Introduction

Concordia is a charity based in Brighton that was founded in 1943. Our mission is to support people to develop skills and gain experiences so that they can thrive. We run programmes that change lives and nurture global citizens who care about each other, their local communities and the world.

We are part of a global community – we work with partners and people from all over the world. All our projects are impactful - whether they are just up the road from us or on the other side of the world. We do this by working with local communities delivering programmes that respond to local needs.

Concordia was founded in 1943 to recruit volunteer labour to encourage peace and reconciliation in the aftermath of the Second World War. Since then, Concordia has supported around three-quarters of a million people to undertake incredible programmes that support local communities all over the world.

Our work as a charity supplies five core services: CYA (Concordia Youth Action), International Volunteering, NCS (National Citizens Service), Seasonal Workers Programme and our Wellbeing Programme. Although all our programmes vary, they are all motivated by our desire to make the world a better place.

CYA (Concordia Youth Action)

The Concordia Youth Action programmes supports young people in Sussex to engage with the local community. Underpinning all our sessions is the drive to develop Young People's skills and give them experiences

that help them thrive. The free programme combines fun activities with skills sessions and social action, resulting in a recognised award. Activity sessions are aligned with the Skills Builder Framework, developing independence and life skills to support young people with education, employment and positive steps towards a brighter future.

International Volunteering

Our international volunteering programme supports people of all ages to undertake meaningful and locally driven volunteering projects worldwide, either individually or as groups.

Group volunteering projects are organised in close partnership with our global partners who are based in the country where the project is planned to take place. Partners communicate with the local community to identify what problem the group of volunteers can solve.

As part of two of the biggest international volunteer networks, the Alliance European Voluntary Service Organisations the Committee for International Voluntary Service Organisations (CCIVS), we share with them quality standards for our projects as well as the ethos that drives our work. Each year, we collaborate with our global partners, to develop more than 1,500 volunteer projects that take place all over the world. These projects are designed for individuals. Volunteer projects take place throughout the year and vary in length, so you can fit your experience around work and study commitments.

NCS (National Citizen Service)

Concordia is proud to be a Delivery Partner for the National Citizen Service programme (NCS) in the Sussex area. Over the last ten years, we have seen thousands of young people successfully completing the programme.

NCS is a life changing experience available to all 16–17-year-olds in England, no matter what your background is or if you are at school or not. It is a Government funded scheme to encourage young people to become more active in their local communities. Many of our NCS graduates go on to volunteer as part of our Concordia Youth Action programme and on international volunteering projects.

Seasonal Workers Programme

Concordia supports the UK farming industry through the supply of labour, skills and resources. We offer people of all ages from all over the world the opportunity to work in the UK on horticultural farms to learn skills, gain work experience and earn money.

We believe that the ethical supply of labour is vital to the UK farming industry and to promoting intercultural understanding and peace. Concordia is one of six Government trusted and recognised organisations that provides work permits to overseas workers. Our ethos of excellent customer service, professionalism, reliable labour provision and training ensures we are the number one choice for those wishing to come to the UK to work.

Emotional Wellbeing Programme

Concordia's Emotional Wellbeing Programme supports the positive wellbeing of young people in secondary schools across Sussex. Our 11-week programme helps young people to understand their emotions, build an emotional toolkit, grow their self-esteem, foster healthy relationships & trust, as well as supporting with their mental health.

We are proud to work in partnership with local schools to support the wellbeing of young people aged 11-14 in the Sussex area with our free service.

Our 11-week programme has been designed to be delivered during school hours by our experienced Emotional Wellbeing Programme Facilitators, slotting easily into the school day. Our sessions are fun, informal, and creative – giving young people the space and scope to explore topics in a safe and supportive environment.

We work with small groups of young people who have been invited by the school onto the programme. We are strengths based & youth led, which in turn means we place a lot of emphasis on tailoring sessions to ensure that they meet the needs and dynamics of each group that we work with.

Our programme lays the foundation for young people to build on creating and preserving positive habits. We want young people to feel comfortable and confident in maintaining healthy mental wellbeing.

When young people have positive emotional wellbeing, they can: Build healthy personal coping strategies, improve resilience to pressure & stress, have a stronger sense of self & self-worth, improve relationships with peers & adults, as well as have a beneficial impact on their lives both outside & inside education.

Our projects in the UK are all community based and can involve either environmental work, working with children or people with special needs or setting up events which need support from volunteers for example helping to run community festivals. There are usually between 4 and 12 volunteers placed on a project and when necessary, we place 1 or 2 Coordinators to help the group.

General Information

Volunteers who participate on a Concordia volunteer project come from a diverse range of backgrounds, nationalities and cultures and have different abilities and experience. It is this diversity that makes the projects such a unique and fun experience. All volunteers that participate apply through our partner organisations abroad and must meet the following criteria:

- be 18 or years of age or older for our adult projects and 16-17 for our Teen projects.
- be open minded and flexible.

- be able to communicate in English without difficulty. Some projects that include volunteering with children may ask that you have a good level of English.
- be highly motivated if applying to work with children or on social projects.
- most projects require volunteers to produce a Certificate of Good Conduct/Police check (the equivalent of a UK Disclosure and Barring Service commonly referred to as DBS check)
- be prepared to participate in all aspects of life on the project including the domestic chores such as shopping, cooking and cleaning.
- be physically fit enough to do the heavy work involved in some projects.
- be prepared to carry out the work that is expected of them in a responsible manner, with due regard for personal safety and the safety of others.

Concordia Projects

Generally volunteering lasts 5-8 hours per day with lunch/tea breaks taken on site. Some social projects may require volunteers to work longer hours depending on the nature of the volunteering. On most projects there are two days off each week though these are not always two days together and not always at the weekend.

Social Activities

Adult projects do not offer an organised leisure programme and social activities will depend on the nature and location of the project. Concordia provides a small budget for one or two group based social activities on each project. The group is responsible for organising its own free time activities, with help from the group Coordinators. Volunteers are expected to bring additional spending money.

Whilst on teenage projects Concordia will organise a programme of activities during the free time. Concordia will organise a blend of volunteering, cultural and leisure activities.

Important! Leisure time spent with the other volunteers is central to the international volunteer experience. Therefore, volunteers are expected to participate in the group-based leisure activities and are requested not to arrange personal trips away from the project at weekends or during the evenings.

What the Project Provides:

Food - Most groups will cook for themselves and will receive a food allowance adequate to prepare meals on a <u>self-catering</u> basis. Volunteers will be responsible for organising the shopping, cooking and cleaning. Some projects may be catered (i.e. meals will be provided for you); if this is the case it will be indicated in the project description. On most teenage projects volunteers will be provided with the ingredients to make meals for the duration of the project. Volunteers who have any specific dietary requirements need to inform Concordia in advance.

Accommodation - This will vary from project to project and can be quite basic. It will usually be on the project site, or nearby in a local school, youth centre, in tents, etc. with basic cooking and washing facilities provided. In some teen projects volunteers could stay in youth hostels or residential accommodation offered by the host.

Insurance - Concordia provides medical insurance for volunteers whilst on the project. This covers accident and illness. Personal possessions are not covered. We **strongly advise** you to take out your own travel insurance for your personal possessions and travel.

Group Coordinators - Concordia place one or two experienced volunteers (usually from the UK) on our short-term projects. All teenage projects will have a guaranteed two coordinators on them.

Information sheets including travel information - These are sent to volunteers approximately six weeks before the project is due to start.

What the Volunteer needs to bring

Volunteers from the European Union should bring with them a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) which will entitle them to urgent medical treatment. Volunteers are covered by our medical insurance policy once they arrive on the project. However, they are **STRONGLY** advised to take out their own insurance for travel, health, luggage and other personal possessions especially for the journeys to and from the project. Neither Concordia nor the host organisation can be held responsible for volunteers' personal possessions whilst they are on the project!

- Volunteers must bring their own sleeping bags/roll mats unless otherwise indicated in the project description.
- Volunteers must arrive at the project equipped with the correct work wear and weatherproof clothing. This is particularly important for environmental/renovation and outdoor type projects.
- On Adult projects, volunteers must bring with them sufficient funds to cover some of their free time activities as well as their internal transportation costs. There may be a leisure budget on some adult projects.
- On Teen projects local transportation and free time activities are covered by the extra fee, although we still recommend

bringing funds to pay for personal expenses which can be used on leisure trips.

Working with Children or People with Special Needs

Under the terms of the Children's Act 2014 and in line with OFSTED guidelines on child protection, Coordinators and volunteers working with under 18-year-olds and adults at risk, must be checked to ensure that they have no criminal record involving abuse of children. All volunteers participating in a project working with children or people with special needs will be required to produce a Certificate of Good Conduct or International Criminal Record Check. This may also apply if the project is not working directly with children but is based at a children's centre. A copy of the certificate needs to be sent to the Concordia office, by email as soon as it is available to the volunteer. These certificates are generally obtainable from local police stations and in some cases the forms can be downloaded from the internet. The process usually takes 2-4 weeks, and a small charge may be incurred. Failure to provide this certificate may mean that you are unable to participate in the project.

Quality Charter

The health and wellbeing of volunteers is a commitment that Concordia takes very seriously, and Concordia works within the parameters of the Alliance Quality Charter. The full document can be found at: www.alliance-network.eu

Equal Opportunities

Concordia projects are open to people over the age of 18 and teenagers aged 16-17 of any gender, nationality, ethnicity, sexuality or religion. All applications are treated on an individual basis and in cases where volunteers have specific needs Concordia endeavours to find volunteering opportunities suited to their ability. In addition to this Concordia strives to ensure

that the volunteers on the project are part of a group that is as internationally diverse as possible and tries to avoid having too many volunteers from the same country on the same project.

Access 4 All

Concordia supports 'Access 4 All'. 'Access 4 All' applicants will be treated on an individual basis where their needs will be supported through Concordia. We will try and find a suitable project that can support the individual's needs ensuring they have a really enjoyable experience. If you would like to place an 'Access 4 All' applicant, please contact Concordia.

Confidentiality and Data Protection

In compliance with The Data Protection Act Concordia are committed complying with privacy and data protection laws and being transparent about what we are doing. Concordia will not pass on the details of any of the volunteers on our database to any persons other than the international partner organisation abroad or UK host organisation to which they are applyina. Email addresses may disseminated to other volunteers on the database as part of a contact group, previous consent given by the volunteer. If a volunteer does not want their contact details to be passed on to other volunteers, or to be contacted regarding further opportunities and activities with Concordia, they will have the opportunity to opt-out of this.

Complaints Procedure

Complaints with respect to administrative procedures by Concordia should be addressed to the International Volunteering Coordinator directly. If a volunteer has a problem/complaint during the project they are encouraged to inform the Project Coordinator or the project host as soon as possible. If they do not feel that they can take their complaint to the project host or

group Coordinator they should then contact the International Volunteering Coordinator. Volunteers are advised to make a complaint at the time of the problem and not wait until they leave the project. All volunteers are encouraged to provide full and honest feedback.

International Volunteers

Concordia works on a basis of reciprocal exchange with international partner organisations. All incoming volunteers on adult projects need to pay a fee of £50 (GBP). Volunteers can pay this by PayPal. The incoming fee is a small contribution to the administration and staffing costs of Concordia Volunteers. On occasions this fee may vary, if this is the case it will be stated very clearly in the project description.

Volunteers on Teenage projects will have to pay an extra fee that varies from project to project. For the exact amount please refer to the individual project descriptions. This fee is meant to cover all costs of food, accommodation, transport, leisure activities as well as administration and staffing costs of Concordia Volunteers.

UK based volunteers.

Volunteers who reside in the UK participating in UK based projects who apply direct to Concordia will be required to pay a registration fee of £250. Food and accommodation are provided free of charge. UK based volunteers interested in joining one of the projects listed in this programme should contact the office for details of availability and for an application form.

Group Coordinators

Group Coordinators are essential to the UK programme. We need to be able to host projects in the UK in order to send volunteers abroad and in order to host a UK project we need reliable hardworking coordinators to

oversee the smooth running of the project outside the work programme.

Group coordinators do not pay a registration fee and travel expenses within the UK are reimbursed following the project. Food and accommodation are provided free of charge.

Group coordinators should be aged 18+ and have experience of volunteering abroad or related volunteer experience. Volunteers from abroad wishing to coordinate in the UK must have experience of coordinating in their own country and be recommended by a partner organisation. Concordia runs a training event for coordinators in the spring each year. All new coordinators are trained by Concordia before they are placed on a project.

Group Coordinators - Work

The work varies according to the project, but the role of the Group Coordinator is largely Coordinators same. have responsibility to ensure that the volunteers get the best out of their time on the project. The host organisation will have organised a work schedule but outside of that it is the coordinators' job to ensure that the running of the project goes smoothly. Tasks include, arriving early to meet with the host and prepare for the volunteers' managing the food and social budget and organising shopping and cooking rotas, helping the group decide on places they would like to visit in their spare time and most importantly representing Concordia in a professional way.

Training

There is a fun and extensive training weekend in the spring hosted online for volunteers who are interested in being a Group Coordinator. This covers leadership skills, global learning activities, conflict

resolution in group dynamics and all areas of the role. Previous experience of volunteering abroad or group leading is needed. We can accept leaders from abroad by providing training via zoom for those that have experience, have been to the UK before and would like the challenge and the achievement of leading a project here.


Group Volunteering

Concordia have been sending groups of young people to volunteer projects abroad since 2009. With an increased demand from colleges and youth organisations, Concordia arranges bespoke group trips with our partners overseas. We prepare the groups thoroughly before their journey, and once abroad the groups are involved in community work, cultural workshops and exploring the local area. Groups are usually between 10 and 20 people aged from 14

upwards. Concordia can also host groups from our international partners looking for a unique experience in the UK.

We are part of a global community – we work with partners and people from all over the world. However, we always support local projects - whether they are just up the road from us or on the other side of the world.

We ensure that we only deliver ethical and impactful programmes that truly work for our programme participants. We campaign for change in the unethical practices that can exist in the sectors we work in. We collaborate on all our programmes – working with partners who can support us to deliver the best possible programmes we can. We value collaborative practices in our staff team – working together is always our preferred way of getting things done.



CERTIFICATE OF SPONSORSHIP AND VISA COSTS

If a VISA to enter the UK is needed, Concordia will provide a **sponsorship letter unless this is stated otherwise**, which will be used by the volunteer to apply for a CHARITY WORKERS VISA. **Volunteers need to pay £25 to Concordia** (on top of the £50 extrafee) to cover the cost of this letter and can make the payment via PayPal.

Volunteers who are entering from a country in the EU (Or otherwise stated) will **not require** a VISA if there volunteering project lasts less than 30 days. You are able to check this here: <u>Check UK Visa</u>

VISA FEE COSTS

Volunteering Projects and MTV projects 1-6 months

The volunteers are responsible to apply for their VISA to the UK. When a volunteer applies for the CHARITY WORKERS VISA, they need to pay a fee of £298 (GBP) to UKVI.

LTV Projects 6-12 months

For longer projects, if a volunteer stays up to 12 months in the UK, they need to pay an additional £1035 Health Surcharge to UKVI, on top of the £298 VISA fee. This extra cost is meant to cover any medical treatment needed in the UK during the project by the National Health Service (NHS).


As it could take several weeks to obtain the VISA, we recommend volunteers to apply as soon as possible. You can apply for a visa up to 3 months before the day you are due to start volunteering in the UK.

PROJECT: Camphill Tigh A'Chomainn are a small and vibrant Camphill Community started in 1987, with two homes situated in a large garden in Peterculter, a village on the outskirts of Aberdeen. In Tigh a'Chomainn we live together as a community supporting adults, some of whom have learning disabilities. Living together in an extended family environment provides the possibility for us all to develop new skills and opportunities. Whilst building these skills we aim to support one another practically and emotionally as needed. In Tigh a'Chomainn we recognise that we all have different strengths and so aim to support those strengths and foster an attitude of mutual respect for the contributions we can all make for one another. We help one another to feel supported in the decisions that we make for our futures and appreciate the self-esteem that we can gain from our successes. But if we happen to make some mistakes along the way we can do so knowing that we can learn from them and be helped to make the next step.

Tigh a'Chomainn is one of 10 Camphill Communities in Scotland. The host offers a unique setting in which you will learn skills which can transfer to a career in medicine, social work or care. Alternatively, if you want a placement which will give you very valuable hands-on experience in caring for adults with learning difficulties.

WORK:

The overall objective of the project is supporting and assisting adults with additional support needs, learning difficulties and mental health conditions in their day to day lives.

Volunteers will undertake ancillary and personal care tasks, light domestic duties and general support for individuals.

Camphill is a unique vocational experience as it is based on living and working with the residents. As part of this amazing long term volunteering experience there is an expectation that volunteers become part of the 'community' at Camphill TAC. Volunteers will also have the opportunity to participate in community and team meetings to share any ideas and develop skills.

All volunteers will be given 'holiday leave' for the duration of their stay and Camphill TAC. The placement is also a great experience if you are looking for something meaningful to do on a gap year or simply want to go a new adventure and change of environment. We don't look for any previous or specific experience, just a can-do attitude, genuine interest and a passion for helping people! Short-term co-

workers are an integral part of Tigh a'Chomainn Camphill, supporting our residents with the help of our senior care and support team.

TRAINING: Volunteers will receive a training induction upon arrival to the site and there will be consistent training throughout this year. Volunteers will be introduced to other staff and volunteers on site. Volunteers will be paired with a 'co-worker' for them to 'shadow' until you feel comfortable with the practices and procedures. Necessary additional training may be given to the volunteers throughout the year.

ACCOMODATION & FOOD: Volunteers will live on site or an accommodation a short walk away. Your type of accommodation will vary depending on space and availability. Volunteers may be given accommodation at a flat separate to the main property where you would have your own room. All rooms will come with bathroom, bed, storage for clothes and access to Wi-Fi. Volunteers will be provided with a lockable area/safe to store anything away.

Volunteers have access to a washing machine, tumble drier or can use the ones in the house at specified times.

Volunteers are provided with food and have use of a kitchen with all appliances available. 3 meals a day are provided by TAC for all volunteers.

Near to the accommodation there is a local medical centre, a gym, Cafes/bars/restaurants and an easily accessible bus link to Aberdeen City Centre.

POCKET MONEY & ALLOWANCES: Volunteers are provided with all meals, accommodation and laundry. Volunteers are provided with a £200 monthly subsistence allowance.

HOW TO APPLY:

- All applicants must send on application a completed <u>VEF and then will receive a Camphill application form</u> + <u>two professional references</u>.
- **Zoom Interviews:** will be arranged individually.
- After Zoom interview, if confirmed on the project, applicants should send a <u>certificate of good conduct</u> /police check from your home country and a <u>Medical Certificate</u>

ACCESSIBILITY: Volunteers need to have a reasonable level of physical fitness.

EXTRA FEE: £50 (GBP) - a small contribution to Concordia's administration fees.

UK VISA COSTS: All volunteers will need to apply for a **Temporary Work - Charity Worker**, please be aware that this has replaced the **Tier 5** (**T5**) Charity Worker **VISA**. The application fee for this VISA is £298 and you can stay for up to 12 months. PROJECT: Green & Away is a registered educational charity, who organise, build and run a unique, tented sustainable venue – a temporary outdoor eco-village, situated on the banks of the River Teme, in lush Countryside overlooked by the Malvern Hulls in the West of England.

Every summer since 1990, many volunteers from all different walks of life and all over the world have come

together to create a beautiful space for events, connection to the outdoors, community and learning – and we are very excited to welcome you!

WORK AND WHAT TO EXPECT: The host is looking for people who like working hard, having fun, and being part of a community to get involved. At Green & Away the host lives in a comfortable outdoor venue as a community of up to 30 volunteers working together to look after the temporary summer home, taking turns to cook meals, and keeping the site running alongside hosting events. The type of activities you will be involved in depends on which phase of Green and Away you join (there are three) and this may involve putting up large marquees, housekeeping of tents or catering large events (there will be more volunteering, these are just examples. This is an ongoing project with several starting dates. In your application, make sure to add which date you would like to start your 2 weeks project. You can apply for several 2-week periods in the same application

You will be supported and encouraged to be involved in whatever you feel most comfortable doing, and the host always supports and appreciates new ideas and feedback – Green & Away is a place to share and learn new skills. The host warmly welcomes and encourages individuals of all backgrounds, ethnicities, races, genders, abilities, ages, religions, and orientations to join the Green & Away project.

Setup Phase: Each year we build the venue from scratch. The tasks during setup are hard but very rewarding work as you will arrive at an empty field and have the satisfaction of watching and helping the tented village circle take form each day! Basic facilities such as kitchen, showers and toilets will be ready when you arrive.

Setup takes two weeks where we erect large tents such as the kitchen and bar marquee, set up and furnish the smaller accommodation tents for paying guests and put in place essential things like plumbing and electrics., and erect the cafe, sitting room yurt, and main marquee tent amongst others. Once the structures are built, they are furnished with seating, equipment, decorations and many flowers and bunting as a finishing touch.

Setup is a time of team spirit, learning diverse new skills from how the pulley system on a canvas marquee works, how to build a traditional yurt, how to do an alpine butterfly knot, install our infrastructure such as plumbing or solar powered electrics, and looking great in steel cap boots!

Events Phase: Throughout the season we welcome different groups for whom we provide the venue and support in the smooth running of their events. Tasks involve welcoming guests and helping them settle in, cooking meals and baking bread and cakes, washing up, running the bar and cafe, cleaning the showers and toilets, chopping wood, and preparing the site for the next group (washing bedding, making beds, looking after the site).

Each event is different, and no day is the same at Green & Away. By working together as a team, we make even the washing up of over 200 plates a fun task, and you will have the opportunity of trying out different jobs and taking on new responsibilities and challenges! Between events, tasks turn to tidying up and working on different improvement projects which can vary over the years.

Takedown Phase: At the end of the season the entire site is deconstructed and packed away for the winter. Like setup, this involves a lot of manual labour and hard work but is a time when the team really comes together as we work to leave the field as we found it at the beginning of the summer.

We make sure that all structures are cleaned, dried and packed away. You'll have the chance to see the behind the scenes of outdoor living and event infrastructure and take part in plenty of problem solving and logistics tasks. While the work can be quite physical, we find that because we are not hosting events anymore, we have more time for team activities such as fancy banquet dinners, dress-up parties or relaxing campfire evenings.

If it is something you want to have a go at, then takedown may be the phase for you! Please note that as we take structures down the facilities on the field will become more minimal (toilets and showers will be available till the end).

LOCATION: The site is based at New House Farm in the small village of Bransford. It is surrounded by stunning countryside, close to the Malvern Hills. Bransford is in the country of Worcestershire, in the west of England, approximately 35 miles/56 km from Birmingham.

ACCOMMODATION & FOOD: The host is an outdoor venue and campsite so all accommodation is tented – this is for all volunteers as well as guests will be in tents. Green & Away will provide you with a space in a tent with a camp bed, sleeping bag, pillow and blanket – IT IS STILL COLD AT NIGHT DURING UK SUMMERTIME, PLEASE ENSURE YOU BRING ENOUGH WARM CLOTHES.

All food is provided (3 meals a day, regular tea breaks, with cake!). Meals are vegetarian/vegan, organic, fresh and local when possible. IF you do have any specific dietary requirements, please let the host know in advance.

The site has an outdoor biomass-powered, wood cladded shower cubicles, composting toilets, drinking water taps, clothes washing facilities and a washing line. The host provides eco-friendly toiletries. All safety and volunteering equipment is provided by Green and Away.

LOCATION & LEISURE: The site is situated close to a small village which has some small activities going on, the site is roughly 5-6 miles from Worcester with a direct bus. Volunteers can travel quite freely to a big city. More immediately the site is located to a café with walking trails and a river for swimming bordering the site. The nearest hospital is 9 miles away. You will get 2 days off of volunteering, days off are not the same each week, but rest will be assured to all volunteers.

The work at Green & Away is what brings us together, but there is also plenty of time for evening activities, revelling in music and laughter in our bar, swimming, playing games and enjoying an evening round the campfire. There is also opportunity for day trips to visit the local area, cultural visits or special days out like canoeing on your days off.

You are also invited to engage with our Education Wednesdays, where we spend an afternoon together learning from one another in a variety of ways through talks, workshops and discussions. If you have a skill or knowledge on a topic you would like to share with the group let us know!

NEAREST AIRPORT: Birmingham International Airport. **Nearest train station:** Worcester There is a regular bus service from Worcester city centre to the village (4 miles/7 km).

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY The host may reach out to you to establish levels of English, you will receive an email if successful. A conversational level of B2 is necessary to understand safety instructions.

ACCESSIBILITY Volunteers need to have a good level of physical fitness and be confident walking on uneven ground outside.

EXTRAFEE £50 (GBP) - a small contribution to Concordia's administration fees.

ADDITIONAL REMARKS

For Green and Away it is really important the volunteer understands what we are about (environmental charity, not a music festival! etc.) and the circumstances of the facilities (outdoor showers, camping). PROJECT: Moulsecoomb Primary School teaches around 400 3-

11-year-olds and has a strong ethos of working in partnership with the local and wider community. The school believes that one of the best ways for children to learn is through practical activities and the school grounds are full of structures such as a willow dome, Mesolithic hut and an Iron Age round house.

The school works closely with The Moulsecoomb Forest Garden and Wildlife Project, which has a collection of allotments that have been converted into an environmental project for the benefit of the local community. The Forest Garden and Wildlife Project began in 1994 and is now a magical place hidden away behind the railway station.

WORK: International volunteers will be joining the family of the school and need to be flexible with the daily tasks. Three days a week you're likely to be helping out with the children in the classrooms in the afternoons, then in the morning be out in the school grounds working on tasks like painting, gardening and maintenance. Two days a week volunteers will visit the outdoor education gardens at Moulsecoomb Forest Garden Project and help with watering, planting, digging and learning about their work with the local community.

ACCOMMODATION & FOOD: The accommodation is basic but adequate; volunteers will sleep on the floor in the Gym room at the school where there are showers. There are cooking facilities in the school Community room. Please bring a sleeping bag and roll mat. The community room is used at 8am for breakfast club so volunteers must be prepared to tidy their things away in the morning and have breakfast with the children. It is really important that volunteers respect that they are in a school and act as role models for the children. Since it is always nice to try new and different dishes, volunteers are encouraged to bring along their favourite recipes from home!

LOCATION: Moulsecoomb is situated to the north of Brighton, a vibrant seaside town famous for its open mindedness and relaxed attitude. It is only 1 hour by train from London.

TERMINAL: Nearest Airport: Gatwick Airport Nearest Train Station: Brighton/local branch line – Moulsecoomb.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS AND HOW TO APPLY:

PROJECT: Wild Futures is a UK registered charity founded upon six decades of experience as a leader in the field of primate welfare and conservation, environmental education and sustainable practice. The host is committed to protecting primates and habitats worldwide, with the protection of non-human primates at the forefront of the charities work. The safe haven for monkeys rescued from situation of abused and neglect is The Monkey Sanctuary in Cornwall, which has an international reputation for its levels of care and innovative management techniques.

WORK: The host is looking for passionate, motivated and dedicated volunteers who have an interest in animal welfare and conservation. Work includes providing a high standard of care to monkey who have been rescued from the UK pet trade, allowing them to live in stable, enriching social groups.

Volunteers will spend the mornings helping clean the enclosures. In the afternoons, volunteers will be preparing monkey food bowls and learning to identify edible wild leaves to use to make enrichment items for the monkeys. Volunteers will be helping with daily tasks and general upkeeping, including cleaning, tidying, maintenance and gardening. When the site is open to the public, volunteers may help full time members of staff provide arts and crafts workshops to visiting children.

Volunteers will receive training on how to behave around monkeys, along with a general background regarding the UK Pet Trade and the impact of captivity on monkeys as well as training on how to prepare enclosures, food and enrichment for the monkeys – a truly once in a lifetime experience! It is important to not, volunteers will have no direct contact with the monkeys.

LOCATION: The volunteers are based a 45-minute walk from the picturesque seaside town of Looe. Volunteers will stay at the sanctuary in Murrayton House, a 19th Century Building, which has beautiful views of the rising and setting sun, and wildlife gardens to relax in and enjoy.

Looe is the picturesque fishing harbour situated in South East Cornwall, just a further 45 minutes from the big city of Plymouth. Looe is famous for fish and a sandy beach with lots of shops, hikes, food and fun to be had! Looe has a rich history such as the famous Looe Bridge that joins the East and West towns. There are many hidden treasures in including beautiful woodland and cobbled streets lined with independent shops and restaurants.

ACCOMMODATION & FOOD: Volunteers will stay in single sex dorms with up to four other people on the site. Volunteers will either stay in a single bed or bunk bed. Volunteers need to bring their own towels, toiletries and sleeping bag. Pillows, pillow cases, a sheet for the mattress and a blanket are provided.

There is a fully accessible kitchen and pantry which volunteers will be able to utilise for meal times, food supplies will be provided for volunteers to prepare their own three meals a day (or cook together as a group it is lovely to cook and eat together!) and there is additional access for volunteers to store **meat and fish free products.** Volunteers will have access to a living room with a TV, board games, DVDs and an area to relaced. Optional evening entertainments are listed on the chalkboard. Volunteers will have access to showers, hot water and a washing machine and detergent. There is a specific drying room to dry clothes.

Uniform is provided, when necessary, on volunteering jobs. Volunteers will clean enclosures in PPE (overalls, boots and gloves) which are provided. Volunteers need to bring their own supply of face masks – washable ones are fine, to wear when in the Monkey Territory.

NEAREST AIRPORT: There are two options for the incoming volunteers:

- 1. Volunteers fly into Bristol Airport. Volunteers will get the cross country to Bristol Temple Meads and then a train to Liskeard this will take roughly 2 hours 40 minutes and is a direct train. Once volunteers arrive in Liskeard, they will need to take a train to Looe which is roughly 30 minutes. A Taxi will then be needed to wild Futures which is less than ten minutes.
- 2. If volunteers cannot arrive in to Bristol Airport, then Heathrow is needed. However this is a longer journey, Volunteers will need to get the National Express Bus (Book In Advance) to Liskeard and a train to Looe which takes approximately 6 hours. A Taxi will then be needed to wild Futures which is less than ten minutes.

Travel Costs: Option One: £60 Option Two: £50 These costs are rough estimates.

Concordia will work with the host and pre organise taxis to cover one journey to the venue and one journey back to the station on the final day. If the volunteer fails to reach the meeting point on time, they will need to organise their own final transportation to the venue.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS & HOW TO APPLY: All Wild Futures need is enthusiasm, positivity and a person with a passion for animal welfare! PLEASE NOTE: **this is a vegetarian centre, no meat or fish product are to be eaten, cooked or stored on side.** Volunteers need to be fit and healthy to carry out the volunteering.

Volunteers to apply through PLATO and receive an application pack which needs to be returned ASAP, this will be sent on to the host for approval.

PROJECT: Rock Farm is a therapeutic growing project open to everyone, restoring both the landscape and people through an innovative market garden model. We grow fruit and vegetables using regenerative, permaculture, and no dig principles, with absolutely zero pesticides or herbicides. We are at the cutting edge of embedding productive crops in a forest garden ecosystem, which sinks large amount of carbon into the soil instead of emitting it and



provides the backbone of our sustainability and therapeutic curricula. Retreats, camping, workshops and horticulture courses are also available at Rock Farm, especially for marginalised people.

Rock Farm is part of One Church Brighton, an organisation with several social projects in and around the Brighton area. Rock Farm grows produce on six acres of community land in West Sussex, offering access to horticultural therapy and community gardening for a range of volunteers and vulnerable groups.

WORK: Volunteers will carry out environmental and sustainable conservation volunteering while learning hands on practice in carbon-negative food production and sustainability. Volunteers' day to day task would include a range of skill based learning activities: Planting trees, growing vegetables, tree work. Volunteers will also be harvesting fruits and vegetables which are needed for the market, alongside the potential of some construction work to further enhance the volunteer's skillset. Volunteers will be receiving an educational experience alongside the volunteering. Main volunteering tasks will include:

- Berry Picking
- Clay Restoration on a Pizza Oven
- Tending to the plants and other wildlife
- Digging new areas for new trees to be planted
- Education sessions with the host

Volunteers will have cultural visits and leisure activities will be organised together with the group. Activities will include:

LOCATION: Rock Farm is based near Steyning, about 20 miles from Brighton. Volunteers will have the chance to visit the local area and go for hikes in the countryside. Visits to close-by sites will ensure that the group get the whole feeling of the area and learn about living in the British culture.

There are two farm shops within short walking distance if volunteers want to get any food/snacks – with a further two villages within an hour's walk. The accommodation is on the South Downs walking trail, with many beautiful hikes available to the volunteers.

The Concordia Coordinator will help volunteers make plans for their free time – but volunteers will be expected to contribute ideas and suggestions for activities.

ACCOMMODATION & FOOD: Volunteers will stay in large style canvas tents throughout the project, this is a sustainable style living and project so do pre plan and bring warm clothes and items to sleep to in – I must emphasise that even in the British Summertime it will be VERY COLD AT NIGHT – please ensure you bring enough warm clothes, sleeping bags and warm clothes to sleep in. Volunteers will have access to two hot outdoor showers – these are outdoor showers, so you will need to bring flip-flops/sliders and a swimming costume – as these are carbon negative showers there will only be a certain amount of hot water per day – one of the tasks for the volunteers is to create the hot water system!. Rock farm will provide a small furnished cabin in the camping area for use as a meeting and relaxing area. There are a four further buildings/cover for eating and cooking – including a pizza oven!

Rock farm will provide dry goods and fresh produce for two meals per day, plus one hot meal cooked together with the rock farm staff. All Volunteers are expected to get involved in the cooking process and washing up.

PROJECT: Concordia is excited to continue our flagship international volunteering programme, the fifth iteration of Brighton Rocks: Brighton Rocks V. Concordia will host a group of 14 international volunteers in Brighton to work with a local host carrying out a blend of environmental and manual volunteering. Alongside this volunteers will have the opportunity to carry out some culturally enriching activities alongside leisure visits to a nearby town and the very popular city of Brighton.

WORK: As mentioned, volunteers will be carrying out environmental sustainability and manual volunteering, volunteering with a local partner, The Brighton Permaculture Trust (BPT). A long-term sustainable partner of Concordia. Volunteers will carry out work on a beautiful community orchard and a race hill community orchard. Working alongside other local volunteers for two days, with the third day being dedicated to The Brighton Permaculture Trust creating opportunities to help act towards the sustainability of the trust. Tasks volunteers may complete during the three days will include the following:

- Forest Gardening
- Water Harvesting
- Composting
- Seed Saving
- Educational uses and benefits of weeding
- General maintenance

Surrounding Brighton is the South Downs, a national park providing great hiking opportunities to reach great views of the county. The Concordia Coordinator will help volunteers make plans for their free time – but volunteers will be expected to contribute ideas and suggestions for activities.

ACCOMMODATION:

Volunteers will be accommodated at Varley Park at the University of Brighton, in a small suburb North East of the main city. Each volunteer will have their own bedroom with a bed, sink, storage. There is shared bathroom and shower facilities. Volunteers will have communal kitchens in which a fridge, freezer and ovens are provided. Volunteers will have access to Wi-Fi. Please be aware that the plugs will be **British three-pin standard.**

Concordia will provide volunteers with ingredients to make meals along with drinks and snacks. Food will be cooked and prepared by the volunteers. The Concordia Coordinator will ensure a 'rota' is created with one team cooking and one team cleaning each meal time. Food preparation and consumption will take place in one of the flats and not both. It is important that all volunteers take part in the cooking as it will make it a much more enjoyable activity!
