Interviews: Jutta Sohlman

For 50 years, the Finnish Chihuahua Club has offered breed enthusiasts a community where love for Chihuahuas and working together have been the focus. The contribution of the club's long-term active members has formed a good foundation for the current activities and its development in the future.

We want to respect this history and also shed some light on it with curiosity for all of us who haven't been involved with the breed and the club for that long. There's a lot to learn from experienced

enthusiasts, which is worth appreciating and highlighting.

For this publication, we were able to interview a few people who've been involved with the breed for a long time, and we now get a glimpse of their experiences and memories. Due to the lack of space, the number of interviewees had to be kept small, so unfortunately the voices of many important active members of our club will still have to wait for their turn.

How do you see the Chihuahua Club's activities changing during the time you have been involved?

In the short time I have been involved, the biggest changes are probably the spread of the board throughout Finland. The meetings take place online, so the location of the participants isn't important. I think this is a good thing for the members.

For example, what is a good change, and what was better before?

I see the inclusion of many young/new breeders in our breed as a good change. I also think the work that is being done for our breed in health matters is a good change. Before, I think it was better to listen to the "old breeders" and respect their experiences.

If you could bring something from the past into the present, what would it be? What do you think should stay in the past?

The activity of the members in assisting the board/committees with volunteer work. Here we've made mistakes in thanking the members. In showing appreciation for the importance of the work they do for the activities of the club. I don't miss the "cliques" that used to exist, for example, on the show ring periphery.



What kind of highlights, oddities, or funny problems come to mind from the club's journey when you think about it?

As highlights, I remember very well the events of the club's 40th anniversary for the first time, and the arrangements/planning that came with them. We had a great group of people working tirelessly for years. These angels are still people I hold in high regard.

I've many funny memories of the board meetings that were held "at the same table." Sometimes these meetings also included humor in addition to taking care of important association matters.

What keeps you involved in this breed and as a member of this club?

Wife;) Also the work I have done for the club over the years.

What kind of future hopes, expectations or greetings do you have for the Chihuahua club?

Try to remember the club's history and the events/ meetings/customs that you found useful. It isn't worth trying to reinvent everything, but it's worth respecting traditions at least to some extent.

What else do you want to say or highlight?

I'd like to return to one of my previous answers regarding volunteer work. I hope the members become more active in this matter and participate regardless of experience. Everyone can do something and every pair of hands at events is a welcome reinforcement. If even such a dumb person as me has been involved in the events, then surely every member can do the job better.;)

Another thing I'd like to point out is the unpleasant way the members treat/criticize the work of the board or committees. Remember that these jobs are done on a voluntary basis and the workload is often quite large due to the small group of contributors. There are many different ways to express things and often positive/guidance-giving feedback is more valuable to the recipient than scolding/maligning messages. We can easily kill the enthusiasm of new contributors with negative feedback instead of positive. Think about what kind of feedback you'd like to receive on things yourself and use that as a guide.

Despite everything, let's respect each other and help each other when help is requested or needed. <3





How do you see the Chihuahua Club's activities changing during the time you have been involved? For example, what is a good change, and what was better before?

I don't really have very clear memories from the club in the 1980s and 1990s. I remember that the activities were very Helsinki and Southern Finland-centric at the time. However, I participated with my parents in some of the events organized by the club, even though the events were far away. Today, regional activities are a really great part of the club's development.

The number of members of the club was relatively small in the early days, most people knew most of the members. Today, the association has grown a lot in terms of membership and unfortunately it's impossible to know more than a small part of the group.

It used to be easier to get people involved in volunteer work. Nowadays, in this hectic online era, people are less and less enthusiastic about volunteering, which in turn reduces the number of active people and piles too much work on them, which can, at worst, lead to them becoming overwhelmed by the workload and dropping out of everything altogether. I think the club's communications have progressed over the years, and that's a very good and important thing. It's worth investing in in the future as well.

If you could bring something from the past into the present, what would it be? What do you think should stay in the past?

There used to be more events and functions where people were present, and nowadays there are fewer of these face-to-face things, because many things happen online in Teams, etc. Personally, I prefer events where people actually meet each other, and not just online. Less online world – more real life!

What kind of highlights, oddities, or funny problems come to mind from the club's journey when you think about it?

The club's 20th anniversary exhibition, which was held on October 1, 1994 in the winter garden of Restaurant Sipuli at the foot of the Uspenski Cathedral in Helsinki. This event has remained in my memory as a particularly fine festive occasion.

Many of my memories are related to the nice people I met while working with the breed, and I have made lifelong friends from a few of them. There



were opinionated, strong women involved in the club's activities. They were always ready to help and brought their vast experience to the club with them. The long, fruitful discussions with them were a great asset to my own breeding work.

What keeps you involved in this breed and as a member of this club?

Well, the breed itself of course! What could be more wonderful than a Chihuahua! I'm a Chihuahua in spirit and blood, I've definitely been a Chihuahua in my past life. My dream would be to someday have such an incredibly beautiful Chihuahua for myself, which I could just look at with a smile and admiration and be grateful for this wonderful breed.

It's natural for me to be a member of this club. I've practically grown up with the Chihuahua breed, as the first Chihuahua came to our family in 1978, 46 years ago.

What kind of future hopes, expectations or greetings do you have for the Chihuahua club?

I wish the club active years now and in the future and enthusiastic people to take the club forward. Cooperation is also needed in the club activities – without it, it's quite impossible to develop the activities further.

What else do you want to say or highlight?

I've already started to slow down a bit, as this year marks my 39th year of breeding and my 46th year with the breed. Be kind to each other and remember to respect each other. There's strength in cooperation, few can do it alone. Fair competition in and out of the ring. And most importantly, remember to love your dogs! Every little dear friend is the most important for to us. <3

How do you see the Chihuahua Club's activities changing during the time you have been involved? For example, what is a good change, and what was better before?

I've been a member of the current Finnish Chihuahua Club since the time when the club was still a sub-division of the Finnish Companion and Toy Dog Club. I joined the club in 1984 after acquiring my first Chihuahua. The activities have grown simply because the status of a breed organization brings not only rights but also responsibilities that the club must take care of. The number of members and the number of registrations of our breed have also increased, so I feel that the work done in the breed club is very important for both breeding matters and the average dog owner. The sub-division once published two newsletters a year, now informing has taken on a much more important role, and the members expect it to be very active. There was no specialty show of its own, but our breed was included in the SSKY special show. Organizing our own specialty show became relevant when the club gained the status of a breed organization. When the club became a breed organization, we also became responsible for training show judges ourselves. The breed organization has its

own representative on the council of the Finnish Kennel Club and we're also asked for opinions related to the breeding of our breed, so we get our voice heard better than if we're part of another breed organization.

If you could bring something from the past into the present, what would it be? What do you think should stay in the past?

When I first started dog breeding, I learnt a lot by listening and talking to experienced breeders. This way of sharing information has almost disappeared today, and has been replaced by the wonderful world of the internet, where it seems like you can find experts in every field. Many people who have just started the hobby seem to know things much better than anyone else. Sometimes it might be necessary to stop and consider the authenticity of information before resharing some online posts. A certain slowness, when all information was circulated via mail or by talking on the phone, could have been beneficial, although of course people used to gossip and spread incorrect information back then as well.



What kind of highlights, oddities, or funny problems come to mind from the club's journey when you think about it?

There have been many great moments in the club's activities. One of the most memorable was probably the club's 20th anniversary show held in Katajanokka, and many other specialty shows have been great events. I also remember the summer days held in different places. We've been to the yard of the Valkeala printing house, for example, where an unofficial temperament test was also held. Summer camps have also been organized in the Varkaus region. At one of these events, I participated in a tail-wagging competition with my own dog, where it was found that for some reason short coated dogs wag their tails much faster than long coated dogs. Should we do some research on this?:)

What keeps you involved in this breed and as a member of this club?

I've always been a club person. I started my dog hobby by joining the Finnish Kennel Club. It wasn't until a couple of years later that I bought my first dog and it was only natural that I joined the breed club and our then breed organization, SSKY, at the same time. Through the membership, I've been able to participate in many different activities and have also gained friendships that I wouldn't have found without this hobby and club activities. I've only ever had Chihuahuas at home, and I can't imagine life without them.

What kind of future hopes, expectations or greetings do you have for the Chihuahua club? What else do you want to say or highlight?

I hope the club continues to do quality work for the breed. Sometimes unpleasant things happen in the club world, but we can overcome them, and cooperation is the model we must continue in order for our fine breed to be preserved for future generations.

How do you see the Chihuahua Club's activities changing during the time you have been involved? For example, what is a good change, and what was better before?

During the time I've been involved in the club, everything has become bigger, meaning there have been many more Chihuahua enthusiasts. When I started, young people were a rarity among breed enthusiasts. The breed was probably chosen by older people because of its size back then. Today, it's the other way around. However, the Chihuahua is an active dog that is suitable for many hobbies, so it's good to have young enthusiasts involved.

If you could bring something from the past into the present, what would it be? What do you think should stay in the past?

If I could turn back the time, I'd like to see all the gatherings with Chihuahua enthusiasts, for example, breeder days (was the original name, now it's probably enthusiast days), where there were lectures on various topics and free socializing, and had time to chat with other breeders/enthusiasts, which is something you don't have time to do at shows where you meet.

What kind of highlights, oddities, or funny problems come to mind from the club's journey when you think about it?

Funny oddities - I don't know if these are funny or even oddities, but these are the first things that came to mind when asked about oddities. The judge of the specialty show in two different years died shortly after he returned home from our show. Not on the way home, but shortly after. One judge was absolutely furious that we didn't have white fences around the show rings. One judge didn't approve of the accommodations we'd booked for him.

One of the high points was when the club became a breed organization.

What keeps you involved in this breed and as a member of this club?

I'm crazy about this breed and I don't think I'll ever be without a Chihuahua. In the club, we're all promoting the same breed and work for the breed. We all work for a healthy Chihuahua, even though it is not always easy.

What kind of future hopes, expectations or greetings do you have for the Chihuahua club? What else do you want to say or highlight?

"A poke in the eye for the one, who dwells on the past", but I hope that there'll be no more cliques that compete with each other, but that we can all be on good terms about our breed.



As you can see from the list, we've tried to organize events all over Finland, although they're often organized in regions where there are more members and organizers in close proximity. The club and the breed have seen a lot of changes over the decades, but what does it look like in numbers? A brief overview of our development.

It will not come as a surprise to anyone that the Chihuahua Club's membership is also more represented in large cities and Southern Finland. The map illustrates well where the largest concentrations are. However, representation is the strongest outside of the South. Outside of Uusimaa, the most active areas for the club are the Turku region and Pirkanmaa, as well as the Oulu region.


The fluctuation in the number of members has remained moderate and its development correlates with the development of registration numbers. The majority of the members are women, but men are also visible in the club's activities, although their number is significantly smaller.

Registrations reached their peak about 10 years ago, after which they have decreased slightly. About 10 years ago, Chihuahuas were seen in the mainstream media, which increased demand for the breed – however, it's for better that Chihuahuas are not in fashion, but that those considering the breed get a Chihuahua for the right reasons. During the pandemic, the breed's popularity rose again, as did the demand for other pets during that time.

Both the breed and the club are vibrant in numbers, which is good moving forward. The development would seem stable in light of the statistics. The club


and the breeders invest in the health and well-being of Chihuahuas every year, so that we can continue to have these beloved dogs in the future.


