scheme

(TMS)

Allianssi Youth Exchanges is a partner in EURES network and a member in an European project called Targeted Mobility Scheme (TMS)

TMS is developed by the European Commission to reduce youth unemployment in Europe. The programme assists young people to gain valuable work experience in another European Union member state. It also enhances life skills through non-formal learning taking place when residing in a new country.

Target groups are jobseekers aged 18+ and employers from an EU country, Norway or Iceland. TMS supports jobs and workbased traineeships.

Ready for Life

Allianssi Youth Exchanges runs outgoing Erasmus + VET projects for vocational education. In these programs we work vocational students and recent graduates to provide them with tailored work experience during their studies or after graduation. At the moment we co-operate with several European countries and some non-European countries in these outbound programs. We offer work experience placements for vocational graduates from all fields and on the job learning placements during studies for students of youth and community instruction.
